



St. Johns County to hold discussion on regulation of short-term rental properties

It's no wonder that St. Johns County's tourism industry is booming. With St. Augustine's Nights of Lights, the PGA TOUR's presence and the regular influx of tourists headed to the beach, the county has plenty to offer.

When it comes to regulating tourism growth, however, the county is looking to address issues that have arisen from the proliferation of vacation rentals. This is due partly to the rising popularity of Vacation Rentals by Owner (VRBO) and Airbnb, which currently hosts over 2,000 homes in the county, according to the Airbnb website.

On Tuesday, Feb. 5, the St. Johns County Board of County Commissioners will decide the next step regarding a possible ordinance on regulating short-term vacation rentals. The meeting will determine whether a future ordinance will be drafted or if additional research is needed. If the commission decides on enacting an ordinance, another public meeting will be held to discuss the approach before presenting it to the commission again.

According to a St. Johns County growth management report submitted on Jan. 10, there has been expressed concern over short-term vacation rentals in the community. A "predominant concern was the effect of (them) on the traditional character of the neighborhood." The management report cited a survey that was conducted, in which most residents were specifically concerned with maximum occupancy of rentals, parking, trash and noise.

By looking at other jurisdictions that have implemented a short-term rental ordinance, the meeting will include discussion on registration of rentals, instating occupancy standards, enforcing trash pickup and regulating street parking, which is believed to be a hazard for rescue services. It should be noted, however, that in 2011, the Florida Legislature preempted cities and counties from prohibiting vacation rentals. Because of this bill, the county can only regulate them within certain confines of state law.

Steve Milo, the founder and CEO of VTrips (previously Vacation Rental Pros) in Ponte Vedra Beach, said that depending on the regulation, it could be a potentially positive one for his company. He told the Recorder in a statement that, "a reasonable ordinance is one that protects the rights of all property owners, not just full-time residents." He added, "As someone who lives full-time in St. Johns County, I hope the commissioners avoid an ordinance like Flagler County, that resulted in litigation and a \$26 million Bert Harris claim." According to a Florida Times-Union article

in January 2018, the litigation he cited involved a settlement that included him and 75 other property owners. In it, the rental property owners sued Flagler County over a rental property ordinance, claiming it to be unconstitutional under state law.

It isn't just rental companies that might be affected, however. Joseph Cearley, special projects manager for the St. Johns County Growth Management Department, said he has listened to Airbnb hosts who depend on their rentals for their livelihood.

"We've heard some things from (hosts) stating that if this was cut from them it would affect them financially," he said. "That's why we've looked at potentially (exempting) those who live within the residences."

Cearley made it clear, however, that right now everything is, "an option that will be presented as a question to the board."

K9s For Warriors, City of San Antonio Animal Care Services partner on lifesaving large dog program

Ponte Vedra-based nonprofit to build training center in Texas; receives \$2 million investment from Petco Foundation

San Antonio city leaders unanimously voted in favor of a new partnership between Animal Care Services (ACS) and national nonprofit K9s For Warriors to bring a new canine center and rescue program to the Alamo City in Texas.

According to a press release distributed by ACS, the agreement approves an initial 10-year lease of 3 acres of ACS property to build a canine training facility for use by K9s For Warriors in its service dog training program. The initiative will focus on larger, harder to rescue dogs, and 200 ACS pets are expected to work their way through the training to become PTSD service animals throughout the country.

The Ponte Vedra-based nonprofit currently operates two campuses in Florida, and the national expansion will be a big boost for the dog rescue aspect of its program, said CEO Rory Diamond.

"The prospect of bringing our national nonprofit to San Antonio is thrilling to us," Diamond said in the release. "We're more than ready to help the homeless dogs there find a new purpose as a lifesaving PTSD service dog. To achieve that, over the course of the next year, K9s For Warriors will be engaging the San Antonio community to build a base

of volunteers and donors to ensure our organization's success in the Alamo

City of San Antonio Animal Care Services Director Heber Lefgren echoed those sentiments.

