



Rubber ducks took center stage as the Rotary Club of Ponte Vedra partnered with Learn to Read of St. Johns County to hold its annual Rubber Duck Race May 22.

The event raised about \$20,000, with \$12,000 of that donated to Learn to Read of St. Johns County, while the remaining amount goes toward benefiting other local charitable organizations the Rotary Club of Ponte Vedra is associated with.

Roughly 3,000 rubber ducks were dumped from a frontend loader off of the

County Road 210 bridge near Palm Valley Outdoors Bar & Grill.

"As the ducks were being dumped, I was looking around and every person from the restaurant was out on the deck watching it take place," said Joe Cinney, executive director at Learn to Read of St. Johns County.

Although the event has been going on for eight years, it was only the second year to be held at that location, after previously taking place on the lazy river at Nocatee Splash Waterpark.

Cinney thanked Palm Valley Outdoors

for supporting the event, along with the other local businesses that helped by presenting prizes that were awarded to the public.

"The whole thing takes about nine months of planning and logistics that have to be in place," said Gary Smith, the club's event chair for the race.

According to Smith, it was quite a sight to see thousands of rubber ducks cascading off the 85-foot-tall bridge into the intracoastal.

"That was my vision for this event when we started thinking about the move three years ago," Smith said. "Rotary began helping Learn to Read put on the event four years ago."

After hitting the water, the ducks floated down the Intracoastal with help from the current toward the finish line.

According to Cinney, the top 30 finishers received prizes, with this year's top prize being a pair of roundtrip tickets to anywhere Southwest Airlines flies to.

Although it rained some as setup for the event was taking place, the rain held off and the weather conditions became ideal for the drop and the race.

## **COA centenarian luncheons return after two-year hiatus**

The St. Johns County Council on Aging hosted a centenarian luncheon at THE PLAYERS Community Senior Center May 19 for the first time in two years.

The room was full of wisdom and interesting stories, as the COA honored residents 100 years of age, as well as a large contingent of attendees 90 years of age or older.

"The idea behind it is that we want to honor and celebrate the oldest residents in our community," COA Executive Director Becky Yanni said. "We honor them, because they are the generation that really fought, defended and built this great nation that we get to enjoy today. We owe them gratitude and respect."

A total of 24 residents were honored during the event, which made its return

after a two-year hiatus due to concerns with the COVID-19 pandemic.

Six of those were in the centenarian club, with the oldest being Charlotte Pichotta at 102 years old.

"These centenarians are so inspiring, and they have such good spirits," Yanni said. "They're an example that gives us hope for our own lives. It's like each individual is a walking library."

Pichotta and all the other centenarians were asked "What is your secret to a long life?"

According to Pichotta, remembering to be good and kind to each other has made a huge difference in her life.

Howard Renforth credited his 30 years of military service for giving him the mindset needed to live so long.

"I said, 'If I made it through World War II, I'd make it through anything,"" Renforth said.

However, staying active throughout the years was Josephine Trinca's secret offered to the crowd for a long and healthy life.

There was a definite feeling of excitement by everyone who attended and an overall joy and thankfulness to have the opportunity to be together and share in each other's company once again.

"Sadly, we were not able to do it for a couple of years due to the vulnerability of

## As told to Shaun Ryan

## Tell me about Happy Trails 4x4. What kinds of services and products does it offer?

Happy Trails 4x4 started out as a Jeep specialty shop focusing on restorations, custom builds for the local Jeep dealerships as well as retail customers. We do everything from your basic maintenance needs to extreme modifications. We have recently added education and hands-on training to our lineup. We help educate our customers and others that want to learn about taking their 4x4 vehicles on offroad adventures.

## Tell me about your background. How did you develop an interest in this type of work? What kind of education did you need to become a Jeep specialist?

I have always had a passion for the automotive industry! When I was in high school, I worked for an automotive shop that focused on sports cars (not Jeeps). Back then I learned about Ford Panteras, and today I am teaching about the relationship between tire size and gear ratios. My educational background was hands-on for the automotive side of things. As for the business I graduated from Georgia Southern University with a bachelor's in business management and finance. For me, the business side of things just comes naturally, and I love it.

