



Ponte Vedra Recorder icon a blast from the past



Christ Episcopal Church parishioners and clergy toured the first floor of their new Formation and Arts Building under construction Sunday.

Slated to be completed in February, the 19,800-sq. ft. two-story building, on the campus at 400 San Juan Drive in Ponte Vedra Beach, will become a hub of activity through the week as well as on Sundays. Its meeting rooms and hospitality features will be offered for use by community groups as well as by the church's active parish. Its rooms will include Sunday school classrooms, various size rooms, small group areas and practice and performance spaces.

A 40-ft. wide garden walkway will span the length of the campus leading into the main courtyard.

"This is going to be great, with all the rooms, because we are growing," longtime parishioner Barbara Bartels said as she walked through the construction area after the 9 a.m. service.

"They've done an excellent job of making it multifunctional," said her husband, Gene Bartels. "Part of the purpose is to make it not only for church membership, but for the community at large."

The Rector, Rev. Tom Reeder, said he was pleased with what he saw. "I think it's fantastic," he said. "It will go a long way to complete our mission of transforming lives through the love of

Local Democrats protest for impeachment in Nocatee

About 30 Democrats gathered at Nocatee Town Center Oct. 17 to hold up signs supporting impeachment proceedings against President Trump.

Rallying through social media and email, they met in front of Chase Bank on Nocatee Parkway at 11 a.m. and lined up along the road, some with signs urging passersby to honk if they agreed with them. They planned to stay for several hours.

"I'll be here every day," said Mary Luke of Nocatee. "Because it just may take the support of the people to support Congress in their findings, and that he needs to be impeached."

Erica Connor, President of the Ponte Vedra Democratic Club, was among the group, bringing club members with her. She said she has lived in St. Johns County since 2014, and since 2016, has seen her club grow. "I've definitely seen more folks who identify as liberal, or identify on the left side of the spectrum, come out and identify themselves," she said.

In 2011, Connor said St. Johns County was so heavily Republican that it appeared the Ponte Vedra Democratic Club might fold." Now, it's thriving," she said. "It's been really exciting to see."

Rick Loochtan of Nocatee said he was out there holding up a sign to exercise his first amendment rights. He doesn't support the president's stance on immigration, or "foreign policy that is administered unilaterally by tweet," adding, "this area has been red for a long time. But there is a growing and rising group of people who believe our democracy is imperiled. We are anxious for government to return to sanity, honesty and fairness."

President Trump "is absolutely incompetent," Luke said. "I figured I'd get some honks with this sign, and I am getting some honks."

Trump club marches in downtown St. Augustine

In all, about 40 people turned out Oct. 17 at the Castillo de San Marcos in St. Augustine to join a march to support President Trump. Several groups around the country held local marches for those who could not travel to Washington, D.C. for the main event that marched from Freedom Plaza to the U.S. Capitol.

"It was kind of like a little litmus test to see how President Trump is doing three years into his presidency in a town that is so heavily Democrat," said Diane Scherf, president of the Trump Club of St. Johns County who organized the local march. She said the response from onlookers was about 85% positive — this time. She said in 2016, Trump supporters would get lots of nasty looks and "the finger," so marchers were unsure what to expect at Friday's march.

"I was surprised at the outpouring of support of drivers, people on trolleys and also people joined us," one of the marchers, Mary Robbie, said. "I am amazed at support that is out there for President Trump."

The main message of the local march was to simply thank the President, said Scherf, who had "Thank you, President Trump" signs printed for participants to carry.

"That's all I was trying to accomplish," Scherf said. "We support you and appreciate the job you are doing for the country as a whole."

According to Scherf, the Trump Club of St. Johns County is not chartered under the SJC Republican Party. The nonpartisan club, started in 2017, currently has about 200 members and nearly 5,000 newsletter subscribers. In addition to Republicans, there are also independents and Democrats who are members. Robbie said the group is made up of a wide spectrum of people from teenagers to octogenarians — and lots of women.

