

The Ponte Vedra Beach Coalition hosted two representatives of GATE Petroleum to answer community questions on behalf of the Outpost development on Monday, July 29. Afterward, the Coalition welcomed Doug Bataille as new Director of St. Johns County Parks and Recreation.

The Q & A session comes two weeks before the Aug. 15 meeting with the Planning and Zoning Agency to portions of the Outpost uplands to be changed from Conservation to Residential A.

The proposed development site for Vista Tranquila is located at the end of Neck Road and is approximately 100 acres within the Guana Tolomato Matanzas National Estuarine Research Reserve. Attendees of the meeting were concerned about possible traffic increases, pedestrian safety and damage to the surrounding wetlands. Ellen Avery-Smith, an attorney representing GATE Petroleum from Rogers Towers, and Kim Allerton, an environmental

scientist associated with Environmental Resource Solutions, responded to community concerns.

Regarding the upcoming PZA hearing, Avery-Smith said multiple environmental agencies have reviewed the property, including scientists under the county's jurisdiction.

"The county has independent environmental staff that are professional

environmental scientists who have verified that there are no significant habitats on the property," said Avery-Smith.

According to a recent statement by environmental division manager Jan Brewer, although it is factual that the habitats outlined in the County Comprehensive Plan Policy provisions of imperiled habitats provided by Florida Natural Areas Inventory were verified to not be on the property

#### Zoning Commission to consider hearing for Vista Tranquila

On August 15, the St. Johns County Planning and Zoning Commission is scheduled to consider the transmittal hearing for Vista Tranquila, the development proposed by the Ponte Vedra Corporation at the Outpost. This is a request for a Comprehensive Plan Amendment to amend the county's Future Land Use Map from Conservation to both Residential-A and Conservation. The PVC has submitted a companion PUD application that will be heard concurrently at adoption hearings for this amendment. After the meeting, the Planning and Zoning Agency will make recommendations to the Board of County Commissioners on Comprehensive Plan Amendment requests.

#### Public hearings scheduled regarding The Outpost

Now is the time to rally together, speak your mind and save The Outpost, a 30-year protected conservation land of 100 acres.

Now is the time to let your voice be heard in emails to county officials. Now is the time to attend the two public hearings on Aug. 15 and Sept. 17. Your attendance is key to the outcome of the hearings. The hearings will take place in the St. Johns County Auditorium County Administration Building, 500 San Sebastian View in St. Augustine. The Aug. 15 hearing begins at 1:30 p.m.

Ponte Vedra Corporation, a subsidiary of Gate Petroleum, wants to change the conservation land to residential and build 66 homes on 1-acre properties over a10-year period.

This land is a wildlife treasure that borders Guana Lake for one mile and is almost entirely surrounded by the Guana Tolomato Matanzas Estuarine Research Reserve (GTMNERR), the only national estuarine research reserve on the east coast of Florida. Development would cause 74 upland acres of the Outpost to be decimated, including the closed canopy hammock that is rare on Florida's coastline. The fertilizer and pesticide run-off will have a negative impact on the water quality of Guana Lake.

The 10-year construction project will most certainly have devastating consequences for migratory and native birds as well as the wildlife. Over a dozen protected animal species are known to exist in the vicinity of the Outpost.

Wild Florida is diminishing day by day. Now is the time for nature-lovers, birders, hikers, kayakers and anglers to join forces and save The Outpost. Now is the time to gather family and friends and get the word out: It's now or never. Save Guana Now is a nonprofit organization. Visit the website for details on sending emails and attending hearings.

Time flies by faster than the wings of hummingbirds. Please, rise to the occasion and attend these meetings. Join together with those of us who want to Save Guana Now and ensure that this exquisite conservation land, Guana Lake and the GTMNERR will be here for generations to come. Maybe forever!