## I see you are a board member for the Wildlife Rescue of Northeast Florida. Can you tell me about your role and your interest in this cause?

My love for animals runs very deep! I have been on the board of directors for the Wildlife Rescue Coalition of Northeast Florida for 13 years. We support the local wildlife in our area. Our goal is to ensure respect for all wildlife through education and conservation while providing orphaned, injured and displaced animals with a second chance at life. I have played several roles throughout the years, but mostly I have fostered orphans, released the rehabilitated and attend board meetings. Our local animal control relies on us to help release captured wildlife since they cannot even bring them inside. I have picked up many racoons and opossum sitting in the summer heat in a cage outside of animal control offices in our area. We make sure they are released to a safe open environment where they have room to be wild. This organization is so important to our community, yet most people never know until they need us.

## I also learned that you were a lead sponsor of the Run with a Mission race in February. What can you tell me about Faithful Servant Mission and this event in particular?

Happy Trails 4x4, one of my companies, is the title sponsor each year for Run with a Mission. This is a race held each year now for the last nine years to support Faithful Servant Missions, a locally based mission. I personally fell in love with this mission in 2014 when I was blessed to be a part of a women's focused team. The driving mission here is to improve the spiritual, educational and physical health of those we serve. Breaking the cycle of poverty through education and growing relationships with Jesus Christ. I have seen firsthand that it truly works!

## You have also led mission trips to Costa Rica with Faithful Servant Mission, and you even provide a weather tracker Jeep. How did you get involved in this effort, and what can you tell readers about your experiences with it?

Yes, I have led several mission teams to Costa Rica over the past eight years. I have also joined other teams there to keep the momentum going with the community we serve.

This weather tracker Jeep was here is Jacksonville. We built this Jeep initially for one of our local dealerships then the news team purchased it to be upgraded for the weather tracker. Over the years of its service in our local community we have done lots of upgrades to accommodate all the equipment that is required. Our staff at Happy Trails 4x4 loved seeing all the technology on board!

## What do you like most about living in Northeast Florida?

I love Northeast Florida because of its Southern charm!

## How do you like to spend your free time?

Free time for me is so precious and limited so I try to make the most out of it. That usually means packing it full! # **D-Day remembrance** New York Butcher

The We Can Be Heroes Foundation is planning a D-Day remembrance brunch for 11 a.m. Saturday, June 4, with a presentation honoring World War II veterans to follow. A meet-and-greet precedes the brunch at 10:30 a.m. The event takes place at the Salem Centre Auditorium, 7235 Bentley Road in Jacksonville.

Guest of honor will be D-Day Purple Heart veteran Frank Purpura. The keynote speaker will be Capt. James Ransom III, Ret. USN, historian and nominee for Unsung Hero recognition.

On the evening of June 5, 1944, Purpura was aboard LST 356 while his ship and many others loaded men, supplies and ammunition and began their deployment to France's beaches in terrible stormy weather for the invasion on June 6, 1944. Omaha Beach was their first stop.

Purpura, then just 18, was a Higgins boat driver that unloaded soldiers on the beaches. While en route to the beach on his first trip he was struck above his right eye with shrapnel from flying debris. He was patched up and quickly returned to his duty. He then made more than 50 trips between Utah, Sword and the other beaches delivering the men, ammunition

and supplies.

LST 356 participated in several different actions, earning three battle stars.

Today, Purpura actively serves as the oldest Patriot of the Military Order of the Purple Heart Chapter 524, marching in Veteran's Day parades, leading and helping with fundraising and holding chapter meetings in his home when the current facility was under repair.

Ransom is an adjunct professor for the Naval War College's College of Distance Education, teaching the Strategy & War Fleet Seminar in Mayport.

Among those in attendance will be veterans, Unsung Heroes, Atlantic Coast Young Marines and the Let Freedom Sing Choir.

Tickets are \$25, or a six-person table for \$135, an eight-person table for \$175. Veterans and Gold Star families will receive a 10% discount.



## Program helps seniors when emergencies arise

The St. Johns County Council on Aging can help senior citizens dealing with emergency situations thanks to the Emergency Food and Shelter Program in place.

According to COA Program Director Sharon Gesek, the program has been around for a long time and has been very effective for the county.

