



# County Commissioner Blocker speaks at Ponte Vedra Beaches Coalition meeting

Recently sworn-in St. Johns County District 4 Commissioner Jeremiah Blocker addressed the Ponte Vedra Beaches Coalition at its December meeting on Monday, Dec. 3, discussing a few of the key issues he plans on targeting while serving in office.

Specifically, Blocker said he would like to focus on only allowing development that is positive for the county and solving the infrastructure issues that he believes will benefit the community in both the present and future.

This includes his support of a Municipal Service Taxing Unit (MSTU) to support beach renourishment, and allocating tourism money back into Ponte Vedra.

"We are one of the few counties, one of two counties in the state, that does not have an active beach renourishment program," he said at the meeting held at the Palm Valley Community Center. "That puts the entire county in danger and it affects all of us. I want my kids — that's why I'm doing this — I want my kids to have a beach they're going to enjoy and experience."

The MSTU is a special taxing unit for addressing funding issues such as beach erosion along the county's northern coast. Blocker said he wants the MSTU to help in providing a coastal engineer as part of a beach management staff.

Another important issue Blocker wants to focus on is allocating tourism money back into the community.

"One thing that is not on the agenda is that we need to look at how our tourism dollars are being used," Blocker said. "Right now, a tremendous amount of dollars are going to St. Augustine. That's great. I love the Alligator Farm and I love St. Augustine. But many of the dollars that we pay here in Ponte Vedra end up going to some beach renourishment projects in St. Augustine and other parts of the county.

"So, I want to look at bringing those dollars back here," Blocker continued. "Many counties do this — Volusia and Flagler County does this — the dollars that are spent in those areas come back to that area. If we were able to do that, that

would bring several million dollars back that we could use for beautification projects."

Blocker said that although he recognizes the need for green space and beautification projects, he is "well aware" of the challenge of growing developments and traffic issues. He said infrastructure growth is an issue he wants to make sure is addressed, namely, by reevaluating the comprehensive land use plan.

"If we are amending (the land use plan) every couple of months, that's not exactly the best option going forward," he said. "That's our future land use map. Because what I think has happened is that we've grown at such a tremendous rate that our infrastructure has not kept up with that."

Blocker maintains that his main focus is on preserving the area for future generations by taking into consideration both environmental concerns, such as rising sea levels, and population expansion issues.

"We need to look at how we are growing, where we are growing and how we are going to manage that," he said.

# **LETTER TO THE EDITOR**

This letter is to provide correction and clarity to the community regarding some posting of inaccurate claims, pictures and descriptions of 347 N. Roscoe, a property that I own on the North Roscoe extension.

The pictures that have been published on social media and in this publication are NOT pictures of 347 N. Roscoe, nor does the lot or the extension on North Roscoe fit any description of what has been written. The property is 150 feet x 400 feet, and the intention is to divide the lot into two standard 75-foot x 400-foot, 0.7-acre lots.

I have lived on the North Roscoe extension for seven years and am interested in building on one-half of the current 1.38-acre parcel. In order to sell half of the lot for the purpose of building a home, it must be rezoned, and the required procedures have been followed meticulously to apply for such.

I assure you, as a long time Palm Valley resident and advocate, I do not have any malicious intent and have been assured by the Planning and Zoning Agency (PZA) of St. Johns County that this small scale amendment to be presented for hearing will not establish any leverage or "precedent" for any past or future rezoning requests. And I have worked arduously with the PZA for over a year in this process.

I was present at the last Palm Valley Community Association meeting in September and was very pleased at the reception as I was introduced and allowed a few minutes to describe the lot and my intention. I thank my community and neighbors in their consideration and support of this request. As a constituent of District 4, I will continue to advocate for the preservation of our neighborhoods and green areas here in Palm Valley.

According to the Parks & Recreation Department, residents must present a valid ID with a St. Johns County address or present proof of property tax payments in St. Johns County to purchase a resident pass. When requesting a handicap pass, a handicap hangtag or proof of qualification must be presented. Disabled military are eligible for a free annual pass by presenting military ID or a letter from Veterans Affairs verifying disabled status. Vehicles accessing the beach do not need a beach pass until March 1, 2019. After that date, beach passes will be available for purchase (at the same rate) at tollbooth locations only.

