



MSD meeting hosts candidates for sheriff, congress

Robert Hardwick and Donna Deegan speak at March 9 meeting

The Municipal Service District of Ponte Vedra Beach welcomed Robert A. Hardwick, chief of police for St. Augustine Beach, and Donna Deegan, former First Coast News anchor who is now running for U.S House of Representatives.

Hardwick, who is currently running for sheriff, discussed the area's traffic concerns and his background working for the St. Johns County Sheriff's Office.

"The district is very unique," Hardwick said. "We average about 41,000 cars compared to 12,000 on Beach Boulevard. You got a lot of traffic coming up through

here in St. Johns County. You average about 165 traffic tickets in the area monthly, which is pretty impressive — very similar to the status in St. Augustine Beach, but add a one in front of that. We average about 11,000 tickets with almost the same exact traffic flow."

Hardwick credits the low traffic violations and crime to the area's community police involvement.

Additionally, Hardwick addressed the SJSO's initiative toward increasing the division's attention to mental health is-

"I never thought the police officers as a profession were going to be dealing with a first-line attack on mental health and mental illness," Hardwick said. "We are working toward educating officers in crisis intervention and alcohol dependency. We've come a long way as a profession." Donna Deegan also spoke about her campaign initiatives, which are mainly focused on combating health care problems and climate change.

Deegan, a three-time breast cancer survivor and founder of the DONNA Foundation, said hearing women share their stories about their struggles with their insurance providers during treatment inspired her to make universal healthcare a top issue of her campaign.

"I started hearing from women all the time that said, 'I am having to choose between putting food on the table for my kids and life-saving care," Deegan said. "It's why I started the DONNA Foundation, to be able to help women pay for their critical needs. I am absolutely certain that our healthcare system needs to be fixed."

Deegan said she believes in protecting pre-existing conditions and allowing children to stay under their parent's coverage until they are 26.

"That will be my number one priority in congress," Deegan said.



THE PLAYERS' Military Appreciation Ceremony breaks the musical mold

Fans could set their cowboy boots aside and bring in the glow sticks Tuesday, March 10 because for the first time ever at THE PLAYERS' Military Appreciation Ceremony, an Electronic Dance Music duo, The Chainsmokers, was invited to close out day-one of the tournament, lighting up the hole no. 17 Island Green.

THE PLAYERS Championship started bright and early at TPC Sawgrass, with fans following players around their practice rounds, grabbing autographs, enjoying food and drinks and taking lots of pictures. But as the clock struck closer to the 5 p.m. ceremony, more fans kept rolling in, young and old, local and tourist.

"We just moved here from Pennsylvania, so this is our first time here and we're loving it," said new St. Augustine resident Jen Daley, who after years of watching the tournament on TV with her husband, retired Army veteran Dan Daley, was thrilled to finally visit the course in person.

"We came to watch the ceremony, the flyover and admiral's speech," Dan Daley said. "We walked around the course for a bit and it was super. All these people are just amazing."

The admiral's speech he referred to was given by retired Vice Adm. and Navy SEAL Philip Gardner Howe III.

"Today is about Northeast Florida coming together to show respect and support for our military and especially their families," Howe said. "They make so many sacrifices every day, some large, some small, almost all of them unseen. They voluntarily give up so many aspects of normal civilian life in order to serve our country."

During a brief intermission after the ceremony, Jacksonville Beach resident Marisa Leni began searching for a good spot on the Island Green to enjoy the upcoming Chainsmokers performance.

She had not only been to THE PLAY-ERS before, but also worked it, and was happy to enjoy that evening simply as a guest.

"I worked with Tropical Smoothie and it was a blast," she said. "But to be able to be a guest on the greens versus working is a whole different experience."

The shower, in collaboration with the PGA TOUR, took place at the Birdies for the Brave Patriots' Outpost, a hospitality tent reserved for the military during the week of the tournament.

A decorate-your-own onesie station welcomed the moms and their families into the "Sea to Shining Sea"-themed shower, filled with a variety of food and an impecable dessert station with delicate chocolates, pastries and a "Shining Sea" decorative cake for all.

Special guests featured singer-songwriter Patrick Davis, who performed for the military families during the shower, and PGA TOUR player Jim Furyk and his wife Tabitha, who run the Furyk Foundation and helped organize the event.

"When they go home, their husbands sometimes aren't there," Tabitha Furyk said. "And this time, we had 10 girls here that were active military, themselves, all from mixed bases."

And to show her gratitude, commander and executive officer at the Mayport Naval Station, Patricia Tyler, spoke, honored and congratulated every military mother, whether on active duty, a veteran or the wife of a deployed member.

"When you serve, you serve," she said.
"It's indiscriminate what's happening with your lives and with your families. So, I want to tell you, thank you. Having been where all of you are, you are what matters, and organizations like Operation Shower, they're telling us, you, ladies and gentlemen, thank you for your service."

Games and a trivia contest kept guests on their toes until the end of the shower, with the winning table receiving a gift bag of surprises. Every mommy-to-be went home with dozens of gifts, such as a giant robe, stuffed animals, baby clothes, a Diaper Genie and more

When did you start volunteering at THE PLAYERS?

In 2008. I started out as an assistant at offsite parking for spectators, when it was at UNF. I wasn't even onsite at the tournament. Next, I served on other committees. Other committees I've been on are Admissions, Disabled Guest Services, Volunteer Offsite Shuttle, Commissary and Benefactors Venue.

What led to your current top leadership role in charge of all volunteers?

I've been a vice chairman for four years. And last year I was selected by the Red Coats' past chairman to be the 2020 Tournament Chairman.

How many volunteers do you oversee?

A little over 2,200 this year. There's a total of six of us on the leadership team.

Has the number of volunteers grown?

Yes. As the championship grows the needs grow as well to be able to support all the players, spectators and vendors.

What has been your favorite volunteer role?

My favorite unofficial role is leading up to the tournament, working with the facilities crew volunteers. That is where I have the most joy — working with those folks. From a construction standpoint — before the tournament — it's building things, getting the course ready to go.

What are some of the things you do with the construction volunteers?