"Collaboration continues to be the core of ACS' success and we're thrilled to have a partner to support our mission and help our country's veterans," Lefgren said in the release. "K9s For Warriors has a big heart for these big dogs and we love that they will be saving a life to save another."

Petco Foundation invests \$2 million in K9s For Warriors

While the program will begin in the spring, a recent \$2 million investment from the San Antonio-based Petco Foundation is expected to aid in construction of the canine center itself, which will kick off later this year.

According to a press release distributed by K9s For Warriors, the grant investment is the largest ever given by Petco Foundation to the nonprofit. The new

THE PLAYERS Championship sponsors sports and business education forum for local students

Approximately 200 local students dressed in ties, suits, skirts and dress pants visited the TPC Clubhouse on Tuesday morning to meet potential employers and mentors at the Training U: Sports and Business Education Forum.

Sixteen companies and 11 colleges held booths to discuss their respective industries with students from high schools all over the First Coast — from Ribault to St. Augustine High. Sponsored by THE PLAYERS Championship, the Jan. 29 event provided the students an opportunity to meet with company representatives and college recruiters before graduating and deciding the next step of their lives. Many of the students who attended come from low socioeconomic backgrounds and aren't presented with many opportunities to network with industry leaders. The second annual event aims to make these connections available to everyone, regardless of privilege.

Christopher Jett, a graduate of Wolfson High School, attended the first Training U event last year. He has since enrolled at University of North Florida in the criminal justice program. Jett said meeting officers from the Jacksonville Sheriff's Office at the forum helped galvanize his career path.

"Their words, more than anything, helped inspire me to prepare myself for the risk at hand and be ready to take on what was in front of me," he told the Recorder.

Jett already knew that a career in law enforcement was his aspiration. Meeting those actively involved in the work helped him understand what direction he needed to take and gave him both the motivation and resolution to make his dream come true.

"It was eye-opening to come here and people were like, 'Keep going, there will be people that see you," he said. "(They will see) your effort and your drive and take notice and help you."

Jett said after the experience that, "First, I wanted to be a forensic analyst and now I am going to be a detective."

Allison Keller, chief administrative officer of the PGA TOUR, provided welcome remarks at the start of the event.

"You're going to meet people today who can unlock a door for you," she said. "Take the opportunity to ask questions. As you think about what lies ahead, you can know that you don't have to be an athlete to work in sports. You can be a graphic designer, a physical therapist, a computer scientist, you can even work with grass in the field of agronomy."

Jett closed the forum with a few words of wisdom for the students. He reminded them that what they are going to have to learn in their careers can't be taught by speakers. He said although he learned a lot from the panelists, companies and representatives, what, "it didn't teach me was failure."

"Failure is inevitable," he said. "If you continue to let failure hinder your progress, you will not succeed. Take it from me, I have to work a job to help pay for my tuition and every day the first thing I think when I get home is, 'What if I did this better?' But you can't.

"You can't constantly regret," Jett continued. "Regret is something you can't leave yourself with because succeeding is 10 times more. The world never owes you an apology and it doesn't owe you nothing but a place on earth. So, you're going to have to learn to cope."

center will be named Petco Foundation Canine Center in honor of the Foundation's transformative investment.

"We are incredibly grateful and humbled by the Petco Foundation's transformative gift to our program and their continued support of our nation's heroes," Diamond said in the K9s release. "This donation will be the cornerstone of our na-

tional expansion and will be the difference in our ability to carry out our mission of rescuing dogs and training them to be lifesaving service dogs for disabled American veterans."

K9s For Warriors is a nonprofit organization that has become that nation's largest service dog provider for disabled veterans struggling with the invisible wounds of war brought on since 9/11. The VA estimates that 20 veterans die by suicide every day. It is K9s For Warriors' mission to stop veteran suicide and save veterans'

lives by saving the lives of high-kill shelter dogs and training them to mitigate the invisible wounds plaguing American veterans. K9s For Warriors has rescued dogs from Florida, Georgia, Texas, California, the Carolinas and more. In 2018, K9s For Warriors rescued 257 homeless dogs and graduated 122 veteran-canine teams. The Petco Foundation investment will help nationally with rescuing and training more service dogs.

