

LETTER TO THE EDITOR

Dear Ms. Osborne.

Regarding your letter to the editor of March 3 in which you discuss the various reasons why a person might fall and what they should do. You urged me to "visit a physical therapist today." That tells me you didn't read my whole column of February 25. I specifically mention that I have been seeing a physical therapist (in fact, he is a doctor of physical therapy) and have had 12 visits so far, with at least 8 more to go. You also must not have read my articles written back in 2013 about how important and valuable "PT" is.

I had complicated and difficult knee surgery in 1986, when physical therapy was not as much in vogue then as it is today. I simply was told to do some stretches at home and did not have the advantage of a professional to work with me. I have been paying the price ever since. I have very poor, weak left leg muscles, and am working three times a week at a rehab center in Ponte Vedra to get stronger. My primary doctor has my bone density studied as often as Medicare allows, and I am hopeful that I will not fall again, but there are no guarantees.

Everyone is different: my 85 year old sister falls all the time but breaks nothing: she has osteoporosis. My 83 year old sister does not have osteoporosis but has recently broken her femur, and then her hip and is taking physical therapy. I've fallen several times in the last ten years and have osteopenia, and every time I've had therapy, and have recovered from whatever was broken. Perhaps others can take advantage of your suggestions re "Finding a Therapist" and the national database of local PTs. People are fortunate that today there are so many venues for people who need to be physically rehabilitated.

MS Fundraiser at Bogey Grille 2016

Fifth annual fundraiser at Bogey Grille raises awareness, funds for Multiple Sclerosis

A community-driven event to raise funds to end multiple sclerosis is growing by leaps and bounds every single year. The fifth annual silent auction benefitting the National Multiple Sclerosis Society was held March 7 at Bogey Grille in Ponte Vedra Beach.

The event is held annually to coincide with MS Awareness Week, a nationwide campaign to raise awareness and research to help end multiple sclerosis.

"It's grown every year," said MS Society North Florida Chapter silent auction committee member and event co-founder, Elaine Wright. The annual fundraiser was started by Wright along with Bruce Reid and Linda Bushong-Reid.

Funds raised from the inaugural year exceeded \$7,000. Last year's event raised approximately \$18,000, and this year's event goal was \$20,000 – a new record. All proceeds benefit the National MS Society.

Silent auction items for this year's fundraiser included 238 items to bid on that were donated by local businesses including The BookMark, Wild Birds Unlimited, Trader Joes, Pineapple Post, Gregory's Jewelers, The Defenders Pest Control, Sweet Pete's, Natural Life, Ellie Bing and many more.

"We're just so thankful for the volunteers who put this event on every single year to help raise funds to help end MS," Corrina Steiger Madrid, chapter president of the North Florida Chapter of the National Multiple Sclerosis Society said.

Event organizers were very appreciative to Bogey Grille owner, Derek Prince, for letting them use his facility to host this event for the fifth year in a row. Prince also donates a portion of the food and drink sales from the fundraiser night each year to the cause. Reid, who likes the idea of the event being a grassroots effort by the community, held in the community, said he is so thankful for Prince's generosity and the generosity of the businesses who donate items to the silent auction each year, as well as the community who turn out year after year to bid on items and help raise funds to end MS.

MS affects the central nervous system. The exact cause of the disease is unknown. Symptoms related to MS can include blurred vision, loss of balance, poor coordination, slurred speech, tremors, numbness, extreme fatigue, problems with memory and concentration, paralysis and blindness, according to the National Multiple Sclerosis Society.

The North Florida Chapter of the National MS Society serves 34 counties and 18,000 people affected by MS with local services and research to help find a cure for MS. Orange ribbons signify

Rubio stumps at outdoor rally in Nocatee

Florida Senator courts votes for March 15 primary

"It always comes down to Florida, doesn't it?"