One day, we put together Adirondack chairs and picnic tables and painted the rope stakes, which get pressure washed and painted every year. Seeing the course week in and week out coming alive is the cool part of it.

When did the volunteers start helping to prepare the course?

The first Saturday of January this year. From early January, we always meet every Saturday and then as we get closer to the tournament we transition to Saturday and Sunday. We do little types of tasks, I call it "trimming out the course," finalizing the course. We rope the course typically the Friday before. We get THE PLAYERS parking lot prepared, the Media Center parking lot, the caddy parking lot.

What are your duties during tournament week?

Thanking the volunteers. Spending time with as many volunteers as I can. Operationally, my first vice chairman handles the volunteer operations during the week. My role during tournament week is spending time with the volunteers and spending time with them in interviews. I always say it's been a true honor and privilege to represent the volunteers and this experience is something I'll never forget.

Tell us about your public speaking duties as spokesperson for the volunteers.

My first was in September. The closer we got to the tournament, the more speaking engagements I had, up to several a week.

How has your employer helped you manage your major volunteer role as this year's chairman?

Florida Blue is very supportive. As long as I have my phone and access to Wi-Fi, I can handle my job.

As chairman, do you interact very much with the tournament players?

Very rarely. The majority of our volunteers don't have exposure to the players. The majority of our volunteers don't get to see much golf because of what they are doing. I typically have no idea what is going on with the tournament until each night, when I turn on the Golf Channel.

So why do it?

The main reason is making the impact on charity in our community that being a volunteer provides. We did \$9.5 million in 2019 and over \$100 million since 1977. As Red Coats, we get the opportunity to go out to the charities we support — to personally see the impact. Whether it's delivering a check or goods and services, helping people makes me feel amazing. The memories are special. It's the main reason I put in the hours that I do. Once you are a tournament chairman you are never in a leadership role again at THE PLAYERS. But I still plan to stay actively engaged with the tournament in the future.

Do you play golf?

I've played golf since I was 3. But I don't play nearly as much as I used to. It was a big part of my life growing up.

Where did you grow up?

In Sarasota. I attended the University of Florida and started with Florida Blue right out of school in Gainesville. I got promoted within a year and moved to Jacksonville, then got promoted to Orlando and then back to Jacksonville.

Tell us about your family and hobbies.

My daughter Maddy just turned 16 and my son Carson is 13. Both attend Episcopal High School. My hobbies are hunting, fishing and golf.

What do you like about holding the tournament in March?

It's definitely cooler than May. Being the first championship on The PGA TOUR schedule is a natural fit for THE PLAYERS Championship.

Since winning THE PLAYERS 35 years ago, Calvin Peete inspired many to embrace golf

Calvin Peete was the first African American to win THE PLAYERS. He was 41 years old when he won in 1985 and his dramatic victory during the final round, which began in a three-way tie with Hale Irwin and D.A. Weibring, inspired fans for years to come.

Peete didn't start playing until he was 23 years old, far older than most players who become pros. And he did so with a left arm that he couldn't completely extend, due to a broken elbow that occurred during a childhood fall that was never set correctly.

His story and his winning record, which included 12 PGA TOUR wins overall, "inspired a whole generation to play golf," Pepper Peete said of her husband Calvin, who died in 2015. "People told him, 'I started watching the game of golf because of you.' White people, black people — he inspired a whole different fan base for THE PLAYERS. He was just very inspirational."

Calvin Peete was also instrumental in growing the game of golf in Northeast Florida through his involvement with The First Tee, founded in 1997 through a partnership among the PGA TOUR and other golf organizations that wanted to find a way to encourage more kids to play golf.

A nonprofit youth development organization that helps young people build character through the sport, Pepper Peete was formerly executive director of The First Tee of Jacksonville and is now manager of chapter relations at The First Tee headquarters at World Golf

"When I first got involved in 2001, Calvin also got involved then," Pepper said. "Calvin always had an



interest in junior golf-gave clinics and support to organizations that introduced kids to the game."

She didn't know her husband when he won THE PLAYERS in 1985, she met him in 1987. But coming from a family of golfers, and being one herself, she remembers witnessing his memorable win on TV.

He teaches deaf kids how to play golf in their own language

After playing golf professionally for 15 years, Rob Strano decided to retire and become a golf coach.

Around the same time, he said, "God put it into my heart to learn sign language. Then I was amazed to find out that no one was teaching golf to the deaf in sign language."

Strano has since been teaching golf to deaf children all around the country at professional golf events, including at THE PLAYERS, where he held a clinic on Tuesday for nine middle school students from the Florida School for the Deaf and the Blind.

"This will be our 17th year here," said Strano at 9 a.m. as he got ready to begin the all-day learning experience for the students out on the Dye's Valley Course, adjacent to the Stadium Course, where players were making the rounds on the first practice day.


Strano, a Golf Channel lead coach from Destin, Florida was joined by a group of PLAYERS special events volunteers, who were there to serve as his assistants.

They began the day with a lesson on teeing off, then learned how to putt.

Strano said they would follow that with a visit to a golf equipment van to see the players' equipment being made. Then they would head over to the 17th Hole Experience, the replica of the famed Island Hole, for an hour of further instruction and practice, followed by lunch.

"It's a full day," he said.

Since Strano knows sign language, he was able to instruct the students as a group and individually without an inter-



Rue is a cancer survivor and Nemours ambassador. And Mickelson is a family


The reunion between Mickelson and Rue began with a short video featuring photographs and film clips of the two together when the famous golfer visited the little girl in the hospital.



Clare Berry, longtime volunteer of THE PLAYERS Championship, enjoys being of service to the players

Clare Berry began volunteering at the championship now known as THE PLAY-ERS back in 1982, when she was manager of Arvida Clearview Cable TV and John Tucker was in charge of the tournament.

A friend, Kelly Whitaker, who was Tucker's assistant, called Berry one day and said, "I hear you write press releases." "Sure, I write press releases," Berry

recalls saying.
"Then can you come over to my office after work?" Whitaker asked.

