
stopped at the scene showed signs of damage.

Diners gathered early as the sun sank into the horizon to enjoy dinner on the veranda. Nearby, the elevated lawn slowly filled with revelers.


Carolers sang holiday favorites, and friendly staff poured cups of hot cocoa and set out special cookies.

When people purchase a piece, they leave my studio with a huge smile on their face. Then each and every time they see their purchase, they smile again and again!

## What are some of the challenges that your industry/company is facing?

Most of our work is done through in-person sales in our studio at 5150 Palm Valley Road, Suite 406 and at festivals and art events around Florida. All of our retail festivals and events have been postponed this year, due to the pandemic, and most of our wholesale events have either been postponed or have gone virtual. We are looking forward to big things in 2021, just like everyone else! We have events planned at the Clearwater Marine Aquarium in Clearwater, Party for the Planet at the Miami Zoo and the Right Whale Festival in Amelia Island.

## What are your primary roles/responsibilities?

## What do you enjoy most about Ponte Vedra area?





The program will include an insider tour of the pediatric Critical Care Tower that is under construction with hospital President Michael Aubin.




Funds raised from the 2020 Art & Antiques Show will support a \$4 million gift to endow programs, services and equipment for a state-of-the-art Neonatal Intensive Care Center, currently under construction as part of the new Critical Care Tower at Baptist Medical Center in downtown Jacksonville. The new tower is expected to open in February 2022.

Since 1973, The Women's Board of Wolfson Children's has raised \$34 million for the hospital to support behavioral health, minimally invasive surgery, the bone marrow transplant unit and other critical needs.

# Music and more to delight visitors during special Lightner event

The sounds of the season will permeate the Lightner Museum on two special nights in December as the iconic St. Augustine institution welcomes the public to "Music in the Museum: Holiday Nights at the Lightner."

During the ticketed event, the St. Augustine Orchestra will perform festive music throughout the museum — in the grand lobby, in the music room and in the historic casino of the former Alcazar Hotel.

Visitors will be able to enjoy the music as they shop for unique holiday gifts, tour the museum or enjoy drinks on the garden terrace.

Those traveling to the Nation's Oldest City to take in its Nights of Lights spectacle may want to include the museum event in their visit.

Visitors who haven't been to the Lightner Museum since the pandemic struck may want to stop by the new stainedglass exhibit on the mezzanine above the old pool. The new gallery space features 12 recently restored stainedglass windows and a dramatic dragonfly lamp by Tiffany Studios.

Following Hurricane Matthew, museum staff discovered that several pieces in the stained-glass window collection had sustained water damage and needed stabilization. The windows were carefully removed and restored. They are exhibited in light boxes that allow each to be illuminated from behind and show off their brilliant colors.



Tropical storm Eta helped to uncover the remains of a shipwreck buried under a dune along Crescent Beach.

Mark O'Donoghue, a local resident, was walking along the beach on Saturday, Nov. 14, and saw the exposed timbers. Returning on Sunday, Nov. 15, he saw more of the timbers uncovered by the waves and reached out to the St. Augustine Lighthouse Archaeological Maritime Program (LAMP) Director Chuck Meide. The LAMP team began inspecting and documenting the shipwreck on Sunday.

The LAMP team believes that the ship was likely an American merchant ship carrying commodities like hardware or flour. More than 70% of all known historic shipwrecks lost in Florida are merchant vessels participating in the coastal trade

moving goods from one coastal port to another along the Atlantic coast. Dating the ship is a bit tricky. However, Meide believes it to date back to the 1800s.

"Everything we've seen on it so far fits that hypothesis; wooden planking, wood timbers, iron fasteners," Meide said. "They look quite similar to other ships from the 1800s that we have seen."

As the research arm of the St. Augustine Lighthouse & Maritime Museum, LAMP has helped to identify several shipwrecks with the most recent coming ashore in March 2018 on Ponte Vedra Beach





Several bags of trash were collected along with several large items.



continue its survey work and take samples of the timbers and iron work. Flagler College students will also be working with LAMP to properly document and record the shipwreck, gaining field experience in archaeology.

"Florida's maritime past is America's story as the nation's oldest port dating back to the Spanish landing in 1565," said Kathy Fleming, executive director of St. Augustine Lighthouse & Maritime Museum. 

# Vicar's Landing at Oak Bridge to break ground in early 2021

An expansion of Vicar's Landing has been in the works for nearly five years, and now it is about to become a reality.