"Saving shelter dogs and transforming them into helping heroes to support our

nation's veterans highlights the true potential of these canines and inspires others to see the incredible capabilities of shelter dogs," said Susanne Kogut, president of the Petco Foundation, in the K9s release. "We are proud to help make K9s for Warriors' national expansion possible all while helping to save more dogs in Texas. We are honored to provide the vital support necessary to assure that more veterans receive a trained canine companion to help them through the challenges they face when they return home to civilian life."

Melissa Nelson is the president and CEO of the United Way of St. Johns County (SJC).

Can you please briefly tell us about your background?

As a professional, I have almost always been in the nonprofit field. I started right after graduating from University of Florida handling public relations for a Chamber of Commerce in Brevard County. Along the way, I took some time off to raise my children, but even then, I was super involved as a volunteer. I've served in this role with United Way of St. Johns County for nearly five years.

How do you explain the efforts of the United Way to those people who are unfamiliar with the organization?

Explaining United Way is tougher than you might think. As the most widely recognized brand in the nonprofit world, it seems surprising. We sum it up by saying that United Way fights for the health, education and financial stability for every person in our community. How do we do this? By building collaborative relationships, actively fundraising, spearheading volunteer efforts and advocating for those who need it the most. There is no other organization that brings together the work of nonprofits, government, individuals and the faith community in the way that only United Way can and does.

What's the most rewarding part about your job?

The most rewarding part of my position is that I can confidently say that not just me, but our entire team staff, board members, volunteers and donors — can feel confident that United Way-SJC is positively impacting thousands of lives in our community. It could be someone you work with, a child in your child's class at school, the elderly neighbor who sits two pews over in church or even a family member. We all need a helping hand sometime.

What are some of the challenges that United Way faces today?

St. Johns County is a rapidly growing community especially from Nocatee and World Golf Village north with much of our population identifying with and working in the Jacksonville metropolitan area. Many are unaware of the challenges in our community and that United Way-SJC is working to address those issues. For example, many are startled to hear that in our own county, we have enough homeless children to fill an entire elementary school. Our goal is to make people more aware of these needs and encourage volunteers and donors to engage right here where we live.

Does your organization have any upcoming events the community might be interested in?

We just wrapped up three very large events, but there is always something on the horizon. Anyone interested in attending a function or getting involved can keep up to date by sharing an email address with us. There is a golf tournament in the works, a ladies' luncheon and so much more. We are busy.

How can people get involved? What opportunities are available?

Every spring, United Way-SJC invites volunteers to partner with us in determining funding for nonprofits. Typically, grants are given to about 30 organizations for 40 to 50 programs. We use volunteers to vet the organizations and programs. It is a great way to learn what we do, who we work with and about community needs. We welcome individuals to the process. In fact, this is the same way I learned about and fell in love with the work of United Way-SJC.



What do you enjoy most about living and working on the First Coast?

For the most part, I am a lifelong resident of Florida's First Coast. I grew up on Amelia Island, and I have lived here in St. Johns County for nearly 20 years. Just crossing the Intracoastal or driving up A1A gives me a sweet

feeling of contentment. It is beautiful here. Knowing that, you won't be surprised to hear that a great day is spent relaxing with my husband of 30 years, Brad, my 21-yearold twins, Max and McKenna, and a good book, while in my beach chair sipping something sparkling.



In this edition of Why I Serve, featuring Wounded Warrior Project, the Recorder sat down with Chet Kevin Crowell, a retired sergeant first class who served as a parachuter in the Army in Panama and Iraq. Crowell received his service dog from K9s For Warriors in 2012.

Why did you serve?

I grew up in a family where I had heard stories of how amazing it was when they served, and I wanted to experience that — being part of that family of people that served. It was kind of selfish in the beginning why I served and then as I got older, the big picture was kind of unveiled about why you're serving. It's historic, it's part of a brotherhood.