"And that's how it all started," Berry said. "They didn't even have a public relations committee. I was the public relations committee."

Berry continued doing public relations for the tournament for two years and then told them it was too much work. So, they gave her a volunteer job in admissions, which she did for one year before declaring that she didn't want to volunteer anymore.

She had made a career switch to real estate and was too busy.

Until another phone call changed her mind: How would she would like to chair the Players Services Committee?

"As a Realtor, that was right up my alley," she said. "They put us in a trailer at the edge of the parking lot."

Berry has kept that volunteer role for 35 years. She no longer works out of a trailer, but "it's been a lot of years and a lot of fun memories," she said.

The Players Services committee is now headquartered in the TPC Clubhouse.

Monday, as players arrived from all around the country, Berry and her fellow committee volunteers worked out of The Presidents Cup Library, registering the professional golfers and helping them get situated for the tournament.

Berry said the committee functions as a "concierge" service for the players for the week, helping them with everything from locating a doctor, if they should need

one, to giving shopping advice, restaurant recommendations and more.

They began their volunteer duties the Saturday before THE PLAYERS, on March 7 and will work up to 11 hours days through the end of play on Sunday, March 15.

"Before competition begins, our number one job is to make sure they get registered and have a car for the week, if they want one," Berry said. Some drive their own cars to the championship, but if they don't, The PGA TOUR gives them a Lexus to use.

Saturdays and Sundays before THE PLAYERS are usually rather slow, because many of the pros are still at Bay Hill, the tournament held the week before, Berry said.

And then Mondays get really busy, with more than 100 players registering that day this year, of the total 144 slated to play.

First time golfers usually have a lot of questions, which the Players Services

Committee is on hand to answer, Berry said. And her volunteer role is a learning curve from year to year.

"The registration process used to be very paper intensive," she said. "Now it's all electronic. It takes a minute — the old way used to take five. It's streamlined, it's wonderful."

Volunteering at tournament for Berry is also a family tradition. Her mother once volunteered at the Greater Jacksonville Open, which evolved into THE PLAY-ERS. And her son became a volunteer at age 16 and put in 10 years of service.

Owner of Berry & Co. Real Estate, Berry once worked at the Ponte Vedra Recorder and she said her background in real estate and media is a tremendous help in her volunteer role today.

"I like to fix problems or challenges, which is what I do everyday in real estate," she said. "It's a lot of fun. I can pretty much call anybody and tell them what I need and why I need it and get

whatever I want. Because everybody wants to help the players and their impact on local charity."

After 35 years in her current volunteer role, "I still have the same passion and energy I've always had," she said. "I'm excited about rolling out the red carpet for people who are spending a week here."

preter, which Karen Newton, assistant middle school principal, said was wonderful, praising his signing ability as "very clear."

Tim Bush, who is in his 16th year as a volunteer at THE PLAYERS and his sixth one with Strano, said he was so inspired by Strano that he took sign language classes as well, so he could communicate with the kids.

"He's a great communicator," Bush said. "He teaches them how to grip the club, how to turn their shoulders. He starts

them with tennis balls and rubber clubs, then he graduates them to regular clubs. He'll critique them as they hit, as they do different skills. His love of doing this and his communications skills are amazing."

Last year at the 17th hole replica in Stadium Village, a young boy who had never hit a golf ball before hit a hole in one, Bush said. "It was because of the way Rob taught him to swing."

Michael Johnson, web media communications manager at the school, said he has been bringing deaf students to Strano's clinic at THE PLAYERS for eight years.

"For a lot of them, it's their first exposure to golf," Johnson said. "And they love it."





Turning to smile at Rue, he said, "I think there is a special purpose in life for this girl. I don't know what it is, but part of the joy for me is finding out."

Mickelson explained that he could relate to what Rue's family went through, as he also experienced cancer in his family. And that he appreciated the support they received from people's thoughts and prayers.

"When our family went through tough times, you could actually feel that positive energy," he said. "It helps you get through it."

He praised Rue for caring about other people during her illness and for her courage during 26 months of difficult treatments.

"We are really happy you are doing well," he told her. "What was the hardest part?" he asked.

"The needles," she said.

"Yet you did it," he said. "A lot of times, even though you didn't like it. Good job."

farm's latest news, such as "volunteens" Leah and Tina, who take the time to work on the farm on their days off from school to help the animals on the farm, specifically


horses Beamer and Ginger and their miniature sister, Angie.

Home is where the heart is – even if it's not your own

Beaches Habitat for Humanity house leads to extraordinary connection

Perhaps it was divine intervention. After all, it was Christmastime, the season of miracles, but who would have guessed a standard issue Christmas card brought to a local senior living center could spark such a magical and heartwarming experience?

David Clarke is a resident at Ponte Vedra Gardens, an Alzheimer's special care center on Palm Valley Road. He has dementia, and, like many others with the disease, suffers from severe memory loss and difficulty communicating. Since he moved into Ponte Vedra Gardens around a year ago, his wife, Keith Clarke, has become a familiar face to the caregivers there. But the connection one caregiver had to her husband came as a surprise to everyone — including them.

One day last year, shortly before Christmas, Keith brought in a Christmas card to show David. It was the annual holiday card sent out by Habitat for Humanity to its past and present volunteers. David had been a big part of Habitat for Humanity. He had helped organize the first Habitat for Humanity at the Beaches. He even received a service award in 1995 for helping to build the second Beaches Habitat for Humanity house.

Keith recalled David's excitement after he helped get the program up and running and then physically being able to start building homes. He would describe in detail to her the houses they were building alongside the people who would be living in them.

"He just absolutely loved it," Keith said.
"He loved the people he was building houses for. He would always talk about them."

So, Keith thought bringing the card in and showing it to David might brighten his day or give him a reason to smile. Little did she know, it would turn out to do so much more.

In what may only be described as fate, one of David's caregivers at Ponte Vedra Gardens, Latricia Macon-Stewart, was in the room when Keith presented the Christmas card to David. Keith explained David's connection to the nonprofit organization to those in the room and shared his pride about building the second Habitat House at the Beaches. She wasn't prepared for Latricia's response.