Developers for the retirement community's new campus, Vicar's Landing at Oak Bridge, are expected to break ground early in 2021, with phase one construction beginning by mid-year.

"We're really excited about where we are and what's to come," said CEO Bruce Jones.

Public enthusiasm for the project is very high. Even before Vicar's Landing could begin marketing the expansion, word of mouth generated a strong waiting list.

"We have experienced a significant increase in demand in recent years and have a waiting list of more than 280 people," Jones said. "Furthermore, factors such as the public health crisis of 2020 have likely heightened seniors' desire for safety, security and access to high-quality health care. The Vicar's Landing lifestyle provides this and so much more with our team's exceptional service and numerous activities so residents can continue to live life to the fullest."

Vicar's Landing at Oak Bridge received approval from the state in October to officially begin the project.

More than 50% of the 76 residential units in phase one have already been sold. These represent a combination of cottages and apartment homes. Phase one, which will include a 21,000-square-foot clubhouse, is expected to be completed by June 2022

Total build-out is expected to be complete by 2025, though Jones said the construction timeline would be compressed if the surge in demand continues.

In all, there will be 235 units in the gated community, including 175 for independent living, 42 assisted-living units and 18 memory-care units. Independent living units are available in duplex and triplex cottages with garages or in four-story apartment buildings over covered parking. They will range in size from about 1,400 to 2,400 square feet and will feature two bedrooms, a den and two or more bathrooms.



The new campus will be located no more than half a mile from the existing one and will have nearly 30 acres of natural, undeveloped landscape. There will be a fitness center, card room, large village green area for outdoor games and a full-sized, heated swimming pool.

There will be transportation between campuses and some new dining options.

"We anticipate residents from the main campus going over to the Oak Bridge campus for dinner, for events, and vice versa," Jones said.

The main campus has a fine-dining restaurant and a café. The new campus will offer a main dining room with the focus somewhere between these two, as well as a lounge area adjacent to the pool for tapas-style fare.

Residents of the new campus will have access to amenities on the flagship campus, which was founded more than 30 years ago. These include an auditorium, worship center, classes and other programming.

Vicar's Landing offers access to skilled nursing care and a wellness clinic. Residents are enrolled in the Life Care benefit program, which provides not just a home, but meals, activities, security, transportation, housekeeping and maintenance.

"Anything they will need through the rest of their lives," said Jones

Entrance to Vicar's Landing at Oak Bridge will be off State Road A1A, just north of Sawgrass Village.

The total project investment is \$162 million, and the expansion campus will result in the creation of 100 permanent jobs.

"We're just really excited about this project and being able to expand our reach to meet the demand that we have here in Ponte Vedra Beach," said Jones.





## Husbands usually don't consider their wives' future when deciding when to take Social Security benefits

The amount of Social Security benefits a surviving spouse receives depends, in part, on when their deceased spouse began claiming benefits. However, husbands usually don't take survivor's benefits into account when claiming ben-

efits, according to a recent study, meaning that many widows will needlessly experience a significant drop in income.

Because women typically live longer than men and men are often the higher earners, most married women will be widowed and will have their income drop below what they need to maintain their accustomed standard of living. The spouse of a worker who has died is entitled to the worker's full retirement benefits once reaching full retirement age. If the worker delayed retirement, the survivor's benefit will be higher.

Husbands have the option of increasing their surviving spouse's income by delaying Social Security benefits, but according to a study by the Center for Retirement Research at Boston College, most husbands do not take their wives' future needs into consideration.

The study looked at whether greater awareness of Social Security survivor's benefits would affect claiming decisions. The study found that husbands tend to take more immediate concerns into consideration, such as their health and whether they have another pension, rather than their wives' survivor's benefits. Giving the husbands information about how they could improve their wives' financial well-being by claiming benefits later did not change their claiming decisions.

The study concludes that in order to protect widows, the government should consider providing survivor's benefits in a way that doesn't tie the surviving spouse's benefits to the decision of when to claim benefits.

As things stands now, however, if you are the higher earner and are nearing retirement, you may want to take into account how your decision on when to claim benefits will affect your spouse if he or she survives you.


Leading up to the event, Cypress Village already raised a few thousand dollars for charity, but after the silent auction and more generous donations, they were able to reach the \$10,000 mark.