Jon and Jessica Pettry began bringing their son, James, to the Lord of Life Lutheran Church pumpkin patch when he was an infant. So, of course they brought their 2-and-a-half-year-old son back this year. They arrived Oct. 16, shortly after opening day, when they were sure to have an expansive choice of hundreds of pumpkins of all shapes and sizes.

As they helped James pick out the perfect one, they snapped lots of pictures. Just like most of the other customers there.

"We live right around the corner, and it's nice that it raises money for the church," Jessica Pettry said.

This year marks the 20th annual Pumpkin Patch Fundraiser for the church at 276 N. Roscoe Blvd. It opened Oct. 14 and runs through Oct. 31. It is open Monday

through Friday from 2 p.m. to dusk; Saturday 9 a.m. to dusk; and Sunday 11 a.m. to dusk.

Kellie Guthrie of Nocatee and her friend Sarah Hueber of Ponte Vedra Beach shopped for pumpkins together the same day as the Pettrys. Guthrie brought her 8-month-old daughter, Tinsley, and Hueber brought her 11-month-old son, Jackson. They placed the babies in a wagon next to a haystack for photos.

"They are boyfriend and girlfriend as of right now, until they decide otherwise," Hueber said with a smile.

Getting pumpkins from a pumpkin patch makes it an adventure, Guthrie said. "It's a fun, special time we can celebrate as a family. We love picking out pumpkins with family and friends. Just being outdoors. It's something we can plan together to celebrate the fall."

Fall fundraising at the 'pumpkin church'

Parishioners don't mind at all that First United Methodist Church at 118 King Street in St. Augustine is known as the "pumpkin church." Each year near the beginning of October a full semi-truck of pumpkins is unloaded and artfully displayed on the lawn. This year, volunteers unloaded 2,512 pumpkins.

It's a fundraiser for the church's children's programs and youth ministry.

"Funds are split between the two and makes up the majority of the budget — at least 80%," Jayce Ginn, youth director, said. "The fundraiser supports Sunday night dinners, mission trips, community service

projects, trunk or treat events and vacation Bible school, among others."

The church orders the fall squash from Pumpkins USA, a company that started with one patch in North Carolina supplying pumpkins to one church. The idea caught on and business was expanding until Hurricane Hugo destroyed a crop. The company moved farming operations to a Navajo Indian Reservation in New Mexico, a region with 42% unemployment. The 1,200-acre farm employs more than 700 Native Americans and supplies pumpkins to more than 1,000 organizations for fundraising projects.

"We usually sell out near the end of the month," Ginn said. "We're on track to sell out; maybe a little faster than usual."

"It's a fantastic event," Rob Hill said.
After the Tesoris thanked attending volunteers and sponsors, PGA and LPGA tour players Ryan Blaum and Amelia Lewis were introduced and spent time with the children, helping them practice their swings and introducing them to Power Tee, an automatic teeing system.

"Poppy really loved how the ball comes up without you having to do anything," Poppy's mother, Michaela Hill, said. She also said that Poppy loved the giant, inflatable gorilla overlooking the green, and that her confidence radiated through the entire event.

"She high-fives everyone, hugs the kids,

talks to the pros, and feels the same as everyone else," Michaela Hill said. "That's where she shines."

The first All-Star Kids Clinic launched in 2014 at a tournament in Greensboro, North Carolina. Soon after, tournament directors lined up, asking to host a clinic in their own tournaments. Next year, there will be 20 nationwide.

"It's a dream come true that I never dreamed," Paul Tesori said. "This game has been everything in my life. For me, not only to be able to do clinics throughout the country, but to be able to in my home, in Ponte Vedra, I get way more out of it than the kids do. The kids teach me every day. My son has taught me more in five and a half years than I learned in my first 42."

The Tesori's son, Isaiah, also took a liking to the green gorilla, putting the ball enthusiastically and happily playing all over the green. He even found the best-shaded spot of the sunny afternoon, under one of the dinner tables, playing games with a friend.

"A lot of people, when they see that Isaiah has Down syndrome, they're apologetic and say, 'I'm sorry,' but no, stop. Don't be sorry," Tesori said. "He's amazing. He's perfect just the way he is."

