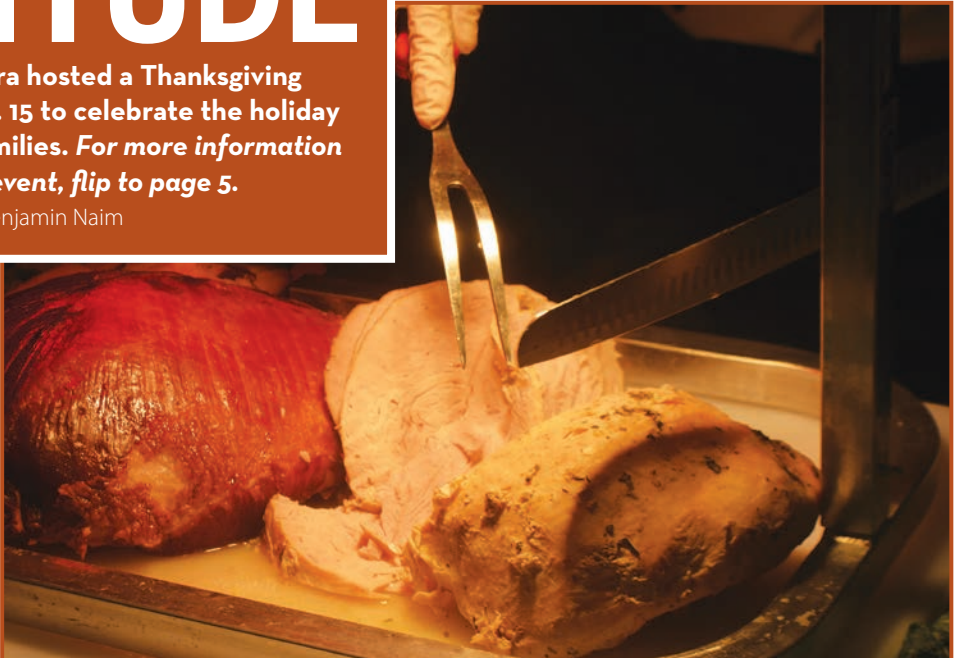

Raye A. Brutnell, the director of finance for the St. Johns County Sheriff's Office since 2013, was arrested Tuesday morning on multiple charges involving grand theft and fraud.

SJSO finance director arrested on charges of grand theft, fraud

The director of finance for the St. Johns County Sheriff's Office (SJSO) was arrested Tuesday morning on multiple charges involving grand theft and fraud.

According to a SJSO press release, Raye A. Brutnell, 47, was arrested on a warrant signed by Judge Howard Maltz. She turned herself in with her attorney, Hank Coxe, on Tuesday morning at the Flagler County Sheriff's Office Jail. SJSO terminated her employment after her arrest. Brutnell has been the director of finance since January 2013 and employed

with SJSO since 1991.

SJSO said the agency was made aware of potential concerns regarding Brutnell last Wednesday, Nov. 14, and the former finance director was immediately placed on leave. In addition, SJSO said an immediate Mutual Aid request was made through Sheriff David Shoar to have financial crimes investigators from the Polk County Sheriff's Office respond and conduct an independent criminal investigation. According to the agency, this case will be active for some time. The

case has been assigned by the governor to Brian Haas, the elected State Attorney for the 10th Judicial Circuit for purposes of prosecution.

Shoar said in a statement he is extremely grateful that two members of the agency had the moral courage to report their concerns.

"We were able to take immediate and corrective action," Shoar said. "We feel confident that at the conclusion of this case any monies taken inappropriately will be recovered."

Ponte Vedra Zoning and Adjustment Board recommends approval of Our Lady Star of the Sea Church renovations

Plans set to go before County Commission on Dec. 18

The Ponte Vedra Zoning and Adjustment Board (PVZAB) voted unanimously on Nov. 5 to recommend approval of a proposed request to renovate Our Lady Star of the Sea Church in Ponte Vedra Beach.

The proposal, a major modification to the church's planned unit development, will allow for an increased development area to accommodate expansion of the church sanctuary, a modified architectural design and various other renovations. PVZAB members Robert Becker, Harry Graham, Al Hollon, Megan McKinley, John Patton, Timothy Powell and Brad Scott each voted to approve the proposal. The church's proposed plans will go before the County Commission for a final vote on Dec. 18.