#### Volunteers needed for St. Johns County Sea Turtle and Beach Steward program

St. Johns County is seeking volunteers to survey wrack lines to recover stranded washback sea turtles and conduct beach cleanups from August through November. Volunteers will be scheduled for bi-weekly beach cleanups, and will remain on call to survey wrack lines when needed. All volunteers assisting the Beach Steward Sea Turtle Washback Program must follow the steps as outlined in the volunteer webpage at www. sjcfl.us/HCP/VolunteerWashback.aspx. This page includes required training information and a County volunteer application. Volunteers must also pass a background check, possess a valid Florida driver license, complete the online orientation session, and attend one mandatory survey training that is conducted on the beach. Trainings are scheduled for the following dates and locations, and pre-registration is not required:

- Aug. 17, 8 to 9 a.m. at Butler Beachfront Park, 5860 A1A South.
- Aug. 19, 5:30 to 6:30 p.m. at South Ponte Vedra Recreation Area, 2993 S. Ponte Vedra Blvd.

Children under the age of 18 are welcome to volunteer, but they must be accompanied by an adult or guardian. For more

#### Local church to hold annual paper-shredding event

Local Ponte Vedra Beach church, Lord of Life Lutheran Church, will host its second annual shredding fundraiser in the parking lot of the church located at 276 Roscoe Blvd North. Residents can get a head start on fall cleaning by tossing out old, sensitive papers at a community paper shredding event from 9 a.m. to noon, Aug. 17.

Award-winning secure destruction company Iron Mountain will be on site with a truck. Residents simply drive in and get help from church members unloading their papers into a bin. Then they can watch the bin move up to be dumped inside the truck and see the shredding in action on a small computer monitor on the side of the truck. Done!

"We held our first event last November and everyone who came that day commented on how useful this was and much needed," Cindy Tanton, church council president, said. "We had a steady stream of cars coming in and people got a kick out of seeing the computer monitor to know that their papers were securely shredded."

With the threat of identity theft growing, paper shredding events are one way to get rid of important papers securely.

Suggested for shredding are outdated tax records, medical statements, utility bills, credit card statements, old passports and employment records. According to the public policy think tank Privacy and American Business, 1 in 5 Americans identify themselves as a victim of identity theft.

The church is asking for a \$25 dona-

tion for this service per car/persons dropping off paper. The funds raised will go towards the church Building Campaign Fund and a local charity. The church has received its approvals locally to move forward with building a new sanctuary and the next step will be to survey the intended spot once more and then start on pouring the concrete foundation.

— Avery-Smith's statement is broadly defined. "So, the County the term 'Significant Natural Communities Habitat' has a very narrow, specific definition and one not to be interpreted to mean the property being reviewed has no viable or significant attributes," Brewer said.

The inventory includes six habits; beach dunes, coastal grasslands/ coastal strand, xeric hammock, maritime hammock, sandhill and scrub. The majority habitat found on the property was "mesic hammock."

A few residents brought up possible traffic problems including concern that the area already suffers from congestion and the added homes could cause extra crowding. In addition, some residents felt Neck Road to be hazardous for pedestrians because area doesn't have sidewalks and thought there was a fire risk due to the congestion and surrounding vegetation.

In response, GATE said they were looking to improve traffic conditions with the help of their traffic engineer. The proposal would be to add left turn lanes going westbound on Micklers Road and another turn lane improvement eastbound. Avery-Smith also suggested that some residents weren't in agreement for a sidewalk, preventing one being built. Concerning fire risks and emergency access, Avery-Smith said Vista Tranquila will be up to code.

"This PUD for fire protection is within its terms," said Avery-Smith. "All of these homes have to be built for specific codes to withstand fire. They also have to keep the vegetation trimmed within their yards and not the upland buffers which have been provided, those are going to remain in their natural state."

Along with the Q & A session, the Coalition meeting also hosted guest speaker Doug Bataille, the recently appointed director of St. Johns County Parks and Recreation. Bataille was previously the director at Knox County Parks and Recreation in Tennessee. He spoke to the audience about a few of his plans for the department and answered questions. Bataille said maintenance, long-term goals and new modes of funding for parks were objectives he was working toward.

"One thing I noticed was a lot of our ball parks were really, really nice, kept at a really high level," Bataille said. "Some of the beach access points and boat access points, not so much. That is part of our restructuring and maintenance (to) put more resources toward those facilities so it will help them level up a bit."

Bataille has freed up some services Parks and Recreation has previously provided, like "taking care of right of ways," which he now contracts out. "It's allowed us to focus on our efforts a little more on the parks side of things," he said.

In addition, he developed a "five-year plan" which he hopes will prioritize a few projects when funding becomes available.