# Sawgrass Country Club members, guests celebrate U.S. Marine Corps birthday, honor other veterans

Over 170 people recently came together at Sawgrass Country Club to celebrate the 243rd birthday of the United States Marine Corps and to honor other service branches of the military following Veterans Day.

Held Nov. 14 at the Sawgrass Clubhouse following the Nov. 10 birthday, the event was organized by Ponte Vedra Beach resident Quang Pham, who spent 13 years in the Marine Corps, seven of which were on active duty as a CH-46 pilot in the Gulf and Somalia, and six of which were in the Reserve. Pham was also a refugee from Vietnam who left the country shortly after Saigon fell in 1975.

Pham explained that he established the event after attending similar functions in California and Pennsylvania and deciding something should be held locally.

"I said one year we're going to do it here," he said. "Last year was the first time we had the Marine Corps birthday. This is the second year. This is special for Sawgrass and all of us."

The event kicked off with a toast and tribute to fallen comrades, with Pham stating, "They've been gone, but they're still here with us." Pham then toasted to the Army, Navy, Air Force and Coast Guard, before proposing a final toast to the Marine Corps.

Pham then played several different service songs to recognize the veterans in attendance. As each song began, veterans from that respective branch stood and sang along.

Subsequently, Pham cut a celebratory cake and offered the first piece to the

event's guest of honor, Col. Gerry Berry. Pham then presented the second piece to the oldest Marine in the room and the third piece to the youngest Marine, Private First Class Dominic Lockwood, a recent graduate of Marine Corps boot camp at Parris Island and a Jacksonville

native whose mother, Donna Parente, works at Sawgrass Country Club.

Following the cutting of the cake, Pham introduced Berry, who was his executive officer at basic school in Quantico, Virginia. Berry served 25 years in the Marine Corps, with two tours in Vietnam, and worked a civilian career in aviation.

Berry was a CH-46 helicopter pilot in the Marine Corps during the fall of Saigon in April 1975. He was tasked with evacuating U.S. Ambassador Graham Martin from the U.S. embassy, an order that proved to be more complicated than he expected. He flew more than 18 straight hours during Operation Frequent Wind.

Berry shared a few other war stories and then concluded the evening by reflecting on war and its impact on the U.S. He referenced the song, "War (What is it good for)" by Edwin Starr, and asserted that the basis of the song is not true.

"War forged this great nation, the greatest nation ever," he said, noting the positive outcomes of the Civil War ending slavery and World War I and II making the world safer, among other examples. "We should think about our history. We should think about our glory. We should think about 250 years of heroism by these young Army, Navy, Air Force, Marines. We should salute them. We should embrace them."

All of these programs emphasize respect and compassion for the individuals who are participating.

### What's one thing people may not know about **COA** and its offerings?

COA serves all older adults in our community. The newly retired or newly transplanted folks looking for opportunities to grow, learn, try new things and engage with others will find our Lifelong Learning program has a great variety of offerings — art, dance, writing and language classes to name a few. And we have a large volunteer corps — over 700 volunteers — who help us carry out our mission, doing everything from delivering meals to homebound elders, to making minor home repairs or lawn maintenance, teaching Zumba and offering their talents in administrative tasks, photography and more.

# What's your vision for the future of the organization?

COA has been helping older adults live with independence, dignity, respect and inclusion for 45 years. I want to see us continue that mission with expanded programs and opportunities throughout the county to accommodate the changing needs of the rapidly growing population.

I would also like to see COA lead the fight against ageism. I want to see us change the conversation about what aging means, and what it doesn't. We need to embrace the idea that aging is not a disease to be cured or a problem to be solved. Aging is living.



"Mostly this year, it's Legos," Santa said. "Everyone wants Legos — both girls and boys."


