DeSantis rallies support for gubernatorial bid in Ponte Vedra Beach

Congressman Ron DeSantis (R-FL) took some time away from "the swamp" Saturday, June 23 to garner support at home for his gubernatorial campaign. With multiple meet-and-greet events scheduled throughout the day, the Palm Coast resident chose to make his first stop in Ponte Vedra Beach at the Sawgrass Marriott Golf Resort & Spa.

Joining DeSantis on the campaign trail Saturday was Rep. Matt Gaetz (R-FL), a congressional freshman who helped to fire up the crowd, stating, "We've got enough folks in Congress and enough folks in politics who sit on the sidelines, who sit on the back row. ... Ron DeSantis is the type of man who leads from the front, and that is exactly the type of governor we need in the great state of Florida."

Contrasting DeSantis against his Republican primary opponent, Adam Putnam, Gaetz added, "I've seen more leadership from Ron DeSantis in 17 months than I ever saw from Adam Putnam in six whole years."

Putnam, who is currently Florida's Commissioner of Agriculture, previously represented Florida's 12th District in Congress and earlier served as a member of the Florida House of Representatives.

DeSantis, however, characterized Putnam as an "establishment" candidate, whom he contended could not be the leader that Florida needs.

"Whoever wins will get the title 'governor,' there's no doubt about that," DeSantis said. "But, we need someone who, yes, will have the title of governor, but will be a leader as governor. And I'll be that guy."

Praising current Gov. Rick Scott for his leadership during his two terms, DeSantis said that, if elected, he intended to continue Scott's conservative agenda by keeping taxes low, nominating conservative constitutionalists to Florida's Supreme Court and supporting the president's immigration policies.

Also highlighting education as a major issue, DeSantis denounced the institution of Common Core in Florida's school system and expressed his support for prioritizing vocational training. Additionally, he stressed the importance of teaching students the core values America was founded upon.

"Ronald Reagan pointed out (that) freedom is only one generation away from extinction — it's not passed along in the bloodstream," he said. "We, as adults and as voters and as Republicans, we have an obligation to make sure that the

next generation understands those values and is going to be willing to defend those values, as well."

Desantis' visit to Ponte Vedra Beach came a day after he received a glowing endorsement from President Donald Trump via Twitter.

"Congressman Ron DeSantis, a top student at Yale and Harvard Law School, is running for governor of the great state of Florida," Trump tweeted on June 22. "Ron is strong on borders, tough on crime and big on cutting taxes — loves our military and our vets. He will be a great governor and has my full endorsement!"

Not the first time Trump has publicly supported DeSantis, the president previ-

ously tweeted on Dec. 22 that the congressman was a "brilliant young leader," and that he would "make a great governor of Florida"

In addition to DeSantis, Putnam and other Republican challengers, there are several Democrats vying to be Florida's next governor, including Tallahassee Mayor Andrew Gillum, former Congresswoman Gwen Graham, businessman Chris King and former Miami Beach Mayor Philip Levine.

FOX News will host a televised gubernatorial primary debate for the Republican candidates at 6:30 p.m. on Thursday, June 28 in Orlando.

The primary election is set for Aug. 28.

LETTER TO THE EDITOR

As your school board representative, the last four years have seen a lot of change and growth in our very dynamic county. In that time, school safety and security have always been a top priority. I have participated in several key safety and wellness initiatives including securing traffic light and intersection improvements on U.S. 1 and Ray Road for the Nease High School community; creation of a school safety zone for Valley Ridge Academy; and the inaugural Health, Safety and Wellness Fair at Ponte Vedra High School, as well as additional improvements at other schools.

In St Johns County, we are ahead of the curve on many security and mental health improvements.

Over the last two years, we have:

- Outfitted all schools and buses with 800mhz radios, which allows for instant communication with law enforcement and emergency responders.
- Spent over \$1.3 million on fencing, cameras and additional security improvements.
- Trained all principals and assistant principals on Active Shooter Training this past February.

- Outfitted buses with GPS so that they can be tracked and monitored.
- Conducted several school and district active shooter drills with the St. Johns County Sheriff's Office (SJSO).
- Expanded our partnership with Children's Home Society for Communities in Schools.
- Increased focus on social and emotional learning through professional development for teachers and administrators.
- Strengthened partnerships with the 10 mental health agencies providing support to students districtwide.

After the tragedy at Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School, the following actions have taken place at the school district:

- Superintendent Forson served on the governor's Safety and Security Roundtable and held his own student focus group to address safety and security.
- We collected security input at School Advisory Council meetings across the district
- Teachers, principals, district leadership and community and school stakeholders participated in facilitated discussions on safety and security.
- We collected feedback from parents and community members.

- We held town hall roundtable discussions at Nease High School and Gamble Rogers Middle School.
- We participated in ongoing Joint School Safety Workgroups with SJSO encompassing policy and procedure/drills, school safety and security, training, communications and legislative actions.