Although the program is under the guidance of the Federal Emergency Management Agency, it is categorized as the "emergency" portion handled by the agency, which is separate from the "disaster" classification that FEMA is often associated with when natural disasters

"We are governed by FEMA, but our local board is the United Way," Gesek said. "They've been a great partnership."

There are about 11 nonprofits in the county that take advantage of the program, with each focusing on various segments of the population, such as teens, veterans or families.

For COA, the concentration is on helping residents 60 years of age and older.

However, Gesek stated that the COA still works closely with the other non-

profits to ensure that no resident is being overlooked.

"People may find themselves in an emergency situation for a variety of reasons, but the need for help remains the same," Gesek said.

One of the things she likes most about the program is how simple it can make it for people to find the help they need at a quicker rate.

"It is definitely a quick turnaround," Gesek said. "We can approve them that day, if they have all the proper paperwork completed."

The program is in place to help older adults who are having trouble paying their bills and may be in danger of losing their house or having the electricity cut off. Up to \$500 can be paid on their current or past due utility bills and rent or mortgage.

To qualify for the program, the person must be a resident of St Johns County and 60 years of age or older, and currently earning less than:


- \$25,520 per year for a single individual
- \$34,480 per year for a household of 2
- Add \$8,960 for each additional nousehold member

"We want to get the word out and



make sure seniors in St. Johns County know about the EFSP program," said Michael Large, who coordinates the program through the Care Connection division of COA. "If they find themselves in this emergency situation, they should contact us."



## Pageant winner finds purpose in disability

# Speaker inspires others with her keys to resilience

Sara Gaver has proven everybody wrong.

Born with a rare disability called arthrogryposis multiplex congenital, she has not had the use of her arms, hands, legs or feet.

From the start, naysayers predicted that there were many things she would never be able to do. But Gaver has not allowed those people to define her. Today, the young woman drives, lives independently in her own home, has earned a degree from the University of North Florida, has a fulltime job with a software company, cooks, paints and is the current reigning Ms. Wheelchair Florida USA.

"My favorite part is to turn back around to those people and say, 'I proved you wrong. Thank you very much. Now, let's not do this to the next person," she said.

Gaver shared the keys to her resilience Tuesday, May 17, during a program at the link in Nocatee titled "The Heart of Inspiration." She shared the stage with licensed therapist Dr. Cheralyn Leeby. The women had met through a shared interest – both are writing books.

Leeby praised Gaver's "grit and resilience."

"The more I learn about everything that you do and all your struggles through social media and other avenues, I'm just like: Wow, you're really educating us on how to be resilient," Leeby said.

Gaver said pageants she's been involved with helped her discover her confidence and hopes her success will inspire others.

"I just want the next little girl and next little boy to say, 'You know what? She did it. I can do it,'" she said. "When I was a little girl, there was no role model for me."

This ties in to one of six steps she has followed to becoming self-resilient: finding a sense of purpose.

"I'm a very faith-based woman," she explained. "I love my church. And I absolutely believe that God made us the way that we're supposed to be. I don't ever pray to be healed, because it's how I'm supposed to be. If I wasn't who I am, I can't give you the message I'm giving you today because I wouldn't live the same life."

That Gaver embraces her condition as a gift to be used for good resonated with Leeby, who called that "a really big key to resilience."


Other steps in Gaver's process include: surrounding yourself with people who support you, believing in your abilities, nurturing yourself, embracing change and establishing goals. In this final step, she recommended establishing small goals on the way to bigger goals; this allows a person to see the progress.

Gaver's children's book, yet to be published, is about a princess who shares her disability, her mother's guidance and how she deals with a community that tells her what she can't do. Gaver hopes it will inspire Disney to introduce its first princess in a wheelchair.

She will compete for Ms. Wheelchair USA on July 10-18 at the pageant in Stow, Ohio.

Also Tuesday, Leeby discussed three books to which she has contributed, "The Courageous Heart," "The Grateful Soul" and "Everyday Hope." She and Amy Maughan also lead a regular program at the link called A Writer's Journey. They are currently collaborating on a book titled "Artichoke Alchemy: A Journey to the Heart," which focuses on self-discovery and therapy.