With this statement and several impassioned pleas, Republican presidential candidate Sen. Marco Rubio drove home just how vital Florida will be to the success of his campaign at a rally in Nocatee on Tuesday evening.

Rubio's delegate count lags behind competitors Donald Trump and Sen. Ted Cruz. The winner of Florida's Presidential Preference Primary on March 15 will take all 99 delegates.

Rubio was joined in Nocatee by an estimated thousands of supporters, as well as St. Johns County Clerk of Courts Hunter Conrad and St. Augustine City Commissioner Todd Neville.

"The Democrats know that I will win," Rubio said, receiving cheers from those gathered. "I cannot wait to run against Hillary Clinton because Hillary




Republican candidate for president Sen. Marco Rubio took to the crowd after his speech for selfies with those assembled.

Clinton is unqualified to be president of the United States."

The Florida-raised Rubio spoke about his time in the state house, where he cut taxes and attempted even deeper cuts through tax code reform.

Ahead of the rally, Rubio's campaign announced backing from many Northeast Florida officials, including Jacksonville City Council members, Florida Representatives and Senators, Jacksonville Mayor Lenny Curry, Jackson-

ville Beach Mayor Charlie Latham and Atlantic Beach Mayor Mitch Reives.

Tuesday's rally was Rubio's second on the First Coast in a week, with the first at the Morocco Shrine Auditorium in Jacksonville on March 5.

Almost, Maine

'Almost, Maine' returns to Players by the Sea Theatre

Back by popular demand, "Almost, Maine," a romantic comedy written by John Cariani set in suburbia Maine that explores the bonds and boundaries of love, is returning to Players by the Sea Theatre in March.

"Almost, Maine" was presented as a limited engagement run in March of 2015. The play, directed by Bradley Akers with a cast featuring Ricky Watson, Drew Brown, Kat McLeod, Megan Georgeo, Kaiti Barta and Grant Williams, is broken down into nine vignettes that all connect in some way. Northern lights, produced by special effects above the audience's head as a tool of engulfing them into the world, serve as transitional pieces from one vignette to the next.

When it came to deciding on scenery for the play, Akers notes that many theatre groups will create lavish scenescapes for this particular play, but in his vision for the story, he wanted to focus on the words.

"This play is about the words. [John Cariani] wrote really beautiful dialogue; he created really cool relationships, so in turn, it's really stripped down, and

it's all about the one on one or the one on twos that happen in the play," Akers

Although the play, which is the most produced play in North American high schools, is described as a comedy, Akers points out that the playwright will say that it's actually very tragic.

"It's very funny - it's a very charming, and beautiful and sweet play," Akers said. "But love is kind of tragic too - not getting what you want and falling out of love (and sometimes falling in love) is hard to do and it gets a little tragic. I think that's why this play works - because it's so real," he said.

"Anybody and everybody can relate to something in the play whether they've fallen in love, whether they've been married, divorced, separated... It's a really interesting piece that I think is really a strong piece of theater that lets a director, actors, designers really do something unique and interesting with - something to dig your teeth into too. It's a play for everybody," said Akers.

During the run of the show, visual artist Anthony Whiting will have his work featured in the Grune Family Gallery. Whiting will be in the gallery during the pre-show of the March 12

performance. The theatre is also having a coat drive for new or gently used coats during the length of the performance - a nod to the play which is set on a cold winter's night. The coats will be donated to the Mission House.

"Almost, Maine" is the sixth production of Players by the Sea Theatre's milestone 50th season. In celebration of the 50th season an exhibition exploring the past 50 years of the theatre, which was founded in 1966 by three Beaches couples who shared a love for the theatre, is on display at the Beaches Museum & History Park. "Lights Up: 50 Years of Players by the Sea" opened Feb. 25 and will be on display through

When bikers for Susan G. Komen's Race for the Cure lined up Mar. 5 at the start line, the sun had only just barely begun to cast its rays over the horizon. Once seven o'clock struck, they were on their way -- weaving through Nocatee with the encouragement of their teammates and passersby.

