

# Charity bike ride set to come through Ponte Vedra July 10-11

Paul Anderson Youth Home will hold its 18th annual bike ride July 8 to July 14, and Ponte Vedra Beach is one of the stops along the route.

It is a long-distance ride that will stretch across Georgia and Florida as part of the riders' journey.

Paul Anderson Youth Home is a fully accredited and licensed program located in Vidalia, Georgia, dedicated to offering help to young men facing serious trouble or incarceration for six decades.

What makes the ride even more special is that five young men from the home will be the ones going on the journey together.

This year will also be one of change for the bike ride, which will take its next step in the event's growth by expanding this year from five to seven days.

With the addition of the two days, the five riders are projected to cover more than 520 miles.

Along those many miles covered will include a day three stop in Ponte Vedra on July 10 and then leaving from Ponte Vedra and riding 92 miles to St. Simons Island on July 11.

Ponte Vedra will mark the farthest south this year's route will go.

Since its beginning, the Paul Anderson Bike Ride has commemorated a foundational moment in the history of the Paul Anderson Youth Home, because at its founding in 1961, former Olympic gold-medal winner and the home's namesake Paul Anderson decided to ride a bicycle from Vidalia, Georgia, to Omaha, Ne-

braska

That 1,200-mile trek was the start of a fundraising tradition that is welded into the fabric of the foundation.

Anderson's motivation then was the same as the five riders who prepare to embark on a similar journey of their own.

The mission for the ride continues to serve the overall goal of the organization, which is to raise funds and awareness of the mission to give troubled youth a second chance through Christ.

Since its founding more than 60 years ago, the ministry has celebrated more than 1,400 lives changed through a process of recovery, restoration and redemption.

"Paul was an incredibly determined man, so when he decided to ride a bike 1,200 miles to Omaha. I felt it was Christ working through him," said Glenda Anderson Leonard, co-founder and president of Paul Anderson Youth Home. "All these years later, I get the same feeling when these strong young men take to the road, keeping Paul's legacy of faith and fitness alive."

The five riders, like all other young men in the program, have been working to overcome a range of challenges, including emotional issues, substance abuse, legal trouble and spiritual deficiencies.

The ride will not just be a physical challenge but will also test the mental

strength and fortitude of the riders, while they also work to grow their relationship with God during the ride.

"It takes character to volunteer for this ride, because it is not easy," Anderson Leonard said. "This endeavor honors the young men's commitment to changing their lives, accepting the Lord's word, and the memory of Paul, who was such a gifted athlete."

Funds raised will allow the youth home to more effectively carry out its mission of helping those troubled.



Cynthia Steers has lived in the area for 26 years and always made candles as a hobby for her family and friends. However, about a year ago she decided to turn her love of candle making into a business of her own called Simply Cynthia. She continues to grow her selection of scents while she develops new customers and educates the public by offering candles that do not just smell good but also do not contain certain harmful chemicals.

# Cynthia Steers

# **As told to Anthony Richards**

# What led you to the creation of Simply Cynthia?

What led me to do this is that a lot of people don't realize that a lot of candles you buy from the store have all sorts of chemicals and bad things for you in them. It's something that the average shopper just does not realize.

I wanted to help educate people and offer up a healthy alternative with nothing that can disrupt your endocrine system. My scents are very pure, and I use natural soy in my candles.

I turned it into a actual business about a year ago after making candles for a long time for friends and family, and have been selling at the Palm Valley Market since September.

One of my sons actually came up with the design of my logo while he was in college.

# How long does it take typically to make a candle?

All of my candles are blends, which makes me unique because you won't be able to get this exact blend anywhere else.

Once I get an idea for a blend, I start with blotter strips, which are cardboard or poster board strips, and then take the fragrance oils and put them on the strips and in a baggie for 24 hours.

I'll come back and see how the smell is and if I like the mix then I'll pour a candle with that mix.

A soy wax candle takes 10 to 14 days to fully cure after you've poured it.

You can burn them before that, but to get the wax and the fragrance oil fully blended makes a difference, so I would definitely recommend waiting it out.

# Are you always trying to think of new scents to add?

I am always thinking of new ones and new names. Some of the names are based on Bible verses, such as "With God, all things are possible," and it also has a Bible verse on the side of it.

I have a lot of scents that are pretty seasonal, as I have a lot of citrus and florals right now for the summer.

To my surprise, pine is a scent that sells well all year long, so that's a popular one. I discovered that after putting it away in January and then people were still asking for it.

Even with that, every week is different when it comes to what scents people will like that week.

I can't just say that one is my No. 1 seller because every week is truly different. You just never know which direction people's noses will take them.

# What are some of your more interesting scents?

Vanilla and tobacco is one that is very interesting but one that people like the smell of.

A friend of mine actually mentioned one day that she had once bought a vanilla and tobacco candle and asked if I thought I could do something like that, and I wanted to give it a try.

You'd be surprised which combinations work well together to make an amazing scent.

Not just developing scents, but actually building upon them and making them better is what it's all about.

I also have wax molds for people that are looking for that.

# What has the feedback been like since starting Simply Cynthia?

I've started to develop many regular customers, which is always such a great feeling.

I enjoy the feedback because people will ask me what my favorite is and it's so hard to choose, because they are all my babies and it's impossible to choose just one.

I think people want to support local and small businesses and the Palm Valley Market is the perfect place to make sure you find that.