Each honored centenarian was presented with a rose, certificate and a procla-





# North Florida continues to attract prospective homeowners

As we progress through the second quarter of 2022, the U.S. housing market continues to report record home prices and low inventory. While these trends continue, there is a sense that the massive home price growth rate may slow in the pear future.

According to Lawrence Yun, chief economist for the National Association of Realtors, "Prices throughout the country have surged for the better part of two years, including in the first part of 2022. Given the extremely low rate of inventory, we are unlikely to see prices decline, but appreciation should slow in the coming months."

Inflation concerns and recent rises in interest rates have the potential to curtail demand. As of early May, the average rate of a 30-year fixed mortgage has risen more than 2% to 5.42%. These rising rates limit the borrowing power of potential buyers, which could result in a reduction in home demand.

This March, pending home sales dropped 8.2% when compared to the prior March. Despite these factors, home prices continue to rise. The median

national home price in March rose 16.8% compared to March of 2021. The key mantra for real estate, of course, is "location, location, location," and we all know that North Florida is the greatest place to live in the country.

Our combination of favorable tax structure, excellent business economy, job and wage growth, sandy beaches and sunny skies make us an extremely desirable place to live and work. In 2021, the Jacksonville area saw the second highest "Net Migration In" figure of all large cities in the U.S., behind only Austin, Texas. This measures the number of new people moving into an area, minus the number of people moving out of the area. These new inhabitants to our area, along with our local population that is changing homes, continues to drive demand for our limited inventory of houses.

This is particularly true of the Ponte Vedra/Nocatee area and is reflected in our local statistics. The median home price in March for a home in the Ponte Vedra/Nocatee area rose to \$722,500, up more than \$87,000 from \$635,000 in March of 2021.

Other key statistics that impact the Ponte Vedra/Nocatee include:

- 41.5% of homes closed in March received over the actual list price
- 118 homes closed in March, down 29.8% from March of 2021.
- 117 homes moved into pending status, down from 23.5% from March 2021
- 131 new listings hit the market in March, down 17.1% from the prior March
- At the end of March, there were 140 active homes on the market, a reduction of 22.7% from the prior year.

Our area continues to exhibit a strong seller's market. The current home supply gives the area 1.2 months of inventory, vastly below the six-month supply that is considered a balanced market.

However, this monthly supply is up 10.2% from the same time last year. (Source: Northeast Florida Association of Realtors).

The housing market has always been cyclical and remains one of the safest places for anyone to invest their money. In addition to the pride of owning one's own home and the savings in rent,



coupled with the growth in equity, make home ownership advantageous for most people.

While there are no guarantees, historically a home grows in value by roughly 4% per year. Whether you are considering buying or selling a home, this is a wonderful time to do it; and there is no better location than North Florida and the Ponte Vedra/Nocatee area.

## OVEN-ROASTED SEA BASS WITH GINGER LIME SAUCE AND ROASTED ASPARAGUS

(Prep: 10 min. Cook: 12 min. 2 servings)

- 2 Tbsp fresh-squeezed lime juice
- 2 Tbsp Bragg's Liquid Aminos or Coconut Aminos
- 1 Tbsp chopped fresh cilantro
- 1 Tbsp chopped, peeled fresh ginger root
- 1 Tbsp minced shallot
- 5 Tbsp olive oil
- 2, 6-ounce sea bass filets (each about ¾ inch thick)
- 1 bunch fresh asparagus, tough ends removed
- Salt and pepper to taste
- 1-2 tsp Garlic and Herb Mrs. Dash

#### **Directions:**

Preheat oven to 450 F. Mix the first 5 ingredients and 4 teaspoons of oil in a small bowl.

Brush a 9-inch diameter glass pie dish (or rimmed baking sheet) with remaining 2 teaspoons of oil. If using a baking sheet, line with parchment paper or foil. Arrange fish in prepared dish; turn to coat. Sprinkle fish with salt and pepper; spoon 1 Tbsp sauce over each filet.

Toss asparagus in a little olive oil, salt, pepper and Mrs. Dash. On a small, separate baking sheet (or can add asparagus to same pan as sea bass), arrange asparagus so they do not overlap, and roast with the sea bass for the remaining 6 minutes for perfectly crisp-tender.