We have been proactive, responsible and deliberate to ensure an increase in our safety and security procedures and prevention protocols to provide the best, most efficient and effective plan going forward.

Over the last several months, we have moved toward a plan that my fellow school board members and I have been able to reach consensus on.

Prevention is a key component to keeping our schools safe. We are adding six additional mental health counselors, two school psychologists and three social workers to expand the staff we currently have in place who provide mental health support. This will not only allow us to work with students within the school environment, but also better connect them to resources throughout the community.

The Florida Legislature has allocated \$1.4 million for law enforcement personnel at our schools. With this funding, we intend to provide for the salary and

benefits of an additional 16 SJSO school resource officers. We have requested that our County Commission provide one-time funding for capital equipment for these additional 16 officers.

With limited ability to provide school resource officers from SJSO, we have developed a hybrid solution for armed security personnel in our schools. We will dedicate the additional funding needed to procure outside security firms to supplement our need for armed security during the school day.

These accomplishments are a reflection of the great work of our students, teachers, parents, principals, district administration and community leaders; all have come together to work for the best interest of our children, highlighting one of the major strengths of our community to keep our children safe.

Rest assured that our school board and district leaders are dedicated to implementing safety and security measures that are in the best interest of our students, teachers and schools. We continue the ongoing process to assess every aspect of the organization and make it the very best possible.

Report says local property values may be threatened by flooding

As Ponte Vedra Beach continues to recover from the erosive impacts of recent hurricanes, a new report released June 18 is projecting even more tough times ahead for coastal property owners due to chronic

Released by the Union of Concerned Scientists (UCS), the report combined property data from real estate company Zillow with the findings of a peer-reviewed study that was published in 2017 in Elementa: Science of the Anthropocene. Attributing the chronic flooding (occurring about twice a month) to an anticipated rise in sea levels, the report details the impacts coastal states may experience by the years 2045 and 2100, excluding potential impacts from major

Singling out Florida as the most atrisk coastal state in the contiguous U.S., researchers anticipate an average of about 1.8 feet of sea level rise for Florida by 2045 and 6.4 feet by 2100. According to the report, about \$26 billion-worth of the state's residential properties are currently at-risk to experience chronic flooding by 2045, and \$351 billion-worth are projected to be impacted by the end of the century. In total, about 1 million Florida homes are expected to be impacted.

Locally, homes in Ponte Vedra Beach were found to be the most in danger of chronic flooding. An interactive map available on the UCS website shows that by 2045, a total of 991 homes in the area (32082) could be at-risk, with a collective worth of \$514,947,817 and contributing \$6,333,813 to the local property tax base. Compared to neighboring Jacksonville Beach, in which only 471 homes valued at \$104,655,704 may be at-risk, the numbers are staggering.

"Not all affected communities will

share the same experience," said Erika Spanger-Siegfried, senior analyst in the Climate and Energy Program at UCS and report co-author. "Some may see sharp adjustments to their housing market in the not-too-distant future; some could see a slow, steady decline in home values; and others could potentially invest in protective measures to keep impacts at bay for a few more decades. In any case, by knowing how much time they have before a significant number of properties will be regularly flooded, communities can start planning and implementing responses now, while they still have a range of options from which to choose."

When it comes to those responses, however, the report goes so far as to describe exactly what UCS believes they should entail, in what would seem to be an effort to influence public policy. For instance, asserting that the federal government "must play a lead role in communicating risks to the public and incorporating those risks into its own policies and actions," the report goes on to list several state and federal policies that the organization believes should be "improved."

Further, with a stated mission to "initiate a critical and continuing examination of governmental policy" regarding science and technology, this most recent report is not the first time UCS has veered toward the political. On its website, www. ucsusa.org, the organization does not shy away from voicing its positions on various political issues - not all of which are grounded in science - and states that science is "under attack from the Trump administration and Congress."

Politics aside, however, with the already known issue of beach erosion and now this new report of potential chronic flooding, St. Johns County may not need to worry about its population growth much longer.

With a little extra effort, however, pets can be spared the trauma they sometimes experience from fireworks by considering the following:

- Keep pets indoors during fireworks displays.
 - Turn on the TV or radio and air

conditioning to help mask the noise of the fireworks. Keep pets in a soothing, dark room with light jazz or classical music playing. The idea is to muffle the fireworks noise with something soothing. Close draperies to help soundproof the

- Walk or exercise the pet prior to the fireworks, so he/she may sleep through the fireworks.
- Be home or have someone at home indoors with the pet to offer encouragement and support.
- Close all windows and doors and block pet doors to prevent escape.
- Try distracting the pet as soon as the fireworks begin by involving the pet in something enjoyable like "fetch."
- Prepare a safe area where the pet can "burrow in" to feel safe. Play a radio near that area and feed the pet there to help him/her associate the area with other