Lastly, Bataille said he is working toward creating a "park foundation" which will help subsidize the department's budget with donations.

"In Knox county in 10 years we were able to raise \$6 million for the system," Bataille said. "A lot of time folks with resources like helping out the community. The foundation is a vehicle that they can donate to and have the insurance to have third-party oversight."

Brett Simon, a founder of K9s For Warriors, currently serves as the organization's president. When he's not working with canines, he might be found on the golf course or out fishing. He caught the love of his life in Ponte Vedra and has called Florida home ever since.

#### What can you share about your background?

Brett Simon

I was born and raised in Cincinnati, Ohio. I am a graduate of Purcell Marian High School where I played on the football team, wrestling team and golf team. Cincinnati will always be home to me, but I hate snow and traded snow for the Florida sun.

#### Where did you work in law enforcement?

I was a police officer in the City of Milford, Ohio and Miami Township, Ohio for nearly 14 years.

#### Did you request the K9 unit or were you assigned that duty?


I requested to be on the K9 unit. It took a few years, but I finally made it and worked three different dogs over a 10-year period.

#### How do you spot a puppy that may be suited for working and then how do you determine the best "job" for the dog?

Finding the right dog for the right job takes a lot of ability to the read the dog's body language. If you know what cues to look for, dogs show their temperament. When we are out looking for a dog for a veteran at a shelter or rescue, we spend time evaluating each one. I am looking for a dog that wants to engage with a person and shows confident behavior — not being shy or hanging back — one that's not reluctant to come meet me. I am also looking for a dog that has a medium play drive, wanting to play catch or fetch, but not bouncing off the walls. While playing with toys, I watch for possessive behavior, whether it's trying to tear up the toy or if the dog is afraid of running on different types of floors or surfaces. You can learn so much just observing a dog and determining what the dog is communicating. It just takes time and experience to know what the dog is trying to tell you.

#### How does a human learn to be a dog trainer?

There are several national dog training academies in the U.S. to learn how to become a trainer. The training programs vary from just learning to teach obedience all the way to becoming what some call a master trainer — learning to work with service dogs, law enforcement or search and rescue. It is up the individual how far to take the training. There is always on-the-job training, and there are a several



great trainers in our area. Some will take on an apprentice and teach individually. There are hundreds of books and videos to learn from as well, but nothing beats getting as much experience as possible. The more dogs you work with, the more knowledge you gain.

#### Tell us about your time at K9s For Warriors.

Through my career from founding K9s For Warriors to today there have been so many amazing moments. It never gets old watching a veteran getting paired with a dog or seeing a family back together again with the assistance of a service dog that we trained. I wish I could pick just one to share but that would not be fair. The starting of K9s For Warriors, to me, was one of the most poignant and memorable moments in

my life. How much better does it get when you are saving two lives, the life of a veteran and the life of a rescue/shelter dog.

#### What brought you to Florida?

My mom had moved to Ponte Vedra in 1988 from Cincinnati, Ohio. I would visit often and loved the area. When I returned from Iraq at the end of 2005, our travel plans got mixed up and instead of being flown to the D.C. area on our way back, we landed at Hunter Army Airfield in Savannah, Georgia. We were all quite shocked to say the least, and they told us it was going to take a few days for the Army to set up new travel plans.

I called my mom and told her I was going to rent a car and drive down to see her. While I was visiting her, I met my future wife. After meeting her and then getting out-processed, I packed up everything I had in Ohio and moved to Ponte Vedra to be with her.

#### What is your favorite part of living in Ponte Vedra?

Ponte Vedra is just a beautiful area. There is so much to do from going to our beautiful beaches, golfing, fishing and great variety of dining. There is something for everyone.

#### What do you like to do in your free time?

I enjoy golf and fishing, bike riding and spending time with my family.

#### What is your hidden talent?

Grilling. I love to grill everything and create recipes and seasonings.



# Local high school students accepted into national leadership program for their community efforts

What is it to be community-minded? Picking up trash and attending community forums to be better informed about local issues are ways residents can contribute to making neighborhoods thrive. These not-so-small acts represent the physical manifestations of what community-mindedness is. Learning to see the world around you as an extension of yourself and to feel responsible for it — that's what it is to be community-minded.