"I remember her saying, 'I grew up in this house,'" Keith said.

The house David built had been a special place for Latricia, as well. She'd moved into that home as a child with her family right after it was built. Her mother, who helped build the home alongside David and other Habitat for Humanity volunteers, raised Latricia in the home. Naturally, as time passed, Latricia moved

out on her own, but returned to that same home when her mother was diagnosed with cancer. When Latricia's mother passed away four years ago, Latricia remained in the home where she could still feel her mother's presence.

It's the home she was living in when David received that card, and she realized the man she helps care for almost

every day had been an integral part in building her family home..

As amazing as the connection was for Latricia, it may have been even more so for David. Latricia recalled David's reaction upon hearing it was her house. They spent hours talking about the house, and Latricia says she was amazed at his ability to recall almost every detail.

"When he was in that moment, he remembered," Latricia said as tears rolled down her face. "He told me everything. We had a great talk about the house. He told me it was just something he loved doing."

Others at Ponte Vedra Gardens couldn't believe the impact the link between them had on David, either. They gathered around as David and Latricia shared memories of the house.

"That day when I saw them talking, it was so beautiful, because it was the most engaged I'd ever seen him," said Jennifer McCormick, program director at Ponte Vedra Gardens. "He was so in that moment with her. They were just so connected."

The connection was so special, the staff at Ponte Vedra Gardens wanted to commemorate it. They threw a party for the two on Valentine's Day, and the house was at the heart of the celebration.

"When Latricia was talking about the house, he was just so happy," McCormick said.

The connection also meant so much to Keith, who felt a unique bond with Latricia after finding out, and who got to relive a special time in her relationship with David. She remembered shortly after they were married over 20 years ago, David was looking for something to do. She said with David's big heart, volunteer work was a natural fit, so, as he was browsing volunteer opportunities, he came across an upcoming meeting for people who might be interested in organizing a Habitat for Humanity at the Beaches.

"He came home and said, 'Well, I'm in charge of raising all this money," she said. "He raised the money somehow and then started building and just absolutely loved it."

Because of his dementia, details are not something David regularly recalls. However, McCormick said his reaction to hearing about the house and its connection to Latricia is proof of how special building those homes were for him.

"Although they have dementia, the moments are really important, so if it's something really special, or if it's something from the past, they tend to remember those things, or the feelings associated with it," she said. "That's why, in a place like this, where we care for people with dementia, it's so beautiful to see when they have moments like this, when they really do connect, because so many times they aren't able to."

The house means even more to Latricia now. The home's location in Atlantic Beach and the growth of the area has increased its value significantly, but Latricia said she can't imagine selling it. Her mother's presence is still there, and now, there's something else. Something otherworldly, perhaps.

"It's such a rare story," Latricia said.
"It's almost like he blessed us back then and now, I'm returning the favor."

Most survivors of the camps have passed on and the youngest survivors, those born within the camps, are 75 years of age and older.

The film tells the story of the life of Herzfeld's father, Jack Glucksman, from pre-war Poland to the years he spent in various concentration camps, including Auschwitz, the Death March, and his survival in the Baltic Sea after the bombing and sinking of the Cap Arcona, the ship that was carrying him to safety.


"As a child, my father never spoke



Immersive musical installation 'Loving Beethoven' opens in Ponte Vedra Beach

The Cultural Center at Ponte Vedra Beach partnered with the Interactive Music Museum in Malaga, Spain, to bring the musical installation of "Loving Beethoven," to the United States for the first time. An opening reception was held March 6 to celebrate.

Created by MIMMA's design team, the "immersive" installation, open until May 26, features five life-sized orbs that change in color and vibration to the rhythm and intensity of classical music composed by Ludwig van Beethoven.

The reception featured culinary treats and drinks.

"These are some good olives," said Richey Smith of the goodies laid out by Let's Cheese, Trasca & Co. Eatery and Savory Sensations.

A member and supporter of the Cultural Center with his wife Sandra. Smith said they spend their time living between Ohio and Ponte Vedra and happened to be in town for the grand opening.

"We don't really know what to expect," Sandra Smith said, "but we have a lot of classical music in Ohio and we've been supporters of the center for a long time."

After a time for socializing, the center's executive director Donna Guzzo welcomed everyone with a warm smile and thanked them for coming.

"It's so exciting to have you all here tonight and to have you experience something so unique to our area," Guzzo said. "For the first time, not just here at the cultural center, but here in the United States."

She thanked the dignitaries, sponsors and supporters of the center and the installation, with special accolades to Monica Jacoby, who was Guzzo's inspiration for bringing the installation to life in Ponte Vedra Beach, and to John Regan and his wife, Felicia, who helped make the dream a reality.

"This man made the introduction to make this installation happen," Guzzo said of MIMMA museum director Miguel Angel Piedrola, who flew in from Malaga a little less than a year ago to discuss the project, and then returned for the grand opening that evening.

"This installation demonstrates that music can be perceived not only through the ear, but also through sight and through touch," Piedrola said, explaining the story behind the installation and how it pays homage to Beethoven and his 250th birthday.

"There are many people who are unable to enjoy music through one sense but are able to still enjoy and appreciate it through other senses," he said. "Music is rhythm and you're going to be able to see rhythm with the changing lights [and vibrations]."

As the music faded in, guests, hesitant at first, slowly inched toward the giant, glowing orbs, ever changing from blue to green to pink and onward, matching the rhythm, beats and intensity of Beethoven's classics.

Guests moved closer and closer, immersing themselves and all their senses.

Then, when the music faded out, a small accompanying workshop station was available in the corner for guests and children to interact with, featuring different instruments, sounds and vibrations.

"It's not what I expected," Sandra Smith said afterward. "But it's very interesting, the way you could feel

each sound through orb. It was less emphasis on the sound and more on the touch."

Piedrola explained that the installation was created for people of all ages, whether or not they were familiar with Beethoven.

With the installation "children have the opportunity to get to know and enjoy his music," Piedrola said. "Because what you do not know, you cannot yet love."

"Loving Beethoven" will be open to the public until May 26 at the Cultural Center at Ponte Vedra Beach. Admission is \$5.