What did you learn in the military?

Friends of Ponte Vedra Concert Hall donate patio heaters for venue's new outdoor lounge

Guests visiting the Ponte Vedra Concert Hall will now be able to make year-round use of the facility's new outdoor lounge area, thanks to the addition of three propane patio heaters donated by the Friends of the Ponte Vedra Concert Hall (FOPVCH)

The patio heaters were put into action for the first time Jan. 25, when patrons attending a performance by the band The Outlaws had a chance to enjoy drinks in the outdoor lounge area despite evening temperatures that dipped into the 30s. The 925 square-foot nonsmoking concession space — which features couches and full bar service — was added to the concert hall in 2018 thanks to a \$50,000 fundraising campaign mounted by the nonprofit Friends group. The three patio heaters — complete with propane canisters and refills — are the latest facility upgrade the group has financed.

"The addition of the outdoor lounge has reduced the crowds and wait times in the concert hall's indoor concessions area," FOPVCH President Steve Gard said. "Now, with the addition of the patio heaters, concert hall guests can enjoy the outdoor space all year round."

In addition to funding the construction of the outdoor lounge and other equipment, the Friends group sponsors special performances throughout the year. Many of those performances, Gard noted, include culturally significant events such as opera, children's theatre and holiday performances of Handel's "Messiah" that may not be financially profitable, but are important to the cultural life of the community.

"We're just a group of local residents who value the caliber and quality of artists the concert hall attracts to our community," Gard said. "And by sponsoring performances and funding facility upgrades, we can help bring even biggername artists to Ponte Vedra."

Already, Gard said, the concert hall at-



3 tips to manage kids' birthday party guest lists

Drafting guest lists for children's birthday parties is no small task. Parents may hope to include all the kids in their child's class, only to be met with some difficult decisions due to budgets and space. Parents planning their kids' birthday parties can keep these three tips in mind as they work toward finalizing a guest list.

- 1. Pick the venue first. The size and scope of the party venue can help parents determine just how many children they can invite to the party. An intimate party at home may mean fewer children, while a big party center can comfortably and safely accommodate lots of kids.
- 2. Consider the budget. Determining how much you want to spend on the party can help you decide on the guest list. Children's party centers may charge anywhere from \$10 to \$25 per head. BabyCenter.com found that roughly one-quarter of parents surveyed spend more than \$500 for a child's first birthday. Much like with weddings, one of the easiest ways to cut birthday party costs is to trim the guest list.

3. Focus on the child. Rather than the party being a who's who of guests, let the guest of honor create the guest list. This way the guest lists reflects the child's preferences. If you're concerned kids might add too many names to the guest list, explain in advance that you do not have a limitless budget, so some names may need to be trimmed to accommodate the money available for the party.

The guest list for kids' parties can sometimes be tricky to negotiate. But these three simple strategies can make the task that much simpler.

Respond promptly to invitations to avoid frustration, hurt feelings

It only takes a minute to respond "yes" or "no" to an invitation. According to the etiquette experts at the Emily Post Institute, however, failure to RSVP has become common — no matter if it is a birthday party, dinner party or wedding. The Institute goes on to say that relationships often suffer due to hosts' frustration and hurt feelings.

Hosts await responses so they can determine how much food and beverages to have on hand, and to coordinate other details of the party. When invited guests do not respond, it can lead to emotional and possible financial stress among party hosts.

With the exception of "regrets only" invitations, it is absolutely essential to let hosts know if their invitation will be accepted or not — and to do so within the time frame expressed on the invitation. It may be uncomfortable to say no, but it shows you respect the party host.

- If a phone number is on the invitation, call and personally give a response, as leaving a message can be unreliable.
- Many people now offer texting or email options for responses. It only takes a minute to hit "reply" and give an answer.
- Evites also are popular. Invited guests simply follow the directions laid out in the evite. Remember to follow up promptly with an answer if you initially opt for "maybe."
- Mail back response cards promptly so they arrive by the RSVP.
- Be sure if you receive a "regrets only" invite that you give your regrets if you can't go. If the host doesn't hear from you, your presence is expected.