According to St. Nick, however, a few kids wanted something a bit different. One child asked for a "purple unicorn" and another for a "dog that doesn't shed hair."





# Baptist Medical Center Beaches opens new AgeWell Center

Baptist Medical Center Beaches celebrated the opening of its new AgeWell Center for Senior Health with a ribbon-cutting event on Monday, Dec. 3 at its campus in Jacksonville Beach.

The new AgeWell location, which provides a special kind of primary care for adults 65 and older, is the second for Baptist Health. The first center opened in 2012 on the campus of Baptist Medical Center Jacksonville and has served more than 1,000 patients to date. The facility, located in Medical Office Building A, brings together geriatricians, pharmacists, psychologists and more to one location to offer a complete way for seniors to manage their health and get ahead of the common issues of aging.

The culmination of the evening included photos and the ribbon-cutting ceremony with Jacksonville Beach Mayor Charlie Latham; Dr. Courtney Ross of Baptist Health; AgeWell Executive Director Earl Evens; Baptist Medical Center Beaches President Joe Mitrick; AgeWell Center Director Mimi Holman; Dr. Richard Glock of Baptist Health; Baptist Health President and CEO Hugh Greene; and Baptist Health President and COO John Wilbanks.

According to Holman, the new location will benefit patients who were having a difficult time reaching the downtown office on Prudential Drive in Jacksonville.

"They're very used to being down here and getting services down here and it was just really an inconvenience to them," she said. "We didn't feel we were truly serving the aging population here in the Beaches area."

Holman went on to tout the multi-disciplinary model used by AgeWell to offer patients a variety of services, from speech and language pathology to physical therapy.

According to Dr. Ross, the social services offered at the AgeWell Center make it a unique facility for Beaches area seniors. In the past, the geriatrician said she dealt with patients who couldn't focus on their medical issues because they needed specialized social services first.

"I, for my training, knew generally what they might need but didn't have the social services team or specialists to help me to get them access to those resources," she

With AgeWell, patients can receive both social services and medical care in one place.

Furthermore, both Ross and Holman said they were touched by the testimony of a patient named Sheila Weinstein — who conveyed during her speech that the elderly community sometimes feels invisible or forgotten. Part of Baptist Health's mission, through AgeWell, is to remedy

that perception by offering patients more face-to-face time with medical professionals who care about them and their issues.

"The practice that I came from before this — regardless of the patient's age, complexity, social situation — I had 15-minute visits for my established patients and for a new patient visit was 20 to 30 if I stretched it," Ross explained. "To be able to have a minimum of 30 minutes face-to-face time for an established visit is great, not just for me because it gives me time to get caught up with what's been going on and be accurate and complete in my documentation, but also from the patient standpoint."

# Residents at The Palms at Ponte Vedra enjoy assisted living with their pets

Some residents of The Palms at Ponte Vedra didn't move to the facility alone, they came with furry friends.

Arden Dismuke, who moved into the assisted living facility one year ago, said her dog Flopsy — named after her one floppy ear — has helped her make a smooth transition from North Carolina into the Ponte Vedra community.

"I couldn't be here without her," she said. "Every day I'm just grateful that I have her. She really truly is my friend, and I really have appreciated having a dog here."

Dismuke thinks her dog might have been abused by a man before she got her, but the Palms at Ponte Vedra resident said Flopsy is happy and healthy today.

"She's getting plump because the Palms is a very wonderful place to eat," she added. "She's very healthy."

Stephanie Lane, another resident, said she wouldn't have moved to the Palms without her 12-year-old dog, Lucy.

"I bought (Lucy) so they wouldn't put her down," she said. "I took her home, and I took her straight to the vet and it cost almost \$1,300 to have the kennel cough fixed ... she sleeps with me at night, and she barks when I'm not in the room with her."

Lane, a former teacher, said she took her dog to school and raised her there for the first four months of her life. The Palms resident was required to submit Lucy's medical records, ensure her shots were up to date and that she

was on the proper medicine in order to move into The Palms with her pet.

