

SOUPer Bowl IV opened to a packed crowd at Nease High School on Jan. 31.

The award for best soup was presented to St. Johns Technical High School by last year's "People's Choice" winner, Chef David Cressler, from the Sawgrass Country Club.

In addition, Valley Ridge Academy won the "Be the Change" competition, which was a coin collection competition aimed at raising money for the event and the Blessings in a Backpack program.

Every year, the SOUPer Bowl also offers commemorative bowls created by students for participants to enjoy. The bowls are donated to the event by Bartram Trail High School, Creekside High School, Nease High School, Palencia Elementary, The Webster School, PVPV/ Rawlings Elementary, St. Johns Technical High School, Valley Ridge Academy and Wards Creek Elementary. Along with the "bowl" theme, Wild Ginger Pottery was at the event to demonstrate pottery throwing in action.

Landrum Middle School's Best Buddies visit animals at Fantasy Farms



LETTER TO THE EDITOR

My name is Damian May and I am one of the many faces of Alzheimer's. On Feb. 6, at the Alzheimer's Association's annual "Rally in Tally," I had the honor of meeting with Rep. Cyndi Stevenson to discuss making Alzheimer's a top legislative priority. Together, with more than 100 Alzheimer's Association advocates from across the region, we are united in making Florida a "dementia capable" state by working with our legislators to address specific needs to create a direct path to treatment and a cure.

As a health economist, it is critically important to me that we build community programs to help our caregivers help our patients with Alzheimer's. There is both a significant toll on human health, as well as the cost to care for all Floridians. The Alzheimer's Disease Initiative (ADI) provides critical support for our caregivers, which can and will, in turn, increase the health of our caregivers, as well as decrease costs associated with the very real human toll of Alzheimer's disease.

Together with the Alzheimer's Association, I support funding for the ADI, as these funds support the more than 1.1 million Floridians who provide daily unpaid care for those living with dementia. There are currently thousands of Floridians on the wait list for critically-needed respite care services, so I urge Rep. Stevenson to support this funding as well.

Can you please briefly tell us about your background?

I've been in the jewelry business for 52 years now. I have had my store here in Ponte Vedra for 32 years. I have been in Jacksonville for longer than that. What do you enjoy most about your job?

I most enjoy making people smile. I try my best to do repairs and custom order work. We also do get to meet a variety of people of all ages. In addition, I like working with my hands.

When you reflect over your career, how has the industry changed?

The industry has changed a lot. When I first went into the jewelry business, it was a luxury item. And then in the 80s, 90s and into the beginning of the 2000s, it became more of not a luxury item but an everyday item. People are not into the gold and stuff as much as they used to be. It's beginning to more casual. Even my design work I've changed from more of a glamorous style to now very casual, everyday wear.

What do you recommend as a good Valentine's Day gift?

A good, popular gift right now seems to be silver-related or silver-looking items. You should look for something that is more of an everyday wear, instead of something that is a specialty wear, like what we used to sell that would be worn for a special occasion.

What do you enjoy most about living in Ponte Vedra?

I like the community because it is an upscale beach community. It features a laid-back, casual atmosphere. There have been times over the 32 years I've been here when it was little more of a dressy feel. Now, it's gotten very casual. That's what I like about it. It's not like you're in a big metropolitan area. Here I know my customers. I have a good, long base of customers who have been coming to me for a long time. We see each other on a daily basis at restaurants, the grocery store, etc.. The town has a personal feel, which I enjoy.

What do you enjoy to do in your free time?

My free time is very limited since I have a store that is open five to six days a week. But in the free time I do have, I like to do a lot of walking. I will go to different towns and cities to walk. I'll also walk the beach and areas here. I've been known to go 100 miles away just to do a 7- or 8-mile walk. I also have a little itch for nice cars, so I do go to car shows.







Charitable giving options under new tax law

The new tax law makes it harder to claim a tax deduction for charitable contributions. While charitable giving should not be only about getting a tax break, if you want to get a tax benefit from your contributions, there

are a couple of options.

The Tax Cut and Jobs Act, enacted in December 2017, nearly doubled the standard deduction to \$12,000 for individuals and \$24,000 for couples. This means that if your charitable contributions, along with any other itemized deductions, are less than \$12,000 a year, the standard deduction will lower your tax bill more than itemizing your deductions. For most people, the standard deduction will be the better option.