I would really like to give a shout out to Lisa Struble and Dr. Leslie Taylor for encouraging me to be part of the Palm Valley Market. It really helped to jump start my business.

# **Buzzer beater secures Brown** Family YMCA All-stars title


In fact, both husband and wife will be familiar to regular patrons of Alhambra

# Painter preserves working-class roots while producing fine art

Standing before the portraits of artist Alfredo Gonzalez, one is pulled into the emotion depicted there.

Each work seems to capture a moment from an unspoken narrative.

Each painting is more than it is.

It's a quality one finds in great works of fine art. What comes as a surprise is the strong working-class roots of these pieces, roots that find expression even in the artist's choice of tools.

Gonzalez is one of the nine finalists selected by entrepreneur Richard C. Kessler of The Kessler Collection from a pool of 1,800 applicants to display his work in New York City's Times Square and at several Grand Bohemian Galleries.

Kessler put out a call in late 2022 for applicants in his search for The Next Original. That competition arrived at what appeared to be a crossroads of sorts for Gonzalez, who was working hard in construction even as he completed coursework for his bachelor's degree and faced enormous debts.

Gonzalez grew up in Oxnard, California. His introduction to the world of art and that of the critic — came when he was in kindergarten.

"We were asked to do a family picture," he said. "I drew the classic picture of the head with the legs coming out of the head and the arms coming out of the leg. And I couldn't figure out why it didn't look like my parents."

At some point it occurred to him that anatomy was what made a person unique.

"So, my naïve, 5-year-old self decided to draw breasts on my mom," he said, laughing. "My teacher pulled me aside. I got into trouble."

As a boy, Gonzalez found himself drawn to the "funny, funky characters" popular in skateboarding graphics. That led him to graffiti and artists like Shepard Fairey and Banksy. Gonzalez found himself captivated by the color and messages these street artists employed.

Of course, graffiti had a tendency to get artists into trouble, and Gonzalez began a transition to fine arts. An art teacher in high school influenced him to pursue line drawing and figurative life painting.

Then, Gonzalez's life took a practical turn, one that would have an impact on

his future artwork.

Gonzalez's father was a construction worker who specialized in masonry.

One day, his father took him to the job site where he was able to meet the boss. The company employed Gonzalez during the summers.

He enjoyed mixing and working with concrete but found it tiring. At the end of the day, through his exhaustion, he would try to find the energy to paint.

In 2017, he enrolled in the Academy of Art University in San Francisco. He spent a couple of years there, but the COV-ID-19 pandemic disrupted his plans.

Amidst the many business closures, Gonzalez was not able to work, which meant he couldn't earn money for rent. He moved all of his possessions into his

two-door Honda Civic and slept in different rest stops in San Francisco.

Finally, he began to drive back and forth from Oxnard to San Francisco, a six-hour trip one way.

At last, he earned his bachelor's degree in fine arts but completion of his formal education was not a ticket to a more leisurely lifestyle. Gonzalez continued to work even as he honed his artistic skills.

Eventually, he came across the call for artists for The Next Original.

He submitted his work and promptly forgot all about it.

Then, in December, the phone rang. The woman at the other end of the line told him he has one of the competition's

in concrete and focused on his art.

He has chosen to paint in black and white to symbolize concrete, to which he maintains an emotional attachment because it reminds him of his father.

His painting process is unique. He starts with an acrylic spray paint. Then, he applies acrylic paint using a cement trowel, an unusual tool for a fine arts painter but one that makes perfect sense given his familiarity with its use. He finishes his works with paint brushes and

# Victory Wrestling Club'gives back' to sport with summer camp

Victory Wrestling Club held its first ever wrestling summer camp at Nease High School June 26-29, as several ages and local schools were represented.

"We've been trying to get a club up off the ground for a couple of years now," Nease head coach Bradley Lucas said. "This is just the first year, but we had 25 kids come out on the first night, which is a good turnout. We're hoping to make it an annual thing and maybe even add an additional set of dates next year over the summer."

This year the camp was just open for middle and high school, but Lucas does have plans to open it up for even younger children and those who are truly just beginning.

Not only was there a variety in those who participated in the camp but also in the coaches who helped lead the camp's instruction along with Lucas and his staff.

One of the featured coaches included Matthew Miller, who was a former coach in the area and now serves as an FHSAA official during wrestling matches.

"Bradley asked me to come in and we've been friends for a really long time," Miller said. "I just always love giving back to the sport."

Miller mentioned and demonstrated several techniques to group in attendance and went over an array of scenarios where certain moves could be used.

Getting involved in camps like the one Nease hosted leads to Miller harkening back to when he was the campers' age and just getting into the sport.

"I remember going to camps and clinics when I was growing up, and if I can help one kid in here develop

one go-to move, then we've accomplished what we were going to do in two hours," Miller said. "Every coach or official that does this is always sort of living through their past, because it probably had a good effect on them in their lives and helped make them who they are."

For the parents or children out there thinking about taking up a sport, Miller advises them to seriously consider wrestling because he has seen it change people for the better and transform teens into mature adults before his very eyes.

"There's so much confidence that comes from this sport because there is so much hand-to-hand combat that's involved," Miller said. "We've got a lot of problems with bullies nowadays, but most bullies aren't going to mess with someone who they know they can't beat up."

However, he also knows that it takes a special person to be good at the sport because it does not come without hard work and determination.

"If you've got young kids with a ton of energy, this is probably the sport for them," Miller said.