Mortage forecast

How's the market? That is likely the most common question that anyone in real estate or lending gets.

There are a lot of different ways to take that question. But on the lending side, the basis of that question boils down to a primary focus: What is happening with the rates? As most people are already aware, rates have been on the rise and look to continue down that path. So, the real question ultimately becomes: Did I miss out on good rates? Am I still able to afford mortgage financing? What will happen to me if I continue to wait? Here's the good news for everyone: You definitely haven't missed out on getting historically low interest rates, the impact is likely less than what you think and there are programs to help guard you against this market movement.

Let's start with the rates. While they fluctuate daily, the average 30-year fixed program is still commonly under 5 percent with no points! That is a rise of roughly 0.5 percent from this point a year ago. While thoughts of the bottom of the market and seeing rates fall below 4 percent may cloud our view, being below 5 percent is still a historically low rate.

Let's use this as an example. Think back to when the market collapsed in 2001. Refinances were at an all-time high because the drop-in rates allowed millions of Americans to refinance and take advantage of amazing savings. What was the average interest rate then? 6.92 percent! We're almost 2 percent lower today than the time when the country was in awe over the rates available and couldn't rush into refinance fast enough. All that to say it's still an amazing time to take advantage of the market, even if they do continue to move up.

So, what does the rise in interest rates mean to me and

my potential payments? The answer may surprise you in that you haven't been impacted by as much as you think. To help give perspective, a change of 0.125 percent in the interest rates only moves your payment up \$7.61


per 100,000 in loans. Considering the average loan in the state of Florida is just under 200,000, that means the change in rates over the last year (0.5 percent) only leads to an increase of \$61.52 a month. Not as much as you would think, right? Don't get me wrong, taking advantage of the best rates possible is always the best move financially, but you can rest at ease that the impact is likely less on your monthly budget than you thought.

So, what happens if you continue to wait? Almost all experts consider the rate increases to continue for the foreseeable future. Making the decision to rent for another year, or holding off on refinancing for a while longer, likely means you'll be entering the market at a higher point than what you can get today. I mentioned just before that these changes likely won't preclude you from being able to qualify, but it's certainly beneficial to act now and avoid the extra costs if possible.

In the example below, rates moving up 0.5 percent costs the average person \$61.52 based on a \$200,000 loan amount. While that isn't an insurmountable cost on a monthly basis, it all adds up. That change would mean you're paying \$738.24 more a year and would end up paying \$22,147.20 more over the life of a 30-year loan. Adds up quickly, doesn't it? For those on the fence, it certainly benefits to act sooner than later to take advantage of the rates in as low a point as you possibly can.

What's the best way to keep yourself safe from these changes? As I mentioned above, one way is to make sure you're acting as soon as possible to avoid what most forecast to be a continued climb in rates. Another way is to find a lender that will allow you to protect your interest rates while you're shopping so you're not impacted by market movement.

Aim for the seamless and sophisticated look when choosing a paint color and remember to paint adjacent rooms the same color.



When I was recently asked by an experienced realtor to write an article for homeowners on why home maintenance and inspections are important, I immediately thought of another real estate agent in Ponte Vedra Beach who regularly refers us to her clients but has personally been dealing with a mold claim nightmare.

This agent owns a home that was rented out to a great tenant and few problems ever arose, until one day when a major issue became apparent. A musty smell had encompassed the house and upon further investigation, she found that the hardwood floors had a little bit of water damage. Because much of the home had carpeted rugs, the issue was not immediately noticeable.

She feared a slab leak was to blame and called us out to take a look with an infrared camera. We were immediately able to determine there was not an active slab leak, but found the damage was caused by another source. Unfortunately, a small roof leak that had gone undetected over a period of time turned into a big mess. The leak had entered the wall cavity and continued down to the foundation, causing moisture retention between the concrete and her hardwood floors.