If you still want to maximize the tax benefits of charitable giving and you have the financial means, one option is to double your charitable donations in one year and then skip the donation the following year. For example, instead

When more people vote, democracy wins

Voting is an essential part of democracy. That it even needs to be said is mind boggling, but that is where we are in America. A bill was recently proposed in the United States House of Representatives, For the People Act, which contained a slew of reforms, among which was a

proposal that election day be a federal holiday. Sen. Mitch McConnell called it a "rewrite" of the rules of American politics for the benefit of the Democratic Party. Huh? People voting benefits one party?

That is not what the framers of the Constitution thought. "The time, places and manner of holding elections for senators and representatives, shall be prescribed in each state by the Legislature thereof; but Congress may at any time make or alter such regulations." Article I, section 4, clause 1.

Despite this power, in the United States, there are no federal laws mandating that employees get time off to cast their ballots. When faced with the choice of taking unpaid time off of work to vote, and the

of giving \$10,000 a year to charity, you could give \$20,000 every other year and itemize your deductions in that year.

Another way to concentrate charitable giving is to establish a donor-advised fund (DAF) through a public charity. A DAF allows you to make a charitable donation to the fund and receive the tax benefit immediately. The money is placed in an account where it can be invested and grow tax-free. You can then make donations to charities from the account at any time, in addition to adding to the account. As with any investment, you need to do research before establishing a DAF. Make sure vou understand the fees involved and whether there are any limits on the charitable contributions you can make. You should consult with your financial advisor before taking any steps.

If you are taking required minimum distributions from an IRA, another option is to donate those distributions directly to charity through a qualified charitable donation. The distributions won't be included in your gross income, which means lower taxes overall. The donation must be made directly from the IRA to the charity and different IRAs have different rules about how to make the distributions.

Breath tests in Florida: Reliable, or science fiction?

Most of us know that the legal limit in Florida is a .08. But how many of us really know what that means?

The legal description is 0.08 or more grams of alcohol per 210 liters of breath. Thus, if the breath machine registers a person's breath alcohol level to be at or above this threshold, the state will attempt to admit this evidence at trial against the

accused. But just how does the breath machine work and how does it analyze one's breath for alcohol concentration? The only goal of this article is education, not to sway your thinking one way or the other on the accuracy of the breath machine. Of course, we can only touch on the basics of breath testing, as it's impossible to cover everything in one article.

Although we must talk a little physiology, I'm going to merely skim the surface here because I don't want your eyes wandering off to the next page just yet. The way that alcohol molecules find their way into your breath is through a process known as diffusion. This is where alcohol in the blood travels to the breath via the alveoli (thin-walled sacs that fill the lungs). The goal is to try and obtain, through exhalation, deep lung air from the subject.

Reliability of the sample, however, could be compromised where residual alcohol in the mouth is present, which could result in a false positive result. Breath test operators attempt to



prospect of standing in long lines to cast a ballot, almost half of all Americans choose not to vote, as seen in the 2016 presidential election. Some countries, including Belgium and Turkey, have compulsory voting laws, according to

Insider. Why is any of this controversial? Last November, here in Florida, 64 percent of voters overturned the state's constitutional voting ban on ex-felons. Amendment 4 automatically restores voting rights for people convicted of certain felonies after they have completed their sentences, including any probation or payment of restitution. Amendment 4 does not apply to those convicted of sexual offenses or murders. Before Amendment 4, the only way someone convicted of a felony in Florida could get his or her rights restored was to wait five to seven years and then apply to the governor for clemency. The average person waited up to 10 years just to get a response to his or her application, according to a November 2018 article in the Orlando Sentinel.

Both red and blue states have lifted barriers to the ballot for those who have served their time. 1.4 million Floridians will now be eligible to vote because of Amendment 4. These are our neighbors, friends and relatives.

So why not make it easier to vote? State lawmakers across the country have either filed or pre-filed at least 230 bills expanding access to the ballot for millions, according to a recent article on Governing.com. In fact, laws aimed at increasing voter access have outpaced laws designed to make it tougher, and allegedly more secure, to vote. The For the People Act would put in place nationwide automatic voter registration, promote online voter registration, require sameday registration for federal elections, stop some voter purging and restore voting rights for ex-felons. Automatic voter registration, where voters have to opt out of registering to vote when they visit a DMV, has been enacted in 16 states and the District of Columbia, per Governing. com. Seventeen states and D.C. allow same-day registration.

Why shouldn't this appeal to all political parties? If politicians don't welcome expanding access to the ballot box, maybe they are not "for the people"?

reduce this possibility by performing what is known as the "20-minute observation" to ensure against regurgitation, which causes alcohol to travel up into the mouth area.