History is spookier than fiction

Ximenez-Fatio House to host after-dark tours for first time

The Ximenez-Fatio House Museum seems frozen in time. Spaniard Andres Ximenez built the coquina house in 1798 with two levels, tabby floors and a separate coquina kitchen. The building was operated as a general store, tavern, billiard room and boarding house, mostly by women, and is considered as one of St. Augustine's best-preserved Spanish colonial dwellings.

During the summer, museum tour guide and Flagler College student Courtney Crum proposed hosting nighttime tours to coincide with Halloween. The history major knew a few owners and guests had died on the property.

"Sometimes when there's a wedding, we're here after dark," Crum said, meaning the property could feel a little mysterious.

Archivist Taryn Rodriguez-Boette went to work uncovering the history of people who drew their last breath on museum property. It turns out there were more than a few.

"History is so much better than fiction," Rodriguez-Boette said. Ghost tours are common in the nation's

oldest city, but how many are based on historical research?

It was common practice in the 1800s to send patients with tuberculosis and other ailments from northern states to Florida, believing the warmer climate promoted health. The Ximenez-Fatio house has a "frail lady room" where at least one death occurred.

Rodriguez-Boette has been able to document 13 deaths on the property.

"I've been organizing museum archives for the last few years," Rodriguez-Boette said. "It's a collection from 1939."

She used museum documents, burial records from the Tolomato and Huguenot cemeteries and research at the St. Augustine Historical Research Library to follow leads and "connect the dots."

"When I'm looking for dead people, [library staff] are very helpful," Rodriguez-Boette said.

Crum said that all of the Ximenez-Fatio House tour guides worked together to write the story from Rodriguez-Boette's research. It's the first time the museum will offer tours after dark. There will be candles and lanterns outside, but artificial lighting will be used inside the buildings for safety.

Be sure to listen for the ghostly tale about a mirror, original to the house, in the owner's quarters.

"Billy" the skeleton will greet guests and Flagler College students will portray characters during the special tours. A fragile mourning dress from the 1870s, usually concealed in storage, will be on special exhibit for two weeks.

The evening tours will be held at 20 Aviles Street at 6 p.m., 7 p.m., and 8 p.m. Tuesday, Oct. 29; Wednesday, Oct. 30; Friday, Nov. 1; and Saturday, Nov. 2. Cost is \$10 per person for the 30- to 45-minute customized tours. Space is limited. For advance ticket information and group rates, call (904) 342-8887.



Collage Day School gets back to the 'roots' of learning

Exploring nature, making mistakes and being a good person are all on the curriculum

From the moment toddlers start to process the world around them, parents are encouraging them to learn from it. Counting, coloring, naming and feeling – preschool children are working their way to hitting milestones and preparing themselves for kindergarten and then beyond.

Recently, there has been a trend toward not only preparing children for school but preparing them for life. Collage Day School in Ponte Vedra looks to ask a question that doesn't get asked very often in traditional academics: What do people actually need to succeed?

The road from little people to big people is a long one and not everything can be taught from a book – or, in the case of growing up these days – an iPad, according to the school's philosophy. With 8-acres of land, chickens, rabbits and a butterfly house, Collage Day School teaches children to explore and to become inspired by the world around them.

"We are really going to back to the roots of childhood here," said founder Dr. Katie Falwell. "It's a more naturalistic approach. You're not going to see a lot of prefab toys or things that light up or sparkle or shine. We are going back to the foundation of loose parts and really letting children's

creativity and imagination take over their play."

Currently, Falwell owns two schools in Ponte Vedra Beach, the Collage Day School and the Palm Valley Development Center, both on Canal Boulevard. Both focus on the whole child, with the Palm Valley Development Center centering on children with developmental disabilities. Falwell believes, however, that every child benefits from having hands-on access to nature.

Falwell implements the TimberNook curriculum in the classrooms, which is a nature-based developmental program that fosters outdoor play. The program is designed to be sensoryrich and was developed by a pediatric occupational therapist who was interested in connections between children's developmental coordination and limited outdoor activities.