Roast fish until just opaque in center, about 12 minutes. Top fish with remaining sauce and serve.



Albufeira is in the Algarve region of Portugal and it checked many of the boxes (and created some new, unknown boxes) we wanted to check in finding a second home. For starters the weather is ideal for our lifestyle, 60-degree mornings and 80-degree afternoons, no humidity, no cloud — and no bugs! The natural beauty of the landscape is postcard like. The beaches are world famous, and there are 87 Blue Flag beaches in the Algarve alone.

The people are warm and welcoming; we felt right at home immediately. The lifestyle is simple and absurdly affordable. We literally walk everywhere and don't have a car. A fantastic dinner out including a bottle of wine may cost \$35-\$40. I'd go on but I'm afraid more people will want to move here and spoil our secret!

OK, so for these reasons, in some type of COVID insanity, we began exploring homes through an app that allowed us visibility to any properties for sale within our search parameters. We kept an open mind about the current home layout as we remodel homes for a living and figured we could do the same

on any place we might buy. We did hear some horror stories about remodeling in a foreign country even when you were physically there, so doing this remotely would seem slightly insane, but undeterred we plowed on.

We spoke to 10-plus different realtors and saw a few properties via virtual tour on WhatsApp. The buying experience was a learning one. For instance, there is no real equivalent of Multiple Listings in Portugal. Also, appraisals and inspections are not always part of the formalized process. And contractors don't need to have a license or pass any certifications!

These are reasons why you need a top-notch real estate agent, and boy did we find one in Matthew Theunis with Divine Home. Not only did he go to the property for WhatsApp video calls anytime we needed, he connected us to a local attorney (to handle the documents and closing), a remodeling contractor and a property manager to look after the place when we were not there. With all this now in place we closed on our flat and began the next phase — remodeling remotely!

Open floor plans are not the norm in the Algarve. Galley kitchens, large tile floors, big wooden built-in wardrobes and smaller showers are. Having the vision to see past these minor obstacles and focus on the desired end game, we started to think more about location.

Having spent a month in Albufeira prior to our search was a huge advantage. Our contractor spoke minimal English (but he could email some!), but with Matthew's help on WhatsApp video calls we were able to get specs and measurements for the flat. Kelly was able to do 2D floor plans, and we were off and running.

Down came the wall isolating the kitchen from the dining and living areas. Same for all the entry way series of doors ... gone. We wanted to soften the tile floors in the flat, so we installed luxury vinyl floors throughout. We also increased the size of the master shower by 50% and painted the entire place to brighten it up.

Since Kelly Canada Design + Build + Interiors has its roots in interior design, the real signature touches came when Matthew was able to connect Kelly with Simple Taste, a furnishings company in Albufeira. Kelly was able to do the 2D layouts and choose all-new furniture, lighting, window coverings and accessories. The associates at Simple Taste even took fabric samples over to our flat, to show via WhatsApp how they would look with the flooring

and drapes! If that wasn't enough, the team actually installed all the furniture, window coverings and even the lighting fixtures without an added expense. Not something you experience in the states for sure.

There are some language differences we needed to solve for in remodeling jargon, but one of the biggest differences is the need to convert all your thinking to the metric system, even for the size of a bed, which are not standard U.S. sizes.

We did also bring over four large suitcases of items not readily available in the E.U., like down-based pillows and mattress toppers. These work exceptionally well when you utilize the electric shutters that essentially black out the bedroom at night!

All included, our remodeling investment was about 50% of what it would have taken in the U.S., we now have an amazing, open flat, which is our Happy Place, and also is ideally situated as a launching pad to all of western Europe. Some called us crazy for investing overseas, many more thought this when we did it remotely and over a cell phone, but with the right vision and team around us it worked our perfectly!

# Mosquito Control: Why should you care?

As most know, 2022 is an election year, and we citizens are called to vote on everything from who is going to represent us in Congress and in the Senate to which individuals will represent us in seemingly obscure and often misunderstood local elections.