While some feel at home inside fences, others see their home in a much broader sense.

Local students Chase Magnano and Catherine Culliton want to make their broader home a better place. Recently, they were selected to participate in Bank of America's Student Leaders program for their success with community leadership in St. Johns County. The program sponsors them in an eight-week internship and leadership summit in Washington, D.C. to meet members of Congress, fellow student leaders and learn about diversity and nonprofit work.

Both students were selected because of their work founding civic programs. Magnano started the nonprofit, JaxTHRIVE in 2017, which helps empower refu-

gee students, and Culliton founded Club ARC, which promotes acceptance of individuals with intellectual disabilities.

Magnano was inspired after volunteering with World Relief Jacksonville. After he found out the organization was closing from lack of funding, he set out to make his own peer-facilitated organization to help refugee students with English, math and cultural integration. In a little over a year, he raised \$50,000 through grants and donations.

Culliton's inspiration was closer to home. She founded and currently acts as president of Club ARC at Ponte Vedra High School after seeing how the ARC Village of Jacksonville independent living community benefited her brother, Robbie. Being a regular visitor, she wanted to help her classmates become more accepting and dispel myths associated with those living with intellectual disabilities.

In between their high school responsibilities, both students, aged 17, were able to create real positive change in their community, earning them eligibility in the Bank of America Student Leaders leadership training course.

In addition, we will provide ongoing mental health support for our students through specialized training, programs and resources. This year, we will be piloting an evidence-based program, Sources of Strength, at our high schools. SOS is a best practice youth suicide prevention program designed to harness the power of peer social networks to change unhealthy norms and culture, ultimately preventing suicide, bullying and substance abuse. As a district, we are committed to making resources available to students and families who need assistance.

I am so grateful to have the opportunity to serve as superintendent of the St. Johns County School District. I cannot thank you enough as parents and families in our district who help us further exceptional learning and support initiatives that take place within the classrooms and throughout our schools. #### Good computer ergonomics benefit young students

Poorly configured computer workstations can cause long-term harmful physical effects

of America's 30 million elementary school students use computers, according to a recent New York Times article. As a result of this increased usage, health care professionals are treating more

young patients suffering from the effects of working at computer stations that are either designed for adults or poorly designed for children. Many children are already suffering from repetitive motion injuries such as carpal tunnel syndrome and chronic pain in the hands, back, neck and shoulders.

A recently published study conducted by a team of researchers from Cornell University found that 40% of the elementary school children they studied used computer workstations that put them at postural risk. The remaining 60% scored

in a range indicating "some concern." It was pointed out that there needs to be an emphasis placed on teaching children how to properly use computer workstations. In addition, poor work habits and computer workstations that don't fit a child's body during the developing years can have harmful physical effects that can last a lifetime. Parents need to be just as concerned about their children's interactions with computer workstations as they are with any activities that may affect their children's long-term health.

What can you do?

To reduce the possibility of a child suffering painful and possibly disabling injuries, health care professional have developed some tips.

If children and adults in share the same computer workstation, make certain the workstation can be modified for each child's use.

Position the computer monitor so the top of the screen is at or below the child's



The eight-week internship took place at Woodland Acres Elementary school, where they mentored students after school. The elementary is in the Arlington area where many students come from low-income households.

"Both of us come from strong families that always push us to be the best we can," Culliton said. "We saw that not all these kids were having like the same opportunity. It (was) our job to take a role of a mentoring position and help make a change in their lives. I think we both became very connected with the students — more so than we ever thought."

Cullion and Magnano worked with the students not only on subjects like reading comprehension and math, but also on life skills like advocating to speak on their own behalf or how to give a proper handshake.

Magnano said he learned there were some similarities between his work with underprivileged students and refugees.

"When you're really high energy and being really positive and excited with them, that's a completely 100% critical skill when working with anyone, but especially refugees," he said. "To bring the same dynamic to these kids really excites them like regardless of how familiar they are with (the subject matter). Hey, we're doing math and it's the summer, but you know, we're gonna have fun doing it and it's going to be a good time."

Culliton said that there wasn't a "huge difference" between working with children with special needs and the students of Woodland Acres. She said that just being able to "connect with people" was universally helpful when being in a mentor role. "They're all kids," she said.