According to the Palms' pet policy, all pets must be on a leash when in the interior and exterior common areas of the community. Only one pet is allowed, including a small dog no bigger than 20 pounds, a cat or a bird. Additionally, pet owners must prevent their pets from causing any disturbance — which constitutes a breach of the quiet enjoyment of others — and the pet must not pose a risk or danger to anyone in the community, among other requirements.

# Navigating aging with senior pets

As pets age, their needs change, and pet owners must adjust how they care for their pets.

Spunky pups and curious kittens draw the attention of people eager to welcome new pets into their families. As pets begin to age, owners of senior animals may find that they struggle with their pets' emergent needs in this stage of life.

Senior pets may experience dementia, mood changes, inactivity, pain and incontinence. But thanks to improved veterinary care and dietary habits, pets can live longer than ever — and remain comfortable well into their senior years.

Cats and dogs are generally considered geriatric at the age of seven, according to the American Veterinary Medical Foundation. Even so, many pets go on to live 12 to 15 years, which can be the equivalent of age 75 to 85 in humans. Geriatric pets are susceptible to the same conditions seen in older people, including cancer, diabetes, weakness, senility, joint or bone diseases and heart disease. It is essential to keep an open dialogue with a veterinarian to discuss any potential health issues aging pets may encounter.

According to veterinary behaviorist Nicholas Dodman, coauthor of "Good Old Dog: Expert Advice for Keeping Your Aging Dog Healthy, Happy and Comfortable," pet owners must realize that older pets are less able to thermoregulate, so they're more sensitive to extreme temperature changes. Pets may need blankets or sweaters. They also may need to spend more time indoors when the weather is harsh.

Dietary changes may need to be made. Older pets may eat less, but they should be fed high-quality, nutritious foods that help keep their weight in check. Excess weight can put added stress on sensitive joints and may contribute to problems with diabetes.

Veterinary Pet Insurance, a division of Nationwide Insurance Company, said there are new, alternative treatments available for aging pets, often used to treat pain, pet arthritis and cancer. Cold laser treatment directs light to stimulate cells and increase blood circulation to ease aches and pains. Medical acupuncture can help reduce pain and inflammation. Radiosurgery can target cancerous tissue with a very high dose of targeted radiation while avoiding doses to surrounding tissue. In addition, monoclonal antibodies can be attached to cancer cells to boost natural immunity to cancer and germs.

Older pets require different care and more patience. Owners of aging pets should speak with their veterinarians about caring for pets as they grow older.





"These were (locals) that had worked in business and raised families and were busy but now that they are retired." Quinlan said. "Maybe they had sung in a college choir or something in the past, but now they have the time."

The Sawgrass Singers is mostly, if not all, comprised of seniors and retirees. Quinlan says they have had high school students participate in the instrumental section in the past, but they currently host older members, the oldest Singers being in their 80s.

The Singers aren't disadvantaged by their ages, however

Longtime member Ted Burfeind, 86, holds the rhythm

on the drums. He plays regularly for the Sawgrass Singers as well as the Jacksonville Symphony and Civic Orchestra of Jacksonville.

"I've been playing about 75 years," Burfeind said. "I started in middle school and continued on to play in combos as I got older."

One thing Quinlan notes is that members' voices tend to change with age. When this happens, she doesn't worry about it, she just, "moves them around."

"A lot of my tenors are just now singing baritone," she shrugged.







# Consider pros and cons of early retirement

Leaving a job can be a boon to a person's health as well. Relieving oneself of the pressures and stresses of professional life can free up the mind and body. Stress can affect mental and physical health, taxing the heart and contributing to conditions such as depression or anxiety. According to the Mayo Clinic, stress can



cause headache, muscle and chest pain, and contribute to trouble sleeping.

The earlier the retirement, the more

opportunity to travel before health issues

begin to limit mobility. Early retirement

also can be a way to volunteer more or

even start a new job opportunity - one where workers have greater control over their schedules and careers.

# Disadvantages

One of the disadvantages of early retirement is a loss of income. Contributions to retirement accounts also cease at retirement. This can lead to financial setbacks if adequate savings were not allocated for retirement. According to the resource WealthHow, some people who retire early fear outliving their savings.