One of the most obscure and least understood races will be the Anastasia Mosquito Control District (AMCD) Board of Commissioners elections. On the ballot this year, there will be two countywide races for commissioners to serve of the AMCD Board. With that in mind, I decided to pen this piece to help you understand why you should care about mosquito control and how it impacts you as a citizen.

If I have done my job right, at the end of this article you will have developed some interest in this obscure government agency and in researching the candidates that will be running for the two seats that are up for election.

## What is the Anastasia Mosquito Control District (AMCD)?

AMCD was chartered in 1948 to serve Anastasia Island. In the beginning, AMCD controlled mosquitoes only on a small portion of Anastasia Island (17 square miles), and now AMCD services the entire 609 square miles of St. Johns County.

From 1989 to 2005, AMCD worked out of four stations spaced throughout the county. In 2005, the decision was made to centralize operations. AMCD bought a large plot of land (25 acres) off Agricultural Center Drive, located in the center of the county with easy access to I-95. Construction of the new facil-

ity off Agricultural Center Drive started in 2013. In 2016, all operations moved to the current facility on EOC Drive off Agricultural Center Drive.

In 2018, the AMCD Board unanimously approved the building of a "Mosquito Museum," later changed to "Education Center," to teach people about mosquito control and vector-borne diseases. The budget for the project was initially \$3 million but has escalated since then without much information shared with county citizens about the decision to build the facility or the cost



overruns.

## Who governs the AMCD?

The AMCD, a special district, was established under the authority of Florida statutes (Florida Statute 388.0101). Under the statute the legislative intent for the district reads:

"It is declared to be the public policy of this state to achieve and maintain such levels of arthropod control as will protect human health and safety and foster the quality of life of the people, promote the economic development of the state, and facilitate the enjoyment

The 2022 NFL schedule is out and it's always fascinating to see what the folks who make the schedule think about a particular team.

It might sound conspiratorial, but when a team has a three-game road

trip in November or faces defending Divisional Champions in four games of a five-game stretch or they give a team a Monday Night Football game followed by Sunday Night Football less than a week later, it's essentially a challenge to a team the NFL schedule makers want to see prove itself.

Trips to Los Angeles to face a loaded Chargers team in a stadium where the Jaguars are 0-2 and in a state where







of its natural attractions by reducing the number of pestiferous and disease-carrying arthropods. It is further declared to be the policy of the state to conduct arthropod control in a manner consistent with protection of the environmental and ecological integrity of all lands and waters throughout the state."

AMCD is an independent agency governed by a board comprised of commissioners, elected by their constituents to govern the district operations and who operate independently of the St. Johns County Board of Commissioners. This independence from other local governing bodies provides the AMCD board members with a high degree of autonomy to fulfill the mission of the district.

While this independence allows AMCD to operate without the interest, influence and authority of other local governmental bodies, it is such independence that makes it vital for St. Johns County citizens to understand the key role they play in ensuring that the district remains true to its mission, and that it does not expand beyond their mission without citizen approval.

## **Funding**

AMCD largely operates on property taxes levied on St. Johns County property owners. They are to develop financial reserves to ensure continuity of vital quality of life services during economic down-turns and/or disaster.

In the 2014-2015 fiscal year, AMCD approved an increase in the millage from 0.1312 to 0.2450 to help fund a new "Mosquito Museum" and Sterile Insect Technique (SIT) building. The ball started to roll on this in 2020 but was restarted in earnest in 2021 post-pandemic. The museum with its giant mosquito metal sculpture is slated to open in the summer of 2022.

## Top 3 things to demand of AMCD Commissioners

- Fiscally Responsibility: As a special district, AMCD's Board of Commissioners is to be fiscally responsible and committed to being good stewards of taxpayer dollars through responsible and lean budget decision-marking. AMCD should be spending less on general and administrative expenses than do their counterparts, cities and counties.
- **Accountability:** AMCD commissioners are elected by voters in St. Johns County. Therefore, their performance or lack thereof will be assessed by voters when these officials come forth for reelection.
- Transparency: The AMCD is limited in how they can spend taxpayer dollars and is required to be transparent in its financial processes. AMCD is also subject to Florida's Sunshine, public records, financial disclosure and ethics laws. Citizens should demand that proper notice (not just on their little-known website) is provided to citizens about the proposed annual budget and all projects that will involve significant expenditures by the district. Additionally, projects such as the "Mosquito Museum" should have received sufficient public notice and debate and consideration should have been given to making this a referendum item, instead of leaving it only to board approval.