According to Casey Keough of St. Johns County's Growth Management department, the construction/renovation of the church is not intended to increase

its congregational size. In fact, the number of seats in the sanctuary will be slightly reduced by 15. Keough said the renovation will provide for a more traditional church architectural design, a choir area, a porte-cochere, two receiving rooms, a Spanish-style roof, hardwood doors accented by stained glass windows and other adjustments. Developers also plan on renovating the fountain with a material palette of veneer, granite and pearl.

Furthermore, the Our Lady Star of the Sea applicant requested to deviate from a Ponte Vedra overlay district requirement that limits the maximum length of a building parallel — or within 45 degrees parallel — to an overlay district-delineated roadway to 120 feet. The applicant asked for a maximum building length of 186 feet instead. The church's proposed architectural enhancement will widen the length of the building to 151 feet, plus another 45 feet for the porte-cochere.

Can you please tell us about your background?

I grew up in Augusta, Georgia, so it's probably fitting that I ended up in Ponte Vedra, the Mecca of professional golf! I graduated from Augusta College (now Augusta University) with a bachelor's degree in marketing and spent five years there as sports information director (SID). I left to attend graduate school at Georgia Southern, and after getting my master's in sport management, I stayed on as assistant SID through two I-AA national football championships (under the great Erk Russell) and a pair of postseason basketball appearances. I came to Ponte Vedra in 1988 to work at the PGA Tour, initially as media director for the Senior Tour — a dream job for me because I worked with the legends that I grew up watching at the Masters — and then in a variety of tournament-related roles on both the Senior Tour and PGA Tour. I left after 23 years and stayed in the sports industry for two years as associate commissioner at the Atlantic Sun Conference, the league that includes JU and UNF as members.

During my tenure at the ASUN, I got to know the folks at Wounded Warrior Project and saw the great work they were doing for our veterans and their families, so I jumped at the opportunity to join the WWP team, and get involved with veterans services. While there, I had the good fortune to connect with K9s for Warriors, where I have been for two and a half years. Thanks to the incredible support of my wife, Tess, I have been able to enjoy a wonderful professional career doing the things I love most: sports and giving back. Our two children were both athletes in St. Johns County high schools, and both still live in Northeast Florida. Our daughter, Taylor, works for a Ponte Vedra-based media and marketing services agency and manages social media for ESPN tennis at Grand Slam events, and our son, Keenan, works in the financial services industry.

What are your roles and responsibilities at K9s For Warriors?

My primary responsibilities at K9s For Warriors include researching, developing, cultivating and maintaining relationships and sponsorships with corporate partners, small business supporters, major donors, community groups and other veterans service organizations. One of the beauties of being part of the K9s team is the amazing collaboration that gives me the opportunity to work with teammates in every aspect of our operation.

What do you enjoy most about working at K9s?

I always tell people that as much as I enjoyed my career in the sports business, as you get older, it becomes increasingly important to do something that makes a difference. What we are doing at K9s For Warriors really matters, and I have never been involved in anything as fulfilling as what we do. To see firsthand the change in a veteran with the invisible wounds of war from the time he or she is paired with a service dog to graduation three weeks later is indescribable. What I am doing is as much for me as it is for the dogs we rescue and the warriors who are given a chance to live a normal life. I like to say that it feeds my soul.

When you reflect back on your time with K9s, do you have a favorite experience or story you can tell us about?

We have more than doubled the number of warrior-dog team graduates since I have been with K9s For Warriors, and every one of them is unique and gratifying. But I will always remember my first K9s graduation ceremony. It was my first week on the job and frankly, I really didn't really know what I was supposed to do or where to station myself as the warrior-dog teams came up one-by-one to be honored and to receive their credentials. I ended up standing at the back of the courtyard where the ceremony was taking place, and there was a young woman with two boys standing in front of me. I'd guess that the boys were about 8 or 10 years old. As one of the warriors walked up to receive his graduation certificate, one of the boys tugged on the woman's sweater and said, "Look Mom, Dad is smiling. I haven't seen him smile in a long time." I knew then I was in the right place. It was unforgettable, and I still get a tear in my eye thinking about it.