While retiring early may be good for health, it also can have negative consequences. An analysis from the National Bureau of Economic Research found that retirement can lead to declines in mental health and mobility as well as feelings of isolation. # Memory care a component of assisted living



"Alzheimer's patients must maintain their activity, walking, interacting with music and art," said Lory Bright-Long, MD, CMD, of the American Medical Directors Association. "We have to awaken the senses so that the memory can have a hook. This is accomplished in the memory care setting."



# Florida Urgent Rescue celebrates 3-year anniversary

Local nonprofit seeks support during holiday season

#### By Jon Blauvelt

Florida Urgent Rescue (F.U.R.), a Jacksonville-based nonprofit organization dedicated to saving animals from kill shelters and other urgent situations, recently celebrated its three-year anniversary in November.

In the local organization's first three years of operation, F.U.R. has rescued 1,092 dogs and cats, and according to Founder and President Mike Merrill, the nonprofit just eclipsed 1,100 last week.

"We never really expected this kind of volume," Merrill said. "I figured it would be a lot slower pace. But we have a hard time saying no."

F.U.R.'s efforts include pulling animals from shelters and providing veterinary and foster services and an adoption program.
F.U.R. also provides care to animals in urgent situations who have, for example, gunshot wounds or injuries from a car collision. In addition, the organization markets and promotes dogs in shelters so that other rescuers and adopters have the necessary information to help them decide whether they can pull or adopt the animals.

"We've done over 100 introductions for

over 100 dogs in shelters and thankfully, knock on wood, 100 percent of them have gotten out alive," Merrill said. "I think just getting the information out helps answer people's questions and helps them make a better decision."

F.U.R. also offers a program called Save Our Strays, which has resulted in the rescues or assistance in rescues and trappings of more than 95 stray dogs. In addition, the nonprofit provides a program called Florida Urgent Transport, which moves animals in need from overcrowded shelters in the Southern United States to shelters and rescue groups with greater capacity.

#### Help needed during the holiday season

Merrill used to love the holiday season before he started working in animal rescue. Now, he doesn't feel the same way because he said, surprisingly and unfortunately, many people in the area surrender their dogs and cats during this time of year.

"I don't understand it," Merrill said.
"You'll see photos of people lined up to surrender their dogs so they can go on vacation"

When the animals are abandoned, Merrill said it's challenging to find foster

parents during the holidays because people are traveling or going on vacation themselves. He noted that his organization is losing a few foster parents because they are traveling too. In addition, Merrill said a handful of the kennels F.U.R. uses to board animals are busiest during this time of year, so they can't take them either.


"It's a really, really tough time of year during the holidays," he said. "There are so many animals in need. We're going to see a ton of animals dumped and surrendered. It's just tough to help them because there aren't enough foster homes yearround."

Merrill also noted that every local shelter F.U.R. works with is full. So, he said, as more animals come into shelters during the holidays, they will most likely euthanize the dogs and cats that are there already, unless somebody gets them out.

As a result, Merrill said F.U.R. and every other rescue group is always looking for foster homes. If people cannot foster but would still like to help, Merrill said volunteers and donations are always appreciated.

"We spend three times as much on vet care as we bring in through adoption donations," Merrill said. "The only way we can save animals is to have fundraisers or donations to make up that difference."

F.U.R. is partnering with Forever Vets Animal Hospital on one such upcoming fundraiser on Saturday, Dec. 8 from 9 to 11 a.m. at its Tinseltown location. The animal hospital is holding a Photos with Santa event that will benefit F.U.R. For \$10, customers can take home a photo of their pet with Santa and support the local nonprofit at the same time. Gleason said the addition of the mobile van has expanded S.A.F.E.'s reach and saved more lives.

"Several years ago, a kind and generous individual donated the funds that allowed S.A.F.E. to purchase a self-contained, fully outfitted mobile adoption van," she said. "We can now transport over a dozen dogs to adoption events all over the greater Jacksonville area."