Dr. Falwall said that she believes outdoor play is effective in nurturing a child's confidence and ability to succeed in the home and in school. She encourages "reasonable risks" and engaging in "self-directed play," something that many children are seeing less and less of.

"When we were younger, we bounced around in the back of the station wagon, we weren't really strapped into anything,"

Falwell said. "Now, even as babies, we are put into containers for everything. The ability to move or even fall and have healthy risk-taking behaviors have been minimized in the last few years. The helicopter parent has really taken over."

In conjunction with the confidence,

coordination and social skills children build from outdoor activities, the school also implements the "Dinosaur School" curriculum, which is guided by in-house psychologists that teach children emotional and character development skills.

Part of the skills that students learn is "Watching Faces." The activity helps them read faces to see if their friends are sad or angry and teaches them how to approach them and ask if they want help. The idea behind the program is that by fostering these skills at a young age, children will be able to withstand the emotional challenges during their teen years.

Like driving a car, being able to process emotions and appreciate the living world takes time and a little effort. The difference being driving isn't mandatory, one can live without learning. What is mandatory — inevitable even — is growing up. All children grow up and become adults navigating through a world of other adults. An adult that hopefully, if they are given the right tools from an early age, is a really good driver.



Sea and Sky Air Show pilot shares secrets of the stunt life

Jim Record gets down to earth about flying high in a WWII-era plane

The roar of engines and feats of perilous precision flying keep audiences coming back to Jacksonville's annual Sea and Sky Air Show. This year's event, Oct. 26 and 27, is taking place in Jacksonville Beach and promises one of the best line-ups to date, including the U.S Army Golden Knights, the Blue Angels, the Air Force Red Tail Squadron P-15 demo commemorating the Tuskegee Airmen and the Miss GEICO Speedboat Race.

Pilot Jim Record is excited about this year's show. Even after 27 years of flying with the GEICO Skytypers, being up in the air is something that never gets old for him. After all the long hours working around the clock and limited "actual" fly time, Record said being a pilot is just something you're born to do.

"Even though you have a job to do, the pure beauty of flight is not lost on us," Record said. "Sometimes it will get pushed back to the corner of your brain, but flying is one of those jobs that is in your blood."

The GEICO Skytypers fly "taildragger warbirds," used primarily during World War II as trainer aircraft. They are SNJ propeller planes that were able to perform all the maneuvers of a fighter plane on a 600-horsepower Pratt and Whitney engine. According to Record, the planes built in the era were the top of the line.

"World War II was the zenith of propeller driven fighters," Record said. "The P-51 Mustang and similar planes were the best ever produced. Even today, when you go to the Reno Air Races in Nevada, the airplanes racing are P-51 Mustangs from 1944. Yeah, they are old technology, but as far as capability, they were as good as they got then."

Hailing from the "Cradle of Aviation," Long Island, Record started his own career serving as an IP in Formation, Gunnery and Carrier Landings with the Navy. His early interest in aviation was nurtured by his father, who flew in a bomber crew during World War II and supported him early on in his career. He has flown corporate jets, commercial airlines and served as a professor for Dowling in the College of Aviation before joining the Skytypers. With all his experience flying Boeing 747s, military trainers, carriers, Airbuses and propeller planes, Record said big or small, flying doesn't vary too much.

"The beauty of flying is you fly the airplane and the basic rules are the same," Record said. No matter how big the plane is, "You pull the stick forward and the houses on the ground get bigger and you pull the stick back and the houses on the ground get smaller."

One would think that flying precision maneuvers in formation takes an extra set of "copilots," but Record said the daredevil stunts are designed to look more dangerous from the ground than they actually are.

"It looks close because that's how we want you to look at it," Record said. "In reality, we have what we call 'outs.' We have positions that we look at and safety margins and this and that. In other words, we can stop a maneuver and fly away to a safe place at any time."