Beaches Museum opens art exhibit honoring women's suffrage movement

Centennial of 19th amendment celebrated through abstract art

The Beaches Museum hosted three North Florida abstract artists at the opening reception for The Ballot and the Brush: Celebrating Women's Suffrage though Art on Friday, March 7.

Sara Conca, Tiffany Manning and Princess Simpson Rashid presented at the exhibit with work honoring the 100th anniversary of the passage of the 19th amendment, giving women the right to vote.

Conca, whose contemporary "aquatic mystical series," evokes her surroundings, said she wanted to create work that drew on the idea that "women have the incredible ability to win with love." Conca uses natural mixed media of raw pigment colors, mica flakes and crystals to "immerse the viewer into the emotional energies" of a feminine power.

With energy and dance, Manning's acrylic work aims to represent female empowerment, strength and victory through movement on canvas.

"My time in the studio is one part mov-

ing meditation and one part dance party for one," she said. "This is where I tap into my bliss."

Rashid's work, comprised mainly of reds and blacks, is intended to reflect the African American woman's perspective during the suffrage movement, which Rashid feels is largely overlooked.

"I chose red for all the suffering and sacrifice for us to be able to vote," Rashid said. "Specifically, I used black to represent the black bodies. Maybe they didn't get as much attention or were listened to, but they were on the front lines as well."

A recent breast cancer survivor, Rashid also drew from her pain during this time period, creating work that shows a "search for order out of chaos." Her geometric abstractions are pulled from the canvas, giving her work emotional undertones of strength amidst disorder.

Chris Shea, an exhibit committee chair, said the Beaches Museum is proud of the current exhibit and the wealth of talent it has compiled. Shea said the museum is looking toward expanding similar showings for the future.

"We are trying to step it up a little bit and have more art exhibits, more frequently," Shea said. "(We believe) there is sort of a void in the art community at the beach. We'd like to try to help fill that

"This group of 10 fifth graders, along with their sister team of fourth graders, embraced a challenge that exists as part of a category in their FIRST LEGO League," said Bolles Lower School Ponte Vedra Beach campus science teacher and robotics coach Carolyn Houston during her introduction to the commissioners.

FIRST LEGO League is an international robotics competition built around theme-based challenges that engage children ages 9 to 16 in research, problem-solving, coding and engineering. This winter, robotics teams around the world, including several from The Bolles School, have been practicing for local and regional qualifying meets.

"Their goal was to identify a problem and the teams invited wheelchair users to help determine the biggest accessibility issues in our area," Houston said. "The problem was quickly identified – access to our Beaches for the disabled needed help."

During their robotics competition season, fourth-graders worked to create a better beach wheelchair. The FBI fifth-grade team, however, expanded its focus to the distribution of existing beach wheelchairs. The county owns only a few beach wheelchairs, and all must be reserved up to three weeks in advance of any beach visit. Reserved beach wheelchairs are transported by a county-sponsored driver to the users, a system that has some obvious inefficiencies.

The FBI robotics team presented their ideas to the commission in a "skit" form, demonstrating memorized lines and a great depth of topic research and understanding.

Recognizing the flaws of the current wheelchair access system — special mats that cause beach erosion and the arduous chair reservation and delivery system — students proposed a shelter prototype "pod" model. The system is similar to e-bike and e-scooter reservation applications students

have used in larger cities. They called their app idea, the BAW for "Beach Accessible Wheelchairs."

Students said the app they have in mind would allow users to type in their location and discover which beaches have chairs available for the time and date they select. Once a reservation and payment are secured, the user gets a four-digit code to reserve and access a beach wheelchair from a pod storage building at their selected beach. Students looked at hurricane building codes, spoke with former county commissioners for perspective, read up on disability laws and consulted with general contractors to align their plans. Their research also yielded several federal grants that could provide up to \$250,000 for pilot programs creating greater access for the disabled. They also plan to reach out to Uber for a possible partnership, which

might allow them to use some of their existing app technology. The cost to develop the app would cost about \$35,000, according to the students' research.

"As a team, we reached out and surveyed more than 50 wheelchair users from the area counties," said student Emerson Slaughter. "The results suggest that most wheelchair users avoid the beach because they aren't currently accessible. The data indicates most users would be more likely to go to the beach if the beach wheelchairs were easily accessible. Responses reflect positively that the app and the pod system would make the process of getting a beach wheelchair much easier for their trip to the beach."

St. Johns County Commissioners thanked students for their ideas and indicated they would take a closer look at making their innovative plans a reality.

McIlroy wants to be first player to directly repeat as PLAYERS champ

Rory McIlroy has climbed many mountains in his golf career. In fact, there aren't all that many things he hasn't accomplished. He's won the FedExCup. He's won majors. He's won the Race to Dubai. He's been on winning Ryder Cup teams. He's been Player of The Year.

There's only one major he hasn't won, and he still has plenty of chances to do that.

So on Tuesday, when it was pointed out to him that no one had ever repeated as champion at THE PLAYERS, his eyes sparkled, and he suddenly looked very interested in doing something that no other golfer had accomplished.

"I'd love to give myself a chance," he said. "If I can keep playing the way I've been playing and get myself into contention on Sunday, it would be something extra to play for, which would be pretty cool."

McIlroy has been hanging around in top-5 territory since the end of October. He was third at the ZOZO, won the WGC-HSBC, was T3rd at Farmers Insurance Open, T5th at Genesis Invitational, 5th at WGC-Mexico and T5th at the Arnold Palmer Invitational.

He's been a threat to win each time he teed it up. It's just that he hasn't won since, oh, all the way back to last October, which was his fourth title in a calendar year.

When asked if focusing on winning would get him across the line even more often, he said, "I think the only way to not win is to concentrate on the results."

Right now, he's focused on consistency. It's all part of his change in approach to golf the last two years, in an effort to make incremental improvements in all aspects of his game.

"If I can just concentrate on what I'm doing and what I'm doing well, what I maybe need to improve on a little bit, just break the game down into different sections but really just try to make it as simple as possible, if I can do a few different things in my golf game just a little bit better, those thirds and fifths will hopefully turn into wins," he added.