Once the problem was found, an insurance claim was made, and then the real dilemma set in for this homeowner. The claim was denied even though she had used the same carrier for over 12 years and had no other previous claims. This claim is months into litigation and the \$30,000 bill has yet to be settled.

Many small issues like the roof leak we found go unattended due to the fact they are simply unknown until they have developed into a major problem. With annual home maintenance in conjunction to inspections, you can be a proactive homeowner and possibly avoid costly repairs!

As time goes on, parts of your house will wear out, break down, malfunction and then stop working all together. Some of these issues could be preventable. Just as most people maintain their vehicle with regular professional service and annual maintenance, the same should be done routinely on your home.

The top three common areas we find the most issues with on annual inspections are:

- \blacksquare Roofing
- Exterior Walls (especially on stucco)
- HVAC (cooling and heating)

Her Song: Area nonprofit tackles human trafficking head on

As the United States recognizes January as National Slavery and Human Trafficking Prevention Month, a First Coast nonprofit called Her Song is working to interrupt the cycle of human trafficking while leading women to freedom.

According to the nonprofit, human trafficking is a \$150 billion industry, ranking as the second most common criminal activity after the illegal drug trade. Florida is ranked third in the nation for human trafficking, with Duval County ranking as one of the top five hubs for such activity in the state. In this modern-day form of slavery, human trafficking is defined as victims who are subjected to force, fraud or coercion for the purpose of sexual exploitation or forced labor.

Her Song is attempting to break this cycle through survivor care, victim outreach and community awareness. Over the past six years, Her Song has assisted over 500 women away from the life of forced prostitution, physical and psychological torment, drug addiction and unbearable emotional trauma. Freedom Cottage, the residential component of the nonprofit, offers an opportunity for rest, reflection, recovery and transformation.

"A comprehensive care plan is provided for

women not only in residence, but for those incarcerated or living elsewhere," said Rachel White, founder and executive director of Her Song. "Total wraparound services including traumainformed counseling, life coaching, medical care, education, employment opportunities and legal assistance, enable victims to become survivors and productive members of our community."

In conjunction with National Slavery and Human Trafficking Prevention Month, Her Song held a lunch and learn on Jan. 17. Atlantic Beach Mayor Ellen Glasser, a retired special agent in the FBI, presented a proclamation recognizing Her Song for their work in the community and encouraging all citizens, especially families with children, to become educated about human trafficking. Glasser's professional experience in human trafficking added to the information disseminated. Both a survivor in residence and a survivor advocate presented their life stories. Both ladies had a common thread: hope. As now thriving women in the community, they are testimony of the ability to heal and regain one's life again.









The ultimate destination wedding




was crisp and clear. A perfect day.

Marsh Landing home designed for quality, longevity

Residential properties are built for different purposes and therefore reflect a wide range of craftsmanship and durability.

On one end of the spectrum are what the real estate industry characterizes as disposable homes, or ones that an owner expects to replace in a matter of years for another. An example of a disposable home would be one that is created to fulfill a temporary need, such as in response to a change in family economics, or for relocation reasons. This is decidedly different from "forever homes," or one that is built for the long-term with the intent of serving multiple generations. One of the distinctive attributes that underlies the home at 105 Palm Forest is from inception, it was designed and constructed for quality and longevity.


It is important to note that Susie Wiles helped lead the victory of underdog Rick Scott when he first ran for governor and Donald Trump for president as the campaign manager for Florida.



I'm a big believer in making New Year's resolutions that you can actually keep, so this year I am continuing to implement very doable, bite-size changes that will reap big benefits. Never underestimate small changes!

As a personal chef and foodie, I understand that if you are feeling deprived of your favorite foods, it can be one of the biggest "sabotagers" of sticking to a new goal or plan. So. I am a huge fan of "swap outs."

Here are some of my favorite "swaps" that are so easy! Whether you are looking to eat more clean foods, incorporate more veggies or lose a few pounds, these simple changes will go a long way. These are changes that even my husband has made, and trust me, he's not been easy in the vegetable department.