The inaugural ride was one of many events scheduled by the Susan G. Komen foundation and the first to take place in Nocatee, spurred on by a promise to end breast cancer and better the lives of those affected by it.

It was also the start of a community's dutiful call to action.

According to Susan G. Komen North Florida's executive director, Delores Wise, eighty women in the area are diagnosed with breast cancer each month -- and over a third of those cases are diagnosed late-stage.

We realize the importance of coming to the counties in order to help get the word out about how breast cancer is impacting North Florida," Wise said.

And there was no better place than Nocatee's winding trails and long routes to accommodate the race. With rides

ranging from 10 miles to 64 miles, bikers were more than eager to put their feet to pedals for the cause.

As part of the day's festivities, participants were treated to tee shirts, music and family activities, including a touching walk through a paper tulip garden dubbed "Suzy's Garden," where heartfelt messages were drawn onto pink flower cutouts in celebration and remembrance of breast cancer patients. The messages -- and the turnout of over 100 registered bicyclists -- served as a touching reminder of the community's outpouring of support.

"The community's response exceeded our expectations. We had 125 registered Riders, which most Ride events do not achieve for several years," Wise remarked. "The Riders provided extremely helpful feedback, so that we can continue to improve upon this event. We have already set the date for next year - March 4, 2017.

But as the pink flags, ribbons, tents and flowers sprinkled throughout the lot showed, the most important thing for everyone involved was to raise awareness.

"Breast cancer kills and our best defense at this time is early detection," said Wise. "It is our duty -- our obligation -- to North Florida to educate the women

Location announced for new Nocatee school



Valley Ridge Academy in Nocatee immediately implemented portable classrooms to accommodate demand in its first year.







Bullying and suicide: it's real

Bullying today is a problem throughout the world. But right here in our own country, the numbers from bullying related suicides are increasing. Over 14% of high school students have considered suicide and 7% have actually attempted it. An astonishing 30% of students are either bullies or victims of bullying.

Bullying is intentional, emotional, or physical harm. The link between bullying and suicide is very strong. Suicide is the third leading cause of death in teens according to the Center For Disease Control. It results in about 4,400 deaths per year. Children that are bullied are approximately 9% more likely to consider suicide according to Yale University Studies.

Unfortunately, too many parents still look at bullying as "just part of being a kid." A (Toughen you up attitude). However, it's way more serious than that. This is a severe problem, which leads our youth to many negative life long issues.

Parents often don't take the link

between bullying and suicide seriously enough. Bullying related suicides could be linked to many different types of bullying: physical, emotional, cyber or sexting bullying, or even suggestive bullying, which is circulating embar-

rassing photos or spreading negative and untrue messages around about a person. Bullying may be tormenting, hitting, kicking, verbal abuse, shoving, extorting money (telling a child to hand over their lunch money or they will be beat up).

Warning signs of suicide can be: a child acting depressed or sad, staying home from outside social events or activities with friends, trouble eating or sleeping, or loss of interest in their favorite activity or sport, constantly talking about death, giving away some

of their favorite possessions, comments such as, "the world would be better off without me."

If you notice such behavior from your child or any other young adult, get them to be seen by a counselor, doctor, or nearest emergency room right away.

The problem is many times the child is too embarrassed to admit to being bullied and sometimes when they do mention any of these comments, they are not taken seriously enough.

In the meantime, if you are with someone who may possibly be suicidal, encourage them to talk about it, be loving, understanding, and supportive. Make sure to lock away any medicines and weapons. Then, let the professionals decide whether or not the child is in such danger.

96% of bullying occurs in schools, if a teacher or principal does not give you or your child any satisfaction with the bullying problem then notify the police and or get an attorney involved.

Of course, all friends and siblings tease one another from time to time in

a playful and normal way. But when it starts to become unkind or hurtful, this is where it crosses the line to bullying. It is at this point that it must be STOPPED!