What do you enjoy most about living in Ponte Vedra?

Ponte Vedra is the ideal place to raise a family. It was still kind of a secret when we moved here, and though it has grown exponentially, it still has much of the small-town charm it did when we first visited. My kids had so many friends that were a quick walk or bike ride away, and they got a first-rate education that prepared them for college and beyond. There are so many things to do: the beach, golf courses, restaurants. Plus, we get a little change of season that I always enjoy.

What do you like to do in your free time?

It's funny: When our kids were growing up, it seemed like every weekend Tess and I were taking them to tennis tournaments or lacrosse games, and usually in opposite directions and often overnight. Now that Tess and I are empty nesters, I just enjoy spending a little more quality time with her. It also is great to have the kids nearby for a little family time. I still follow my Georgia Bulldogs closely, and I am excited that the college basketball season has started. If we ever slow down, I am hoping to spend a bit more time on the golf course and at the beach.

Ponte Vedra scouts spend night aboard historic USS Yorktown

Cub Scouts Pack 277 of Ponte Vedra spent Veterans Day weekend aboard the historic World War II aircraft carrier USS Yorktown in Charleston Harbor, as well as other warships, as participants of the Patriots Point Naval & Maritime Museum's camping program.

Eighty-five scouts and their families traveled to Mount Pleasant, South Carolina for the experience. During the trip, the scouts and their families became "shipmates" while touring the museum's three 70-year-old warships: the USS Yorktown, the World War II destroyer USS Laffey and Cold War submarine USS Clamagore. The group slept on the USS Yorktown in the same bunks as the sailors did decade ago. Morning and evening meals were served in the crew mess hall.

Pack 277 also participated in a flight program in which the scouts learned about aviation history and the various types of aircraft. In addition, they flew a simulated F-35B and landed it onto an aircraft carrier.

Dr. Camarda's Weekly Wealth Nugget **WHERE IS THE MARKET HEADED FROM HERE?**

It is oft said that October is one of the scariest months for stocks, and this one certainly scared the bejesus out of investors the world around. As mentioned before, we attribute the October Plunge to three primary factors, in decreasing order of importance:

1. Trade jitters morphing into outright fright. While the Trump administration seems generally on track in resetting the world trade order, China has proven intractable. This is the big cloud over the market, and when it clears – as Camarda expects it to eventually do – the market should respond with a very nice spurt.
2. Valuations of US stocks have been frothy for a long time now, and we have been overdue for some air letting out of the bubble. Trade jitters – more than interest rate hikes – supplied the trigger for what we believe is a healthy correction in a still healthy bull market.
3. The inevitability of interest rate increases has finally become apparent to the greater investing community. This is somewhat perplexing, since the need to normalize rates has been obvious to many of us for many years, but in any case higher future borrowing costs are only now being baked into stock pricing.

While we remain concerned about these three factors, we take seasonal cheer from the fact that we have entered the most historically profitable time of year for stock investors, who have generally done well from November to April much of the time. After the drubbing markets have suffered since the September highs, there is every reason to expect a typical Santa Clause rally, and Camarda expects a fairly robust pop and nice numbers. Longer term, we are optimistic about the outlook for non-US stocks, as well as carefully selected and shopped (as in shopped hard and bought on sale) US stocks.

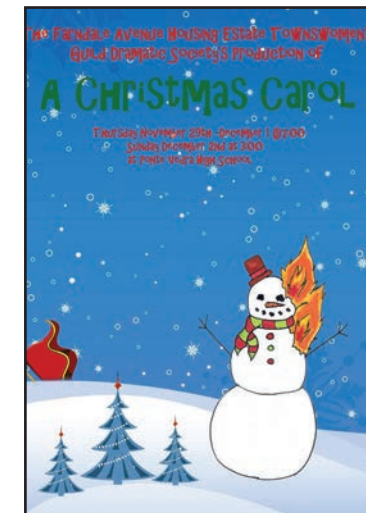

Thanksgiving is almost here. Ideally, this holiday should be about more than turkey, football, Black Friday and Cyber Monday.