Gleason said S.A.F.E. also plans to have the mobile adoption van visit the Pet Supermarket parking lot in Ponte Vedra once a month and is seeking volunteers.

In addition, she noted that SAFE never turns an animal away, which makes donations particularly vital to the nonprofit's mission.

"Since SAFE is run entirely by donations, monetary donations are welcome to cover costs directly related to saving animals," Gleason said. "Vet bills are always a huge expense as so many of these animals need to be rehabilitated before they can be adopted."


# Beaches Orthodontics celebrates opening of its new office in Ponte Vedra Beach

How should you respond to wild swings in financial markets?

What's going on with the financial markets? Specifically, what's behind the price swings of the past several weeks? And, more important, how should you, as an

individual investor, respond?

To begin, the recent volatility was not really all that extraordinary. The daily drops pushed U.S. stocks down about 10 percent from their recent record highs, although they have regained some of that ground. A 10 percent drop represents a "correction" - not a crash - and historically, corrections have occurred about once a year.

So, what seems to have caused these market jitters? Here are the key culprits:

- Anticipated slowdown in economic growth and corporate earnings. The stock market is forward-looking - investors make decisions based on what they think will happen. And right now, many investors are anticipating a slowdown in economic growth (partially due to higher tariffs and trade disputes) and corporate earnings (as the jolt from the corporate tax cuts begins to fade). We may still see reasonably strong economic growth and corporate profits, but possibly not at the same level as we had for much of 2018.
- **Rising interest rate.** The Federal Reserve raised interest rates in 2018. While higher rates are not bad for all market sectors, they can slow the expansion plans for many businesses, resulting in reduced growth prospects. The Fed may continue its gradual rate increases, but investors are closely watching for any signs

# Pivot CPAs sends team to Panama City following Hurricane Michael

A team of employees from Pivot CPAs in Ponte Vedra Beach recently traveled to Panama City to help with the cleanup efforts following Hurricane Michael.

Kyle Vincent, an assurance senior at the firm, organized the efforts after he and his wife, Amy, traveled to the area a few days after the Oct. 10 storm to help Amy's parents recover from serious damage they sustained.

"It was just really, really eye-opening when we went there," Vincent said. "It was insane. Trees everywhere. People pulling up to their houses for the first time seeing their house was basically demolished. It was a nightmare."

Before making that first trip, Vincent sent an email to his Pivot colleagues asking for donations of support, including water, supplies and money for gas. When he returned, he spoke to the firm's partners, who ultimately decided to support a Pivot service trip. Within a week and a half, the firm assembled a team, including Vincent and his wife and colleagues, Jesica Martinez, Kunal Kishan and Chris Kennedy. They also created a GoFundMe page, asking clients, family and friends to make donations in support of their mission

The Pivot team left for Panama City Nov. 8 and returned changed people on Nov. 10.

"It was real humbling," Kishan said. "I had seen a lot of stuff on the news but nothing as crazy as I thought I would be driving in."

The Pivot team partnered with a Panama City church, Deerpoint Lake Assembly of God, to find those in need of their help. They first went to the home of Patti Miller, a member of the church who uses a wheelchair. According to Vincent, a tree had fallen on her home, and debris was blocking her driveway, so the team spent six hours helping her

As they were finishing up, a family approached them and said a couple down the road could also use some help. The next morning, the Pivot team went to the home of Shawn Waters, whose driveway had not been cleared yet either. In addition, Waters shockingly told the team his wife died two days earlier on Nov. 7 from cancer. To make matters worse, the man told the Ponte Vedra team his landlord wasn't providing him with any assistance in the recovery. Consequently, the Pivot team spent the day helping him.

"I think it was really eye-opening as to how good you can have it sometimes," Vincent said. "Right now, over here, we don't even think about this anymore. You saw it on the news when it was happening, you saw a little bit of the aftermath and then we just go on about our daily lives. All these people in Panama City are still suffering and you don't realize it."