During their visit to D.C., Magnano and Culliton were in their element. Surrounded by hundreds of other community-minded young people, the students made fast friendships that helped them foster their own philanthropic efforts and support their friend's causes.

Magnano and Culliton have come back to Ponte Vedra with renewed passion for JaxTHRIVE and Club ARC. They are Facetiming their new friends from around the county and visiting prospective colleges. Thanks to the invaluable skills they learned with hands-on community work and training in D.C., they're both excited to take on the world.

eye level. This can be accomplished by taking the computer off its base or stand, or having the child sit on firm pillows or phone books to reach the desired height.

Make sure the chair at the workstation fits the child correctly. An ergonomic back cushion, pillow or a rolled-up towel can be placed in the small of the child's back for added back support. There should be 2 inches between the front edge of the seat and the back of the knees. The chair should have arm supports so that elbows are resting within a 70- to 135-de-

gree angle to the computer keyboard.

Wrists should be held in a neutral position while typing — not angled up or down. The mousing surface should be close to the keyboard so a child doesn't have to reach or hold the arm away from the body.

The child's knees should be positioned at an approximate 90- to 120-degree angle. To accomplish this angle, feet can be placed on a foot rest, box, stool or similar object.

Reduce eyestrain by making sure there is adequate lighting and that there is no glare on the monitor screen. Use an antiglare screen if necessary.

Limit each child's time at the computer

and make sure he or she takes periodic stretch breaks during computing time. Stretches can include clenching hands into fists and moving them in 10 circles inward and 10 circles outward; placing hands in a praying position and squeezing them together for 10 seconds and then pointing them downward and squeezing them together for 10 seconds; spreading fingers apart and then closing them one by one; standing and wrapping arms around the body and turning all the way to the left and then all the way to the right.

Children's muscles need adequate hydration to function properly and avoid injury. Encourage children to drink four 8-ounce glasses of water a day. Carbonated beverages, juices and other sweet drinks are not a substitute.

Urge the child's school or PTA officials to provide education about correct computer ergonomics and to install ergonomically correct workstations.

If a child continues to complain of pain and strain from sitting at a computer, it is important to seek the advice of a health care professional in order to alleviate pain and help prevent further injury.

#### Back-to-school sports: Parents' commonly asked questions

Sports medicine surgeon Jeremy Rush, M.D., evens the playing field for your young athlete by answering the most common back-toschool questions he gets from parents.

I'm really worried about concussions. What are the signs and how can I make our son tell us if he thinks he has one? He doesn't want to miss playing time.

"There's a misconception that you have to get knocked-out to have a concussion - that's not the case. Signs of a concussion may include dizziness, headaches, confusion, memory issues, and sensitivity to light and noise. Kids are most honest about what happened to them right after the event occurred – they'll usually say something like they got their 'bell rung.' But kids are kids, and many will say they're OK and want to get back in the game. If an athlete has suffered a concussion, they can't return to playing until they are completed healed and their symptoms are gone, otherwise they are at risk for an additional injury. That's why sideline assessment and recognition of symptoms by coaches and trainers – and as well as parents – is so critical."

Both my sons and now my daughter play soccer. My boys have never gotten hurt. Can I hope the same for my daughter?

"Girls are actually at a higher risk of some knee injuries, including ACL tears, than boys. Soccer, basketball, and gymnastics have the highest risk. A lot of it has to do with a woman's physical structure, anatomy and muscle strength. Women also jump and land differently than men and this puts increased strain on the ACL. Warming up is especially important for women athletes. There are also new studies using neuromuscular training techniques that have shown to decrease the injury rate in women."

#### How can I help prevent injuries to my child?

"Unfortunately, children and teens are more susceptible to injury because they're growing. An adult twists an ankle and they get a sprain. A young athlete twists an ankle and could fracture a growth plate, because that growth plate is weaker than fully-developed bone. So, to help prevent injuries:

- Get a pre-participation or sports physical
- Participate in conditioning programs before playing the actual sport
- Have the correct and correct fitting protective gear for the sport
- Warm up before playing

■ Know all the rules to the sport and obey all the rules

My son plays baseball practically yearround. Could he "burnout?" What can I

"Burnout is definitely a big issue in youth sports. Kids today have increased pressure to participate at a high level, to specialize in one sport early, and to play year-round, often on multiple teams. This increased emphasis on sports specialization has also led to more overuse injuries. We recommend taking one month off a sport for every three to four months it's played. Make sure your child is getting good nutrition and plenty of sleep. Keeping workouts and practices interesting and fun is also important."