First on the list ... spiralized veggies! Having a spiralizer is great if you have the time, but all the grocery stores sell them pre-spiralized for you, making prep a cinch. So, keep eating your favorite spaghetti and meatballs or shrimp scampi; just swap out the pasta for zucchini noo-

dles or mashed cauliflower potatoes! My husband, who thought he hated zucchini, was blown away when I first made spaghetti and meatballs with my homemade sauce over zucchini noodles. "Zoodles" as I call them, are basically flavorless, yet take on the taste of whatever sauce you pair them with.

The other big swap-out I LOVE is cauliflower. I know: You've all heard of cauliflower rice, cauliflower mashed potatoes, etc. Well, they are actually good! A simple change is to make mashed potatoes, but make them half potatoes and half mashed

cauliflower. You've just slashed a ton of starch and carbs right there. Score!

My favorite, though, because I am a pizza lover and am not willing to give that up, is cauliflower pizza crust. I've always loved a supreme pizza with all the meat and veggies. But hark — angels are singing — a simple swap has turned from a fat trap, belly-bloating nightmare into a fatburning, belly-shrinking favorite again! And we feel zero deprived.

By the way, my husband also thought he hated cauliflower, and as I write this, he is making a cauliflower crust pizza and is down 35 pounds with some of these simple changes starting a year ago. You can make the crust homemade. But for time-saving purposes, I use our favorite brand with minimal, clean ingredients; all of which my body will recognize and deem safe. You can order from Amazon, or purchase at Lucky's Market called "Outer Aisle Gourmet."



(Note: this is equally good with spiral zucchini noodles!)

- 5 cups pre-spiralized sweet potato noodles (produce section)
- 2 boneless, skinless chicken breasts, diced in bite-size pieces
- 1/2 cup creamy peanut butter or almond butter
- 1/4 cup low sodium soy sauce (Tamari or Bragg's Liquid Aminos are best and gluten free)
- 1/4 cup fresh lime juice (about 3 to 4 limes)
- 1 tablespoon unseasoned rice wine vinegar
- 1 tablespoon grated or finely minced ginger (or 1 tablespoon ginger paste in produce section)
- 1-2 cloves garlic, grated or finely minced Dash of fish sauce (optional) found on international aisle under Asian foods
- 1 bunch scallions, diced
- 1/2 cup unsalted peanuts, rough chopped Fresh cilantro, rough chopped

Preheat oven to 375. Line baking sheet with parchment paper or foil. Spread sweet potato noodles out to fill the pan. Roast sweet potato noodles "naked" for 15 minutes.

Next, in a bowl, whisk together the rest of the ingredients except chicken and set aside. While sweet potato noodles are baking, sauté diced chicken in nonstick skillet for five to seven minutes until browned and cooked through, seasoning with salt and pepper to taste.



When noodles and chicken are both done, toss with peanut sauce; then garnish with chopped, unsalted peanuts, fresh scallions and cilantro. Note: If substituting zucchini noodles, omit baking, and sauté for two minutes in nonstick skillet, then set aside and proceed with recipe.

Cauliflower pizza crust is a great way to add veggies, eliminate white flour and bad carbs without sacrificing flavor. Use your cauliflower base crust for any of your favorite pizza toppings.

Greek Cauliflower Crust Pizza

Serves two

- 1 (outer aisle gourmet) cauliflower or any other cauliflower pizza crust
- 2 tablespoons Rao's pizza sauce (found at Publix no added sugar and low carb)

- Fresh mozzarella cheese, grated
- 1/4 cup feta cheese
- Thin sliced red onion
- 4-5 Kalamata olives, halved
- 4-5 cherry tomatoes, halved
- 2-3 pepperoncini Greek peppers, sliced in rings
- Torn baby spinach leaves or fresh torn basil leaves

When pizza is assembled, bake at 400 for seven to eight minutes, or until cheese is bubbly.