One thing is sure, McIlroy has become an expert at learning to like Pete Dye golf courses.

"The 2010 Whistling Straits was when I turned a corner. I turned up there. It was the PGA Championship, and I hated it," he admitted. "I had to tell myself, look, you just need to like it for one week. Just get your head around liking this place for one week and embracing the fact that it's different and the fact that it's visually a little funky and whatever."

He finished third, one shot out of a playoff. That made him reconsider how he felt about Pete Dye.

"Going on from there, winning at

Kiawah, winning at Crooked Stick, winning here, I've started to quite like them," McIlroy explained. "They're like beer when you're younger. You sort of don't like it but then you think it's cool to drink it and then you sort of acquire a taste for it."

As most professional golfers will tell you, a Pete Dye

golf course messes with your mind.

"I think he's a wonderful golf course designer, but I never liked how he made you feel on the golf course in terms of hiding things and angles," McIlroy admitted. "It makes you a little bit uncomfortable, which is obviously his plan."

McIlroy said that the reason he was able to play TPC Sawgrass more successfully last year was that he could hit driver more times than he could when the tournament was in May.

"I was probably more stubborn back then than I am now and trying to overpower this golf course with a driver, when in May you couldn't do that," he explained.

As far as his favorite hole, he picks the 12th.

"I'm a big fan of the new 12th hole here. I think they've done a good job with the redesign of that hole, risk-reward, you can go for the green, but if you miss it in the wrong spot, it can become very tricky," he said.

Then there's the 17th.

"If you surrounded that green with bunker or grass or whatever, it would be one of the easiest par-3s that we play all year, but because of the water, there's just an extra element of difficulty to it," he said, adding that most players are just trying to make par all four days.

As for what will happen this week, McIlroy predicts, with the weather forecast, it will be double digits under par for the winner. And maybe, just maybe, he will be the first repeat champ.

Victory anniversaries at THE PLAYERS Championship

35 YEARS AGO: CALVIN PEETE

The 2020 PLAYERS Championship is the 35th anniversary of one of the most prolific winners of the 1980s, Calvin Peete. His career is highlighted by his 1985 PLAYERS victory. Regarded as a bridge between African-American golfers Charlie Sifford and Lee Elder to Tiger Woods, Peete set several professional marks that are still unmatched.

He was known for his accuracy and won the Driving Accuracy category of the PGA TOUR nine seasons in a row, from 1981 through 1990. In addition, he led the stats in greens in regulation from 1981-1983, taking over from Jack Nicklaus, who won that category in 1980. Peete also won the Vardon Trophy from the PGA of America and the Byron Nelson Award from the PGA TOUR, both for low scoring average.

At THE PLAYERS in 1985, he set a 72-hole scoring record of 274. It held for three years, until Mark McCumber shot 273 in 1988.

30 YEARS AGO: JODIE MUDD

Jodie Mudd had his best year in 1990, when he beat reigning British Open champion Mark Calcavecchia by one shot to win THE PLAYERS.

It was one of those rain-interrupted years. On Saturday, the weather came in around 1:45 p.m. and washed out golf for the day, even though the leaders had only played four holes. Those who had not finished their third rounds had to come back on Sunday morning and pick up where they left off, starting around 6:15 a.m.

The leaders finished up and the final round began and concluded on Sunday with the last groups playing

"I really can't believe it," Mudd said after winning. "My game just does not lend itself to this golf course."

Like Rory McIlroy in 2019, Mudd also won the Tour Championship that same season.

25 YEARS AGO: LEE JANZEN

Lee "Mr. Kleenex" Janzen won THE PLAYERS for the first time two years after his first U.S. Open victory. Janzen, in case you did not know, tears up when he wins. Every time. Like Bubba Watson.

While Janzen beat the best field all year, he didn't battle just anybody on the way to the title. In second place that year was Bernhard Langer, one of the most tenacious competitors ever to play the game. Janzen made a five-footer for par on the final hole to capture the 1995 PLAYERS Championship.

Course conditions were called severe by some, with the greens rock hard, a reaction to 1994 when Greg Norman set a course record of 24-under par in wet conditions and the greens were like sponges.

20 YEARS AGO: HAL SUTTON

Hal Sutton is one of few golfers to win The Players twice. His second victory in 2000 was over none other than Tiger Woods. Woods had already won the Tournament of Champions and the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro Am that year, the latter with a stunning seven-shot, come-from-behind victory. Woods was coming off a previous season when he had won eight times. Suffice it to say, PGA TOUR pros had a hard time beating him. He was at his peak.

Sutton decided not to be defeatist.

"I have only played with Tiger once this year, first two rounds at Los Angeles," he said during THE PLAYERS. "And I felt like it was important that I send a message to me and him in those two rounds, you know. One, that I could beat him, playing with him; and two, that he knew that I could beat him playing with him."

And at THE PLAYERS, he did.

After hitting his second shot on 18, Sutton famously shouted: "Be the right club today!"

15 YEARS AGO: FRED FUNK

A local resident at the time, Fred Funk became everyman's golf hero with his victory at THE PLAYERS in 2005. He wasn't long. He wasn't a big man. And he was able to turn back time to win the most lucrative tournament against the toughest field all season. At age 48, he also became the

Weather played havoc with the schedule that year. Play was suspended on Sunday. The final round was pushed to Monday. Funk had to play 32 holes in winds that gusted to 35 mph. The average score for the field that day was the highest for the entire year of any tournament on the PGA Tour. It was 76.897.

"I knew I was playing good, but I didn't know I was going to be in position to do this until the back nine. And I hung on there, barely," he admitted after the victory. "I felt kind of like Herbie the Volkswagen, The Love Bug, because I'm just out there just hitting my little pea shooters, and the bombers are going 40 by me, everybody I was playing with."

10 YEARS AGO: TIM CLARK

Tim Clark was winless on the PGA TOUR until he won THE PLAYERS in 2010. He captured the title in fine fashion. His final 18 holes were bogey free, and he had only four bogeys for the entire week. He credited his green-reading ability.