## Healthy eating options for seniors

"Let food be thy medicine" is a quote attributed to Hippocrates, the ancient scholar considered to be the father of modern medicine. The saying relates to the notion that what people put in their bodies can heal and/or prevent certain conditions

For seniors with medicine cabinets full of over-the-counter and prescription

medications, the idea of relying predominantly on food to promote optimal health may be tempting, and various foods can be particularly useful to the 50-and-over demographic.

According to the World Health Organization, poor diet is a major contributor

to many of the diseases that affect older people. Poor diet has been connected to the development of diabetes, and degenerative diseases such as osteoporosis also may be linked to the foods ones eat. The National Council for Aging Care says micronutrient deficiency is often a problem among the aging due to factors like lack of variety in diet and reduced food intake. Eating a variety of foods can provide all of the nutrients people need to stay healthy as they get older. Certain foods may be particularly helpful.

- Brain-friendly foods: Foods such as avocado, leafy vegetables, sunflower seeds, blueberries and salmon are good sources of vitamin E, antioxidants, omega-3 fatty acids and other nutrients that may help ward off dementias like Alzheimer's disease, advises Sonas Home Health Care.
- Anti-inflammatory foods: Foods rich in omega-3 fatty acids may help prevent inflammation that can cause cancer and rheumatoid arthritis. Aging.com says foods that are high in omega-3 fatty acids, like salmon, should be consumed at least twice per week.
- **Fruits and vegetables:** Fresh, canned or frozen produce tend to be high in micronutrients, including a variety of important vitamins that are essential for all components of health. The Academy

- of Nutrition and Dietetics advises eating dark green vegetables, such as leafy greens or broccoli, and orange vegetables, such as carrots and sweet potatoes.
- **Energy-boosters:** Choose whole grains that can provide sustained energy by way of healthy carbohydrates over processed grains.
- Bone-friendly foods: Calcium-rich foods, such as milk, yogurt and cheese, can prevent calcium from being leached from the bones, which contributes to conditions like osteoporosis.
- **■** Digestive system-friendly foods: The digestive system slows down as the body ages, as the walls of the gastrointestinal tract thicken and digestive contractions that push waste along may slow down and become fewer. Foods rich in fiber can promote proper digestion by moving food through the digestive tract more easily. High-fiber foods also may help naturally reduce blood cholesterol levels.
- **High-iron foods:** Without enough iron in the body, a person may feel tired and lethargic from a reduced production of hemoglobin, which carries oxygen in the blood from the lungs to the rest of the body. A lack of oxygen in body tissues from anemia can be serious, says the National Council for Aging Care. Tofu, spinach, lentils, pumpkin seeds, and fortified breads and cereals are high

# COA announces holiday 'non-event' fundraiser for Care Connection Program

When seniors need assistance and there is no funding available for the help they need, where can they turn?

Luckily, seniors in St. Johns County can turn to a program from the nonprofit Council on Aging called Care Connection. The program provides a wide range of services that help seniors maintain their independence and quality of life at home, rather than being compelled by difficult circumstances to enter assisted living.

Care Connection is entirely powered by donors and volunteers from the community. And so, each year, COA typically rings in the holiday season with a festive fundraising event at River House called "Christmas on the River" to generate the funds necessary to run the program.

This year, however, the annual event has been forced to turn to an alternative format due to COVID-19 concerns.

"We're calling it the non-event of the season," said Tom Torretta, the Council's development director. "This year, instead of buying an outfit, hiring a sitter or missing the game, we're asking the community to please donate their ticket value to Care Connection and make sure this program will continue to be available. We're also

asking our business sponsors in the community to please continue to be there for the vulnerable elders the program serves."

Services provided through the program include minor home repairs; grab-bar installation; lawn services; help applying for energy assistance, food stamps and Medicare; and the construction of wheelchair ramps.

The program also provides assistive devices – such as wheelchairs – and pet food, so that elders will not need to sacrifice their own meals to feed their pets.

"The sense of security and safety provided by a grab bar, expertly installed by our minor home repairs team, or the continued pride a senior can take in their home after their lawn is freshly mowed by our cutters-and-clippers crew is immeasurable," Council staff member Michael Large said. "We also offer peace of mind to family members who may live across the country."

The sole staff member, Large coordinates the program, working with approximately 60 volunteers to see that seniors receive the critical help they need.