My daughter's in middle school. They want her to just concentrate on basketball. Should she specialize in one sport? Does it matter what age she is?

"Single-sport specialization is becoming more and more common at earlier ages. There's a perception that specialization will lead to greater success at the next level. That's not always the case though. In collegiate sports, a majority of the athletes played more than one sport in high school. At a recent NFL combine – where college players look to impress pro teams – 87 per-

cent of the athletes played multiple sports in high school. There's a lot to be said for being a well-rounded athlete. If there is pressure to specialize – wait as long as possible."

#### What exactly makes up sports medicine?

"Sports medicine deals with the treatment and prevention of injuries and illnesses that relate to sports and exercise. It ranges from surgeries for things like ACL tears and shoulder injuries to non-operative treatment for concussions, heat illness and eating disorders. The great thing about sports medicine is you have surgeons and non-operative physicians working hand in hand with athletic trainers, physical therapists, and nutritionists to keep athletes healthy and get them back on the field."


What are the benefits in seeing a sports medicine doctor who specializes in pediatrics?

# Local distillery seeks Spirits Tax Cut Bill Support on Capitol Hill

St. Augustine Distillery meets with Rep. Rutherford to discuss issues impacting small craft distillers

St. Augustine Distillery was one of more than 150 craft distillers from around the country that gathered in Washington, D.C., July 22 through 24 for the distilled spirits industry's 10th annual Public Policy Conference, cohosted by the Distilled Spirits Council of the United States and the American Craft Spirits Association.

The conference featured a series of legislative and regulatory sessions on key federal and state issues impacting the distilling industry. As part of the conference, St. Augustine Distillery CEO Philip McDaniel, together with owners of Winter Park and Marlin & Barrel Distilleries, and a representative of Bacardi Inc., participated in two days of congressional office and state senate visits. Meetings included Congressional Members John Rutherford, Lois Frankel and Donna Shalala along with staff from eight other members to urge support for the Craft Beverage Modernization and Tax Reform Act (H.R. 1175/S. 362). This critical legislation makes permanent a federal excise tax cut on

distilled spirits enacted in 2017. Without Congressional approval, the tax cut for distillers will expire Dec. 31.

The group also discussed the harm that retaliatory tariffs on spirits exports are having on American distillers, large and small, and the importance of their distilleries to the economic development of the surrounding community.

"Meeting with the members and their staff was the highlight of the conference," McDaniel said. "I expressed to them the importance of making the tax cut on distilled spirits permanent. The reduced tax rate has had a major impact on our dis-

tillery enabling us to buy new equipment, hire more staff, offer an employee health plan and buy more local agriculture. It was impactful to share with each member how this bill will continue to help our small distillery grow, as well as the devastating impact on our business if it does not pass."

Conference speakers included Senator Ron Wyden (D-OR), cosponsor of the Craft Beverage Modernization and Tax Reform Act (S.362); Senator Rob Portman (R-OH); Senator Jon Tester (D-MT); Alcohol Tax and Trade Bureau officials; and Carl Hulse, New York Times chief Washington correspondent.

"This is a historic moment for our industry as more than 150 distillers from 33 states descend on Washington to rally further support for this critical, urgent legislation," said Margie A.S. Lehrman, CEO, American Craft Spirits Association. "Without permanent and immediate Federal Excise Tax reform, the stability of this vibrant industry, and the industries that surround us – agriculture, tourism and the broader hospitality industry – are bound to be paralyzed."

"These distillers delivered a unified message to legislative leaders on Capitol Hill at a critical time," said Chris Swonger, President and CEO of the Distilled Spirits Council of the United States, the national trade association representing producers of distilled spirits sold in the United States. "The federal tax cut on spirits is set to expire at the end of the year and the negative impacts of the retaliatory tariffs against U.S. spirits products are mounting."

Distillers who attended the conference also had opportunities to showcase their craft spirits at a "Meet America's Distillers" reception on Capitol Hill for lawmakers and a "Spirits of America" reception for journalists at the National Press Club.