It is the start of an ordinary day at Palm Valley Academy in Nocatee.

Students unload from school buses, golf carts and bikes, and enter hallways lined with the art of Rembrandt, Picasso, Haring, Warhol and other great artists. There are 160 mat-to-frame, fine art reproductions filling the common areas of the school, plus colorful, student-created murals featuring uplifting "ARTspirational" messages. This cultural experience was made possible thanks to a generous donation from THE PLAYERS and guidance from the Ponte Vedra Public Education

"When you are a new school, it is a big, blank canvas," said Jessica Richardson, Palm Valley Academy principal. "It is a large place to fill, and you've got to appeal to little kids up on to teenagers. You have to warm things up."

After touring other schools in the months prior to Palm Valley Academy's opening in August 2018, Richardson knew about the art enrichment programs the Ponte Vedra Public Education Foundation had completed in other schools, and she wanted to do the same in her school. Van Housen added, "Our hope is that students will stand in a museum in front of a Monet or a van Gogh and think, 'Hey, we have that at our school!""





No shortage of success for Lady Panthers

Nease girls lead Class 7A in dominating fashion as coach eyes 600th victory

Sherri Anthony is no stranger to winning. The Nease girls basketball coach is closing in on her 600th win in 33 seasons at Nease, and this team may be her best yet.

The Lady Panthers are 23-1 heading into the regular season finale against Seabreeze High School on Friday night, are the No. 1-ranked team in Class 7A, have outscored opponents 1,503-712 and show no signs of slowing down.

The team is loaded with talent, including standout seniors Camille Hobby, Kiya Turner, Tia Robinson and Peyton Carter. It's hard to imagine what could stop this juggernaut, but Anthony doesn't want to look too far ahead.

"We don't know what that moment is going to be until we get there, so we just definitely try to focus on the game at hand and get that done," Anthony said. "Tia [Robinson] said it best, 'If you're worried about the last hurdle but you miss the first one, you're probably not going to get to the last one.' So, you really can't afford to look ahead."

Nease narrowly lost in the Elite Eight

of the 2018 state championships, falling 47-42 to Choctawhatchee High School. Although winning a state title would certainly be a goal for any team, Anthony said in no way would the season be a disappointment if that doesn't happen.

"I am involved with many coaches at many different levels, and I know they would all die to be in the Elite Eight for three years in a row, or to win three district championships," she said. "We won the conference championship last year, people tend to forget all that, and the records, and the fact the kids are doing great academically, or they're going to Division I schools to play basketball. How in the world are you going to be disappointed when you've accomplished all that? There's one team in the state of Florida that's going to win the 7A state championship. Of course, I would like it to be us. But to say that it will be a disappointment if we don't get it. There's no way. I've coached for 33 years, so that would mean 32 years of my life have been disappointing."

The team's success is already confirmed, Anthony said. Her players are flourishing academically, and four will be headed to Division 1 schools after graduation. Hobby signed with NC State, Turner signed with Middle Tennessee State, Carter will play for Davidson (N.C.) College and Robinson

will likely make her decision in the next couple of weeks, Anthony said.

Anthony also wants to make sure the players take time to enjoy what they've accomplished so far, something she's trying to work on herself.

"The biggest thing I think I've had to fight over the years with myself, as well as with the kids, is that as soon as you win a big game, or any game, you think OK, 'Who's next and what do I have to do to prepare,' and then you forget to enjoy what you just did," she said. "And I hate that because I don't want them to be so worried about the next one that they forget what happened last night and what a great game they played."

And they've played a lot of great games. Turner is working on her 1,500th point of her high school career, while Hobby and Robinson have over 1,000 points each. Not bad considering this season, the starters often weren't even able to play all four quarters because of the number of blowouts Nease has had.

Anthony said in some way that hurts her star players when it comes to postseason accolades or All-Star rosters, because she doesn't want to run up the score. But she also wants to make sure her players get the credit they deserve.

"Sometimes it's hard as a coach to



know what to do," Anthony said. 