"I found that I enjoyed helping people in need win their fight," Campione said.


The law firm deals mostly with personal injury cases, but does handle other avenues, such as property damage claims, real estate law, small business and criminal defense.

# What to do if you want to leave your children unequal inheritances

Parents usually want to leave their children equal shares of their estate, but equal isn't always fair. If you plan to provide more (or less) for one child in your estate plan, preparation is important.

It is natural for parents to want to treat their children equally in their estate plan, but there are some circumstances in which a parent might want to leave children unequal shares. If one child is providing all the caregiving, the parent might want to reward that child. If one child is substantially better off than another child, then the parent might want to provide more for the child who has a greater need

Other factors that can influence how much to give each child is if one child has special needs or if there is a family business that only one child wants to run. It's also possible that the parents have already provided more for one child during their lifetime, maybe by paying for graduate school or helping them buy a house.

Whatever the reason for leaving your children unequal shares, the important thing is to discuss your reasoning with the children. Sit down with them and explain your decision-making process. If you feel like the conversation could be difficult and contentious, you could hire a mediator to help facilitate the discussion.

Your children may be understanding of your decision, but if you are worried about one child challenging your will after you die, you may want to take additional steps:

- Draft your will and estate plan with the assistance of an attorney and make sure it is properly executed. To find an attorney near you, go to elderlawanswers. com/elder-law-attornevs. To avoid accusations of undue influence, do not involve any of your children in the process.
- Explain in detail your reasoning in your estate planning document and make it clear that it is your decision and not the influence of the child who is receiving
- Include a no-contest clause (also called an "in terrorem clause") in your will. A no-contest clause provides that if an heir challenges the will and loses, then he or she will get nothing. You must leave the heir enough so that a challenge is not worth the risk of losing the inheritance.

## Naturalist touts therapeutic benefits of the outdoors

In our fast-paced world, with so many voices vying for our attention via social media, the immediacy of 21st century technology and its impact on our privacy, the demands on our time from every quarter, it's natural to want to escape.

And, according to the former park naturalist for the St. Johns County Department of Recreation and Parks, people are finding that escape in the outdoors.

"Now that we're so far away from nature, we're realizing that coming back to the natural world is beneficial health- and mental-wise," says AyoLane Halusky, owner of and lead guide for Earth Kinship.

According to Halusky, spending even 10 minutes in nature can greatly reduce cortisol levels and improve creativity.

Halusky has witnessed the positive effects of exploring nature his whole life. When he was young, his father started the Earth Stewardship Conference where people gathered to talk about healing the Earth. The name was later changed to Earth Kinship, which participants felt better reflected the conference's focus.

Halusky would return to that name when he launched his current ecotourism

After earning his bachelor of arts degree from the Savannah College of Art and Design, he went to work in outdoor settings, leading youths in Outward Bound on wilderness trips. Later, he spent a decade teaching at the University of Florida's IFAS Extension where he grew its eco adventures to new levels. He added kayak trips, rock climbing and whitewater rafting. By the time Halusky left that job, the number of students served each semester grew from 100 to about 5,000.

That's when he came to St. Johns County and took the park naturalist job. Ten years later, he has started a new chapter: Earth Kinship.

Halusky, who is American Canoe Association-certified and a Florida Master Naturalist, offers several different experiences in nature, which can be found at his website, earthkinship.us. There are kayak and hiking tours, naturalist training and paddle training, and forest bathing, which for the uninitiated is not bathing but, rather, guided meditation in the woods.

"I have some certified forest bathers who work with me," Halusky said.

He would like to add some tipi talks or chats around the fire and bring in some local historians to discuss important historical figures who don't always get the attention they deserve: Stetson Kennedy, William Bartram and Denys Rolle, to name a few.

"There's so much out there that, without a naturalist and an historian point of view coming together as one, you're not getting the full story," he said.

One element he has added to several of his kayak trips involves everyone finding a spot out of sight of everyone else and sitting quietly for 10 minutes. At first, participants won't hear any birds or other animals around them.