## Florida Chamber Music Project opens 7th season at Ponte Vedra Concert Hall

The Florida Chamber Music Project recently announced performance dates at the Ponte Vedra Concert Hall. The FCMP will kick off its seventh season on Sunday, Sept. 15 with Johannes Brahms String Quartet Number 3, Opus 67.

Artistic Director Susan Pardue believes the upcoming season will be especially unique because of the pairings of known composers with music that may be new to the audience. "I'm excited about the pairings," she said. "When I hear music I find intriguing I always check to see if the composer has written a quartet."

The Sept. 15 concert features a Brahms String Quartet No. 3, Opus 67. This monumental piece of music, just one of three quartets composed by Brahms, is paired with Arturo Marquez' Homenaje a Gismonti. Marquez often uses sounds and styles from his native Mexico in his work.

The Nov. 3 concert is a reunion of sorts for Artistic Director Pardue. Her classmate from North Carolina School of the Arts,

The Feb. 23 concert will pair Mozart's String Quartet in d minor, k 421 with Mendelssohn's String Quartet Opus 44, No. 3. The two pieces have some commonalities.

Interestingly the two composers could not have more different upbringings. Mozart's family had financial issues and Mendelssohn had a privileged childhood where his parent retained an orchestra so he could practice with them.

The March 15 concert will be a celebration. It's the 250th birthday of Beethoven and 100 years since women in the U.S. got the vote. FCMP will be playing Caroline Shaw's Blueprint. It will be the first piece from a female composer played by the group. Shaw is a New York-based violinist and vocalist who won the Pulitzer Prize for Music in 2013. Also part of this concert is Haydn's String Quartet in G Major, Opus 76, No. 1 and Beethoven's String Quartet Opus 18, No. 6.

The end of the season is May 17 featuring Michal Torke's Corner in Manhattan which highlights the sounds of different corners in Manhattan at different times of the day. The concert closes with Robert Schumann's String Quartet in A Major, Opus 41, a favorite of FCMP.

"I want our audience to feel the music's magnetism like the musicians do," said Pardue. "For us, we can't live without the

#### A look at the Jaguars All-25

The Recorder continues looking back at the past 25 years of the National Football League's Jacksonville Jaguars.

The Jags may have their ups and downs, but it's pretty safe to say that without the franchise, Jacksonville wouldn't be the grimy and ruthless, yet optimistic and loyal city it is today. The franchise was born in 1994. The Jaguars All-25 is a recognition of the top 25 inactive players in franchise history. Here's a look at five of the players who were honored throughout July. Look for 21-25 in last week's sports section, and for more outstanding Jags in coming weeks.

#### **CB Aaron Beasley (1996-01)** CB Aaron Beas-



lev was the Jags' third-round pick in the 1996 NFL draft. He totaled 278 tackles 15 interceptions and four defensive touch-

downs in his six seasons with the team. Beasley also led the NFL in interception yards and touchdowns in the 1999 season and is tied for the second-most interceptions in a season in franchise history with six interceptions



LB Mike Peterson was selected by the Indianapolis Colts in 1999 and joined the Jaguars franchise in 2003. In 2005, he led the team in total tackles (132) and was named



a second-team All-Pro selection. Peterson had 837 total tackles in his career with his six seasons as a Jag, making him fourth in all-time franchise history.

#### (2003-10) OL Vince Manuwai



Manuwai was selected by the Jags in the 2003 NFL Draft in the third round and out of his five seasons with the franchise, he only missed one game. Manuwai helped the Jaguars rush for 2,541 yards in 2006 and 2,391 yards in 2007.

#### **LB Kyle Brady (1999-06)**

Brady was originally drafted in the 1995 NFL Draft by the New York Jets. He played for eight years with the Jaguars and totaled 13 TD while with the franchise. He has a total of 25 TDs. 343 receptions and 3,519 receiving yards throughout his NFL career.



#### S Donovin Darius (1998-06)



**Donovin Darius** 

Selected in the 1998 NFL Draft by the Jacksonville Jaguars, Donovin Darius starred in all 116 games in his Jaguar career through 2006. He totaled 858 career tackles, recovered six fumbles and forced seven on the opposing team. Darius also led the team in 2004 with five interceptions.