In a blog written by Vincent on the Pivot website, he noted the team subsequently met with a pastor from the

church to discuss their experiences. The pastor told them they were planning to rent a Bobcat for \$3,000 a month to help with the recovery efforts. Vincent, in turn, said he handed the pastor a check and said, "Well, here is your first month's rent."

According to the team's GoFundMe page, they have raised \$4,700 for the recovery efforts, which means a lot to Kishan.

"It's nice to know that I'm working for someone that actually understands the community comes first sometimes," Kishan said. "They were willing to do what they had to do in order to help out."

Since the team's trip, Vincent and his wife have returned again to help, and he said the area is still completely devastated.

"Every morning you wake up to chainsaws," Vincent said. "No matter what. Every single morning there are chainsaws at 6 a.m."

As a result, Vincent and Kishan are encouraging others to do whatever they can to help.

"Obviously we weren't able to conquer everything," Kishan said, "but I think if you were able to just give back whatever you can, whether it's time, a donation, supplies or anything, I think it's important for us to all come together and really unite as one, not just during a tragedy like a hurricane, but in general as a country. We need to come together when times call for desperate needs."

that might lead the Fed either to pause or increase rates more rapidly.

■ Slowing global economy. The global economy is growing more slowly than expected, resulting in lower returns for international stocks and a particularly sharp decline in emerging markets.

While it's useful to understand the factors causing the recent stock market gyrations, you'll want to focus primarily on what you can control. Consider these suggestions:

■ Keep realistic expectations. Try to maintain realistic expectations about how your investments are likely to perform over time. After five years in which the S&P 500's returns have averaged almost 14 percent per year, we may well be in for a period of more typical returns, possibly in the 5 percent to 6 percent range. As always, though, there are no guarantees when it comes to anticipating the performance of the financial markets.

■ Review your mix of investments. From time to time, and sometimes in response to changing market conditions, you may need to change the mix of investments in your portfolio. So, for example,

if higher market volatility makes you uncomfortable, you may want to consider adding bonds or other fixed-income vehicles, as these types of investments tend to stabilize stock-heavy portfolios during turbulent times.

■ Don't get scared away from investing. You may not like seeing multi-hundred-point plunges in the Dow Jones Industrial Average, but don't get scared off from investing. After all, recent stock market history has taught the value of patience: If you had given up on investing in March 2009, at the market's low point in the Great Recession, you would have missed out on the 300 percent gains

achieved before the current round of volatility. Of course, the market's past performance can't guarantee what will happen next.

The financial markets will always fluctuate — sometimes violently. But as an investor, you should strive for calmness, patience and discipline — because these attributes can help you look past today's headlines toward the future you envision.


Patel, who is a Jacksonville native and graduate of The Bolles School, said she is happy to be permanently planting herself within her home community.

# Country music trio Midland to play at St. Augustine Amphitheatre April 12



# Sharks start strong in new basketball season

With only two seconds left on the clock and the Sharks trailing by two points, Bartram Trail had a chance to ice the game at the free throw line. After the Bear shooter missed both free throws, Russi pulled

down his ninth rebound of the game and immediately called time-out.

Myers launched a perfect pass that hit Ben Houser in stride. Houser took one dribble and launched a shot behind the three-point arch that swished in to give the Sharks an improbable 47-46 victory.

In a complete reversal from their season opener against Bartram Trail, it was the Sharks who jumped out to a commanding lead in their home opener in the Shark Tank. The hot shooting hosts raced out to a commanding 20-6 lead over the visitors from Oakleaf.

It was Oakleaf, however, who would mount a comeback and would begin the second half on a 13-1 run to eventually tie the game at 35-35 with 1:45 to play in the third quarter. The Sharks rebounded from their loss to Bishop Kenny with a 68-54 win on Tuesday night against Matanzas. Houser led the team in scoring with 15, while Russi had 13, Martin had 12 and Conway had nine. Martin also had 11 rebounds, while Corlazzoli had seven assists.

The Sharks will travel just a few minutes down the road on Friday, Dec. 7 to play Nease at 7:30 p.m.