Before winning THE PLAYERS, Clark considered his most important victory as the U.S. Public Links, a USGA event that is no longer played.

"That qualified me for the Masters, as an amateur. And to this day that's still probably the highlight of my career is playing Augusta as an amateur," he said.

"I think at the end of the day, these are tournaments that you do judge your career on, THE PLAY-ERS Championship and majors," he added. "If I go on and win some majors, that will probably define my career. If I win eight or nine Tour events, it's not going to probably change me a whole lot. I'll drive nicer cars, though."

5 YEARS AGO: RICKIE FOWLER

Rickie Fowler stunned golf fans with the courageous golf shots he hit, including the final tee shot in the playoff at the 17th hole to win THE PLAYERS in sudden death over Kevin Kisner in 2015.

At the beginning of the final round, Fowler was so far back that his family left for the airport while he was on the golf course. But when he finished birdie-par-birdie-eagle-birdie-birdie, he vaulted into a lead that only two other players could equal, Kisner and Sergio Garcia.

The trio started the first ever three-hole, overtime, cumulativescore playoff. At the end of three holes, Garcia was behind the other two and dropped out. At that point Fowler and Kisner went to sudden death starting at the 17th. There, Fowler hit an amazing shot to within five feet of the hole, and Kisner's was 12 feet. Kisner missed his putt and Fowler made his, sealing his biggest victory to date.

"I feel like I look at this event as basically like a major. It has the major feel, obviously one of the best fields we play all year, on a tough golf course," he said. "Being that I was able to get the job done here, especially in a playoff and when it really mattered, it's just going to give me added confidence and belief in myself going forward."

HOLE 1

- No. 1 tee is a popular spot to watch players hit their tee shots with mounds to the left and right of the green for optimal viewing.
- Limited foliage lets you see a player's approach and putt.
- This less-crowded location provides an opportunity to get close to players as they walk from No. 1 green to No. 2 tee.

HOLE 2

■ Elevated mounding behind the green provides a great place to watch players decide whether or not to go for the par 5 in two or lay up, and then you can keep an eye on them as they head to No. 3 tee to take a shot at the par-3 green.

HOLE 3

- Left of the tee box is a great place to view golf, as you are just on the other side of the practice tee, which means you can move back and forth to watch the third hole, as well as see players warm up. This elevated area provides a great line of sight.
- Extended mounding to the left of the green allows for great views of balls approaching the green and players putting.

HOLE 4

- Sit on the bulkhead around the water surrounding the green and dangle your feet (hold on to those flip-flops!).
- \blacksquare Lowered mounding for improved viewing on 4 tee.
- Expanded fan walkway.

HOLF 5

- Find great views of this tough par 4 from the elevated left side of the fairway, where you can also catch a glimpse of players practicing on the back tee of the upgraded driving range.
- Elevated mounding behind the green provides superior viewing angles.

HOLF 6

- This green isn't very crowded and offers a great place to catch the action up close.
- It's the perfect spot to be near players as they walk from the green to the No. 7 tee.

HOLE 7

■ The elevated mounding behind the green allows you to see all the way back to the tee box

HOLE 8

- Always a fan favorite, you can get close to the action when players hit their tee shots thanks to elevated mounding behind the green (and in the shade of nearby trees).
- The elevated mounds also allow fans to see shots land and players putt on this undulating green.
- The Fan Bleacher presented by ULTRA offers views of the eighth hole.

HOLE 9

- A great par 5 to watch players hit their tee shots and decide whether or not to go for the green in two.
- Significant amounts of foliage to the left of the green have been removed, and bleachers were added
- Mounding on 9 green allows you to have a better view of players' approach shots and putts.

HOIF 10

■ The elevated mounding behind the tee provides great views of players' tee shots, and you're just steps away from a permanent restroom.

HOLE 11

■ A fan favorite par 5 where players often go for the green in two, the green is surrounded by sand and water, which provides non-stop drama and excitement.

H01 F 12

- Elevated mounds around the tee provide excellent views of players hitting their tee shots. Will they go for the green or lay up?
- The mound near the green allows you to look back at the tee and approach shots, as well as over the green for up-close views.
- Additional mounding for improved viewing on 12 tee.

HOLE 13

- Fans directly behind the green may even see a ball or two roll through the green and end up in collection area just on the other side of the ropes from where they're sitting.
- The top of the mounding behind the green also provides a nice view of players teeing off on No. 14.

HOI F 14

■ A tough par 4 with great, elevated views behind the tee and the right side of the fairway. Errant tee shots to the right often end up right near fans.

HOLE 15

- This par 4 has elevated mounding on the left side of the green, providing good views of approach shots and putting.
- \blacksquare Additional mounding for improved viewing on 15 green.

HOLE 16

- The elevated mounding on the left side of the green provides an ideal vantage point for approach shots and putts, as well as a view of the 17th hole.
- This is one of the most iconic par 5s in all of golf, offering opportunities for eagles and birdies with accurate approach shots, but also bogeys and double bogeys with water looming down the right-hand side.

HOLE 17

- There is not a bad view of this legendary, Island Green par 3.
- This is a perfect spot to watch golf and then see players walk off the green and through the tunnel as they head to the 18th tee.

HOLE 18

- This finishing hole is one of the most difficult on the PGA TOUR, with water down the left side and an extremely narrow fairway.
- You'll find great views behind the tee and down the right side of the hole.
- The elevated area around the green is known as The Bluff, where courtesy folding chairs are provided at no charge, and if you're in your chair when the last putt drops at the end of the day, you can take it home for free!

Financial Focus: Don't let coronavirus infect investment strategy

As you know, the coronavirus has become a major health concern, not just in China, but in other parts of the world, too—and it's also shaken up the financial markets. As an individual investor, how concerned should you be? The impact of the

coronavirus on the markets isn't surprising. China is the world's second-largest economy, and when it experiences factory closures, supply chain disruptions and city lockdowns, the ripple effect on the world's other economies is considerable. Plus, the financial markets simply don't like uncertainty — and there's a lot of that associated with this outbreak and the efforts to contain it.