In 2019, some of the work accomplished by dedicated volunteers and generous supporters included building 11 wheelchair ramps; providing 200 assistive devices like wheelchairs, walkers and shower chairs; installing more than 50 sets of grab bars; maintaining an average of 75 lawns per month; successfully submitting 75 food stamp applications for seniors in need; and delivering 1,900 pounds of pet food.

"Care Connection is truly a community effort," explained Council Executive Director Becky Yanni. "Unfortunately, COVID-19 has not diminished the needs seniors have for assistance. On the contrary, the community's support is even more important to their well-being and safety now."

## Retirees: Know your tax forms, or else!

There are so many tax forms out there with more numbers and letters than Carter had liver pills (remember that one)? It's almost impossible to tell if they are talking about a "Star Wars" character or a tax form anymore.

However, there are those we are expected to know and probably don't know. For instance, the ol' Form 1099-R. This represents money you've taken from a retirement account, annuity, profit-sharing plan, IRA, insurance contracts or a pension. But ... it also may include a direct transfer or rollover of a retirement account (thataway to keep it confusing ol' IRS).

A copy of this little beauty is sent to the IRS, so it is kind of important that it is accurate and included on the tax return. This form must be issued by Jan. 31 of the year following the distribution or you can be beheaded (not really, just not a good thing).

Because the Form 1099-R covers so many types of distributions it's important to inspect each one for errors, which are not uncommon. Errors on this form can come directly out of your pocket. The last thing we need to do is overpay

Then there is good ol' Form 5498, which will detail the funds that have been rolled over and when new monies have been contributed to an IRA, Roth IRA, SEP or a SIMPLE plan. (This includes re-characterized contributions as well.)

Form 5498 also lets the IRS know which IRA owners are taking required minimum distributions (RMDs). There's a cute little box on this form which the IRA custodian must check off to signify this action. This little doozy is not filed with your tax return. It just lets the IRS

know there was a distribution from a retirement account. If you've rolled over money from an account from work you will also receive a 1099-R but you will also receive the 5498 from the new custodian to verify it being a non-taxable event.

What the heck is a 72-t payment you may ask? A 72-t is a way for folks under 59½ to tap into their IRA's without paying the 10% penalty. The strategy applies only to IRA's selected and the payments must continue for five years or until the participate reaches the age of 591/2, whichever is longer. There are three types of payout plans available, so you must study these carefully before triggering the payments. If you violate the terms of the payment plan, then they chop off your arm (just kidding again). The IRS will impose the 10% penalty on the entire amount, whether you've taken it or not. So ... no modifications once a plan of payment is selected, right? Right!

Lastly, it's the Form 8915-E, Qualified Disaster Retirement Plan Distributions and Repayment. This will be used to identify a COVID-related distribution (CRD) from a retirement account before

the age of 50½, therefore scooting by the 10% penalty on early withdrawals from retirement accounts. However, you must be a qualified individual to get this exemption.

OK class, tax lesson is over for now. It's time for recess and a glass of wine.





## Jags rally but 2-point conversion fails in 27-25 loss to Browns

The Cleveland Browns shut the door on Jacksonville's attempted two-point conversion with 2:14 to play and denied the Jaguars another opportunity with a 27-25 win last Sunday at TIAA Bank Field.

In his first start since 2017, Jaguars' quarterback Mike Glennon completed 20-of-35 passes for 235 yards and two touchdowns with zero picks including a 46-yard TD strike to receiver Collin Johnson.

"I thought Mike [Glennon] made some good throws, some accuracy throws. I think he took some shots which I was happy with," said Jaguars head coach Doug Marrone. "I think it was a little rough, obviously he hasn't played a game since I think '17 or '18. I think there was a lot of good things."

Johnson caught four passes for a career-high and teambest 96 yards. His 46-yard touchdown reception in the first quarter marked the second-longest TD by a Jaguars player in 2020 and the longest TD reception by a Jaguars rookie since Keelan Cole Sr. caught a 73-yard pass in 2017

Jacksonville linebacker Joe Schobert, playing against his former team for the first time, forced the first fumble of his Jaguars career in the third quarter, which safety Andrew Wingard returned for 17 yards.

Even with three years before graduation, Guarnera said it's never too early to start thinking about the next step — college football. on the basketball floor for the Sharks.

"I'm trying to get my name out there with football coaches," Guarnera said. "I want to get into a good college and keep playing."

"I know it's early to start thinking about it, but I'd like to play [college] football in the Carolinas," Guarnera said. "It's not too far from home, but it's still not too close.