In addition to feats of daring, Record and his team also perform "Skytyping," which is a form of sky writing that has been patented by the company. The method works 17 times faster than writing by ejecting an environmentally friendly, paraffin-based solution in the exhaust manifold that is connected through a formation from the team, rather than a singular plane. The message is spelled out in "dots" that can be seen from 15 miles away and is approximately the size of the Empire State Building. Skytyping is such a highly effective form of communicating a message that Record said it may have caused a few problems for couples lucky or unlucky enough to see it together.

"Strangely enough we do about a dozen or so marriage proposals a year," Record said. He said one message once read: "Mary, will you marry me, John." Then, "About eight or ten couples on the beach all jumped up. There were that many John and Marys," he said.



Traveling docent connects art and people

Cathy Fitzpatrick calls herself a freelance docent.

The Ponte Vedra Beach resident used to work in the educational department at the Museum of Contemporary Art Jacksonville, where she led a lot of group tours.

Now she runs a unique business called Go Art, where she takes private groups on tours of museums, galleries and public art around the First Coast. Using an open-ended method of engaging people with individual pieces of art through visual and thinking strategies, Fitzpatrick said it is a way to facilitate viewing, while inspiring people to remember what they see.

First, she asks them to look at a piece of art for longer than they ordinary would. On average, people spend 30 seconds, she said. "I ask them to spend a whole minute."

Then she asks three questions: What is going on in the work? What do you see that makes you say that? Then—what more can we find?

It invites conversation within the group, she said. "If they ask questions about the artist or the style, then we'll engage in those answers and ask them what they see that has led them to ask that question."

Fitzpatrick said the technique she uses was developed by Philip Yenawine in in the 1990s in New York City, in conjunc-

tion with a psychologist. It has proven successful in helping people connect with art and allowing it to become a part of their life.

"There are a lot of people who feel intimidated in a gallery or museum environment," Fitzpatrick said. "What helps people engage? One thing is having their own ideas validated."


Fitzpatrick majored in art at St.
Mary's College, Notre Dame and then
went on to graduate school at Pratt
Institute in New York City. She has done
art, but said what she really loves are
conversations that come from looking
at art

She launched her business a year ago

and is now branching out by offering monthly special events at Butterfield Garage Art Gallery in St. Augustine. Each will focus on one artist. She sees them as a way for art lovers to grow an awareness of an individual artist's work, while meeting them in person.

Her first event, Nov. 21, from 7 to 8:30 p.m., will feature artist Karen Victoria, a handbag designer. Victoria is slated to share stories about her life, as well as her construction techniques and designs. Attendees will be able to ask questions, purchase a one-of-a-kind handbag on the spot, and perhaps win

A district championship and a home-field playoff berth will be at stake when a proven football power, the St. Augustine Yellow Jackets, visit the Shark Tank Friday, Oct. 25 to battle the Ponte Vedra Sharks.

Even the most optimistic followers of Ponte Vedra football could not have envisioned the success the young squad has achieved seven games into the 2019 season.

A multitude of questions faced this year's Shark team even before the whistle blew at the first practice on a steamy morning in early August. To say that the Sharks would be in a rebuilding mode was a vast understatement. Missing from a team that posted a successful 8-3 record were their top four receivers on offense and 9 of their leading tacklers on defense. All this and the 2019 Sharks were jolted when their popular and highly successful coach, Matt Toblin, suddenly left the

Ponte Vedra Athletic Director Eric
Frank may have hit the jackpot in new

hire Jeff DiSandro. The former offensive coordinator at Bishop Kenny and a Schaumberg, Illinois native, has overcome numerous setbacks to post a current record of 6-1 that has moved the Sharks to a lofty ranking among North Florida elevens.

But no one could have foreseen DiSandro's biggest fear when the Sharks lost their 2-year veteran quarterback, and Division 1 prospect, Jacobi Meyers, for the year on the first offensive drive of the season. Even more unlikely was the impact his backup RJ Glod would have on this team. Suddenly thrust into a starting role as the pilot directing this ship, Glod had attempted just 21 passes in his entire high school career, and none in his junior season.

However, following Ponte Vedra's smashing 61-7 victory in their last game against Englewood, Glod was leading all Northeast Florida quarterbacks in passing yardage.