Nonetheless, instead of worrying over events you can't control, try to focus on what you can do in this investment climate. Here are a few suggestions:

- Don't panic. The coronavirus may well cause continued market volatility over the next several weeks, or even months. But it's important for investors to take a long-term view. Market corrections, typically defined as a drop in investment prices of 10% or more, are a fairly common occurrence, and we may have been overdue for one even before the coronavirus scare. In any case, it's generally a good idea not to radically revamp your investment strategy unless you experience a major change in your personal life, such as a significant career move, medical condition or change in family situation.
- Be aware of history. The coronavirus is certainly serious, but it's not the only viral outbreak we've seen in recent decades. During these earlier pandemics, the financial markets also took a hit, but they bounced back. For example, from late April 2003, in the midst of SARS (severe acute respiratory syndrome) until late April 2004, the S&P 500 rose about 21%.* And other large gains were recorded following the outbreak and decline of the Ebola and Zika viruses. Of course, the past performance of the markets in pandemic situations can't necessarily predict future market developments; every situation is

different, and over the next year, returns might be modest, as prices have already soared in the 11 years since they bottomed out during the financial crisis of 2008-09.

■ Don't try to time the market. We may well see coronavirus-based volatility in the near future — but volatility implies "ups" as well as "downs." If you try to

time the market by guessing at highs and lows, and then "buying high and selling low," you might get lucky once in a while, but you could just as easily miss the mark.

■ Keep a diversified portfolio. In addition to avoiding efforts to time the market, you should also stay away from trying to pick "winners" and "losers" among individual investments in the marketplace of viruses. Instead, try to build and maintain a diversified portfolio, consisting of an array of different asset classes, with the

allocation of these assets based on your risk tolerance and time horizon. Diversification doesn't prevent losses or guarantee profits in a declining market, but it may help reduce the impact of volatility on your portfolio.





Bartram Trail student's award-winning play to raise funds for Alzheimer's research

April 3 showing of 'Kittery' will benefit the Alzheimer's Association

For a high school student, Bartram Trail High School senior David Watt has achieved a great deal. Having received top honors for his original play, "Kittery," at the world's largest high school theatre festival, Watt is now an award-winning playwright. And he has chosen to use his talents to benefit others as a philanthropist as well.

On Friday, April 3, Watt will host a special showing of "Kittery" to raise funds to help eliminate the illness that inspired it — Alzheimer's disease.

"We become parents twice — once for our children, and once more for those who raised us," said Watt, who lost both a grandfather and grandmother to Alzheimer's disease. "With two affected family members on opposite sides of the east coast, I was able to feel what it was like to be in the center of a caregiving cycle and to be far from it at the same time."

The recipient of two "Best of Show" awards from both the district and state levels of the 2019 Florida State Thespians theatre competition, "Kittery" explores some of the challenges associated with caring for a loved one with dementia.

"The show is about a daughter who is paid to care for her father because no one else will, and she has troubles financially," Watt said. "After her brother comes to the house, he sees that she has done a poor job caring for both their father and the home they live in. He then resolves to remove her and put their father in a care center, the only place he believes is secure for him."

While adding that he hopes for as many people as possible to see the show, Watt said viewer discretion is advised.

"The show is heavily mature. There is strong language and adult content. It is not an easy watch and I feel this is necessary," he said. "By exposing the worst possible outcomes that disease can bring, I think we as a people can learn to empathize with the ideas of legacy and losing control of one's fate. These ideas can be intensely personal and cruel. I don't believe cen-

soring them can do an audience any favors."

All proceeds from the show will benefit the care, support and research programs of the Alzheimer's Association as part of the organization's annual The Longest Day fundraising initiative. Centered around the summer solstice — the day with the most sunlight — The Longest Day encourages Alzheimer's advocates around the world to combat the darkness of Alzheimer's through the fundraising activity of their choice. Though the event coincides with Alzheimer's and Brain Awareness Month in June, fundraising efforts continue throughout the calendar year.

"In Florida alone, there are more than 560,000 people living with Alzheimer's disease," said Carly Wille, The Longest Day development manager for the Central and North Florida Chapter of the Alzheimer's Association. "What many people don't realize, however, is that a dementia diagnosis can be life-changing for not only the diagnosed but their loved ones as well. As more than 1 million Floridians are currently caring for loved ones with Alzheimer's and other forms of dementia, it really is crucial that we continue to raise awareness and funds for a cure."

Watt's "In Memory of Kittery" fundraiser will take place at 7 p.m., April 3, at Bartram Trail High School, which is located at 7399 Longleaf Pine Parkway in Saint Johns. Moody Blues' Justin Hayward to perform at Ponte Vedra Concert Hall

Legendary Moody Blues frontman Justin Hayward will perform at the Ponte Vedra Concert Hall at 8 p.m. Monday, April 13 in a special concert with guest artist Mike Dawes.

Having chalked up more than 50 years in the music and entertainment industry, Hayward has a voice that has been heard the world over. As the principal vocalist, lead guitarist and composer for the Moody Blues, Hayward and the band sold 55 million albums and received numerous awards, garnering both commercial and critical success. Within the entertainment industry, observers say, the Moody Blues are renowned as innovators and trailblazers who influenced numerous fellow artists.

Having started the ball rolling as a songwriter in his own right with a couple of solo singles, Hayward joined the Moody Blues in the summer of 1966. Hitting his stride immediately with the single "Fly Me High," he followed it up with the classic hit songs "Nights in White Satin" and "Tuesday Afternoon" from the seminal album Days of Future Past. The album went on to become a favorite of the NASA astronauts and was taken aboard the Atlantis shuttle spacecraft by chief astronaut "Hoot" Gibson on many missions.

When the Moody Blues took a break



from touring in 1975, Hayward worked on the Blue Jays' album, followed by the hit single "Blue Guitar." Although the Moodies continued to record and tour, Hayward also found time to create several solo albums: Songwriter, Night Flight, Moving Mountain and The View From the Hill. Proving that he could write hits outside of the Moody Blues, he hit the Top 10 glob-