"When you put a human in the woods, it's like throwing a stone in a pond," Halusky said. A person's very presence silences nature.

But after about 10 minutes, the birds and other animals, no longer sensing a threat, make their presence known again.

When the kayakers return, Halusky asks them to describe their experiences.

"The majority of the time I hear, 'relaxed' or 'my awareness is heightened,'" he said. "Sometimes people laugh and say, 'Wow, I didn't realize how loud cars were."

While he recognizes the value of other kayak tour companies in the St. Augustine area, Halusky offers something different; he takes people to "secret spots" that only the locals know about.

"We go to many, many locations," he said, "and we dive deep, deep, deep into the natural world."

# Artist develops talent along the road less traveled

If there's a well-worn path that artists typically take to develop their talents, Charlotte S. Chastain didn't follow it.

Her background is varied and surprising, and perhaps therein lies the secret to her unique works. If art imitates life, her paintings have rich source material.

Though painting seriously since she was about 20 years old, the roots of her art go back much further.

"It's a passion of mine that I've had ever since I was a child," she said.

As a young woman in the 1970s, she earned an associate's degree at a school in Virginia and then went on to become a business major at the University of Georgia.

However, she got married her senior year and left college. She had two children and later moved to Atlanta, where she worked as a legal secretary for major law firms.

The work was "very, very, very, very hard," but it taught her some key skills in grammar and punctuation that would prove beneficial years later when, as a volunteer for the First Coast Cultural Center, she would be tasked with editing all of the nonprofit's communications.

Throughout it all, she continued to paint and had one-woman shows while living in Atlanta.

In 2000, her life took a new direction. As an empty nester, she moved to Ponte Vedra. Four years later, she finished her education, graduating magna cum laude from the University of North Florida. She

also studied painting and art history in Rome with the Rhode Island School of Design.

After that, she went a whole new direction

## Olympic gold medalist visits young volleyball players

When learning to play a sport, it's always helpful to have advice from an expert. And on Thursday, May 19, a group of young volleyball players from the Ponte Vedra area got advice from the

Olympic gold medalist Phil Dalhausser visited with the youths, who were enrolled in a series of classes offered by Volleyball1on1 at Nocatee Community Park. He taught them spiking techniques and how to put more power into their game and spoke to them about how mistakes can be used to improve.

The day was divided into two sessions: one for students in grades 4-7 and the other for students in grades 8-12. That evening, Dalhausser joined Volleyball1on1 founders Andor Gyulai and tion at the link for parents titled "Better Parenting Through Sports."

Dalhausser, teamed with Todd Rogers, won his gold medal in beach volleyball at the Beijing 2008 Summer Olympics. At Thursday's gathering, he showed the youths his medal, the back side of which was inlaid with rare white jade.

He described winning a gold medal as "pretty sweet."

In addition to his victory in Beijing, Dalhausser has competed in three other Olympic Games and won several beach volleyball championships around the world.

Dalhausser's visit to Nocatee was at the invitation of the Gyulais, who met him earlier this year at a private trial in

Before founding Volleyball1on1, Andor Gyulai and Vanessa Summers-Gyulai had careers in financial services in Los

Andor Gyulai was an experienced volleyball player and world-renowned coach, and in 2009, the Gyulais began to post videos — 3,000 in all — on YouTube featuring the best players and coaches in the world. That evolved into a franchise volleyball coaching system for high school coaches and clubs. Their business, Volleyball1on1, runs volleyball camps around the country.

'We actually want to raise some volleyball Olympians," said Andor Gyulai.

In fact, they may already be doing so. Their son, Thor, 14, has demonstrated an interest and talent in the sport. He was recently scouted to be a part of the elite Volleyball U-16 team.

In addition to volleyball skills, the Gyulais — who moved to Ponte Vedra in January — incorporate life skills into each lesson. It's something Vanessa Summers-Gyulai said was her favorite part of what they do.

"We like to say it's bigger than volleyball," said her husband.

"We like to teach things like: how to communicate, how to ask questions, how to work successfully, how to set goals," said Andor Gyulai. "We like to say that when we teach these things we develop excellent goal-setting, communicative, self-directed, critical-thinking, lifelong