After all, the idea behind Thanksgiving is to share what we have

with our loved ones. But if you want your family to take part in your abundance, you will want to look beyond one day in November. To help ensure you leave the type of legacy you desire, you will need to follow a detailed plan of action, including these steps:

St. Augustine artist to unveil series capturing strong females of the First Coast

Local artist Jenna Alexander is unveiling her latest art series, "Stripes and Buns," at an opening on Thursday, Dec. 6 at Gray 1908, a historic house located at 73 San Marco Ave. in St. Augustine that is home to Jenna Alexander Studio and Juniper Market.

"It started when I asked women in the community to come to my studio in their favorite striped shirt and bun on top of their head," Alexander explained. "I love when people can connect over something as simple as a fashion trend or hairstyle and, clearly, others agreed. It took only 45 minutes to fill every time slot, and I photographed over 200 women and girls."

Inspired by a quote that hung in her childhood bathroom ("Here's to good women. May we know them, may we be them, may we raise them") and the current social climate, Alexander set out to capture strong females of the First Coast. Out of the more than 200 photographs, Alexander chose 30 to transform into oil paintings. She's also created a coffee table book for the series.

"When each woman or girl came to my studio,

I had them write in their own words the answer to the question: What do you think it means to be a good woman?" Alexander said. "I took the paintings, photography, handwritten words and gouache illustrations and put together a book that I hope will instill strength in future generations of strong women."

First edition, hardcover and signed copies of "Stripes and Buns: A Tribute To Good Women" are available (\$65) now for pre-order as well as for sale at the opening of Alexander's "Stripes and Buns" series on Dec. 6.

A St. Augustine-based painter, photographer and illustrator, Alexander describes her work as "simple, candid, airy and beautiful." Alexander's previously released art series include "Salt Run," "Salt Run Silver," "Naptime Botanicals" and the "Even Me Project."

New art gallery opens in Jacksonville Beach

After a long career representing other artists at galleries such as James Coleman Signature Gallery and Tripp Harrison Gallery and Studio in St Augustine, Atlantic Beach native and artist Marie Lyon Carney recently decided to open her own gallery/studio in Jacksonville Beach, located at 1171 Beach Blvd.

"I want to make sure everyone knows that what I am doing is different than any of the galleries I have ever worked with," Carney said. "I want to be the gallery that gives back to the community that I grew up in. I want people to use my gallery to bring attention to their causes. We want to open up the studio for charity events at least once a month and hopefully more."

Having grown up on the beach, Carney looked for the ideal location and was pleased to find that another beach native, Mitch Kaufmann, had space in the building he operates Atlantic Video out of between RP McMurry's and the old Jaxon Social.

"I love Marie's art," Kaufmann said. "She captures all the elements of what is so near and dear to the whole beach life mindset. I am super stoked to have her here and I encourage everyone to come see her gallery."

Carney began her career in art in 2002. She became fascinated with the vivid colors of the underwater world while diving in the pristine teal waters of Grand Cayman. It was around this time that she decided to change her art medium to scratchboard art, a form of art unheard of by most. Her art is created by using sharp tools to hand etch the subject into white kaolin clay that is layered with black India ink. She then paints the clay with acrylic inks. She uses exaggerated colors to bring her subjects to a hyper state of life-likeness. This medium lends well to capturing the bright colors of marine life as well birds with precision and detail making a stark contrast against the black background.

Carney is known for her efforts bringing awareness to sea turtle preservation organizations. In addition to the Beaches Sea Turtle Patrol, she is working on becoming involved with other ocean conservation groups and wildlife groups throughout the United States.

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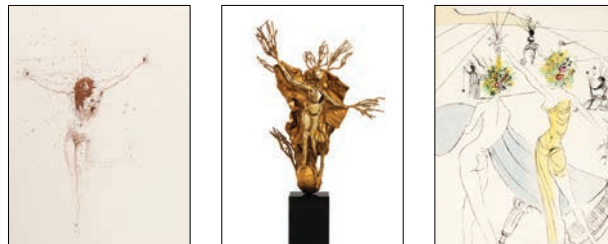

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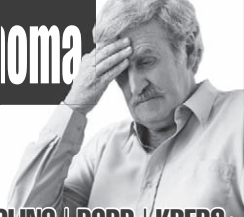
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