In Florida, the police must collect two breath samples that are within a .02 agreement of each other. Thus, where the first test registers a breath estimate of .10, the second sample can be as far off as a .08 or a .12 and the estimates are deemed valid. The two samples do not (and rarely are) need to be the same. To give you a real-world analogy, this is akin to buying a scale for your bathroom, taking it home and getting on it and it says you weigh 100 pounds. Then you step off, step back on and it then says you weigh 120 pounds. Is that an acceptable range of accuracy?

The breath machine uses infrared light absorption to analyze the breath sample. Once the breath sample moves through the breath tube and into the sample chamber, the alcohol molecules will begin to absorb portions of the infrared light. The more alcohol molecules there are in the sample, the more light will be absorbed, which in turn will trigger a higher breath alcohol estimate.


Devices such as cell phones cannot be anywhere near the breath machines while a test is being conducted due to the radio frequency interference that may also compromise the test. Thus, if an officer inadvertently leaves his/her phone in their pocket while in the breath test room, reliability issues could surface.

Other issues that may call into question the accuracy of the test are "purge fails." This is where the machine was not able to clear the sample chamber of a breath or control test sample before the next test is run. If the problem is not identified, the results of any subsequent tests would be invalid. Although the machines are in theory supposed to be able to safeguard against these issues (through display messages), that does not always occur.

A person arrested for DUI in Florida has the right to request the more reliable blood test if they first agreed to the breath test. Otherwise, blood tests are generally only obtained where there is an accident involving serious injuries or death. Simple misdemeanor DUI cases will rarely involve a blood test unless the circumstances are such that the administration of a breath test is impossible or impractical.

In sum, it's important to understand the inner workings of the breath machine before deciding whether you should blow. The Zombies to play Ponte Vedra Concert Hall Feb. 20 ahead of Rock & Roll Hall of Fame induction

When The Zombies last performed at the Ponte Vedra Concert Hall in January 2018, the band was wrapping up another successful U.S. tour fueled by a resurgence in popularity for the group known for such 1960s hits as "She's Not There," "Tell Her No" and "Time of the Season."

When the band returns to the concert hall Feb. 20, they do so as 2019 inductees into the Rock & Roll Hall of Fame. On March 29 — 50 years to the day that "Time of the Season" topped the U.S. charts — The Zombies will join Stevie Nicks, Janet Jackson, Radiohead, Roxy Music, The Cure and Def Leppard for the formal induction ceremony to be held in Brooklyn, New York. It's an honor that, as the group sang in "This Will Be Our Year," "took a long time to come."

"When the band first started way back in 1961, I would never have dreamed of this kind of recognition," lead singer Colin Blunstone said. "And even after all these years, it's still a thrill to be nominated by such a respected and revered institution!"

It's recognition that seems all the more remarkable given The Zombies' circuitous route to music success. After enjoying chart-topping hits in 1964 and 1965 with "She's Not There" and "Tell Her No," the band struggled to maintain that momentum, hampered by poor management. By the time the group's second album, "Odessey and Oracle," was released in 1968 and "Time of the Season" became a hit a year later, the band had already split up and its members moved on to other projects.

It wasn't until 1999 when Blunstone and fellow Zombie Rod Argent decided to team up for a handful of performances that The Zombies began to rise again. Soon, the duo — backed by a new band that included Argent's cousin, former Kinks bass player Jim Rodford — were touring again. Much to their

surprise, there was a huge fan following for the early Zombies hits, and after receiving permission to use the name from the surviving members of the original group, The Zombies were born again.

Since then, the reconstituted Zombies have toured virtually non-stop, gaining new legions of fans — many of whom weren't even born when the band first topped the charts in the 1960s. The group's popularity has also benefited from the use of Zombies hits in countless commercials, films and TV series — "This Will Be Our Year" concluded the recent second season of "The Marvelous Mrs. Maisel" — as well as the plaudits of well-known musicians such as Tom Petty, Paul Weller and Dave Grohl.

"The last 12 months have been extraordinary!" Argent said. "We've had a panoply of lovely comments ... from so many favorite and iconic artists — many of whom have taken the trouble to come along to watch a show in one of the four U.S. tours we've undertaken during that period. To our amazement, they've even quoted us as a major influence!"

The Zombies will perform at the Ponte Vedra Concert Hall Wednesday, Feb. 20 at 8 p.m. (doors open at 7 p.m.). For tickets, visit www.pontevedraconcerthall.com.