When speaking to your children about the dangers of bullying, make sure you also talk to them about the other side of bullying, making sure to educate your child that THEY should never be the one to TEASE or BULLY.

Educating our children about the dangers of bullying begins at home. Bullying leads to senseless deaths from distraught children or young adults.

If you suspect bullying of any kind immediately contact the appropriate people or authorities and don't be afraid to get involved.





the slim-line art books of today. Many pages are fairly sophisticated. The first one I bought last summer was a book of post cards called Secret Garden, reminiscent of the dreamy book My Secret Garden by Francis Burnett.

In mid-October I counted 36 different coloring books on one table in Barnes and Noble. Titles ranged from Enchanted Forest, Color Me Happy: 100 Coloring Templates that will Make You Smile, The Day of the Dead, Barons Beautiful Copycat Books to copy, which had a colored picture on the left, and then you can color in the same "look" on the right. There is Zen Doodle, Secret Paris, Color Me Calm, Fantastic Cities, Japanese Designs, Art Nouveau, the Anti Stress Coloring Book. Mandalas are very popular, as are architecture, fanciful animals, botanicals. A book called Stress Less Coloring: Paisley Patterns gives you a "hypnotic variety." If you like Mary Engelbreit, look for the Color ME Coloring Book. Of course the internet will offer you choices

galore. Animal Kingdom published by Lark Crafts has sold over a million copies worldwide. There's a "Game of Thrones" coloring book too. And a mindfulness coloring book.

Workshops at New York's Omega Institute are led by P.C. Turczyn, a mandala artist who encourages students to color as a way of opening up creativity. But places right here in town offer coloring opportunities too.

I was at a senior center when I noticed that members could pick up coloring books and pens in at the art room. I was in a rush, and I didn't have a chance to see what they had. The next time I was back there, they were all gone. Jump on the coloring train, color, and watch your stress disappear.

The winter glums are still around some of the time, so while you're waiting for spring, try a coloring project. You might also enjoy it during the doldrums of summer days when it's too hot to go outside.

What to do, when?

With warmer weather approaching and more sunshine on deck, it's the perfect time to be outside in St. Johns County. Lawn and home improvement stores are slammed on the weekends in Northeast Florida as residents scramble to get the latest gadgets, the best nursery plants and everything else they need to start dressing up outdoor spaces.

If you have a garden or are interested in starting one, you may feel intimidated walking down the aisles of plant nurseries. Sure – the flowers, shrubs, trees and vegetables are thriving there. But will they work in your garden? And when you should plant them?

Luckily, it doesn't take a green thumb to keep your garden and lawn healthy all year long.

There is plenty of advice to be had online, but one of the very best sources for our area comes from the University of Florida, which provides a free yearly calendar about what to plant when, along with advice on what to do for your existing plantings each month: http://edis.ifas.ufl.edu/ep451

Here is their advice for March and April, so you can get a head start on planting!

March

Annuals/Bedding Plants: In March, Dianthus and other cool-season annuals will continue to flourish. Consider planting warm-season annuals such as angelonia, wax begonia and zinnia at the end of the month

Bulbs: Plant dahlia, canna and gloriosa bulbs in March for spring and summer flowering. Provide stakes as needed to support growth.

Herbs: March is the time to plant and grow edi-

ble ginger. Plant rhizomes in well-drained soil in full to part sun.

Vegetables: Begin planting warmseason crops, such as beans, tomatoes, squash and corn, early in March for a late spring harvest. On the off chance that we receive frosty weather again, be sure to protect these crops.

Azaleas: Prune your azaleas when they have finished blooming to reduce their size and improve their form.

Shrubs and trees: Wait to prune until you see new growth on your shrubs and trees

Palms and shrubs: Fertilize palms, azaleas, camellias and other ornamental shrubs if needed in March. Choose a fertilizer in which at least 30% of its nitrogen is slow release.

Irrigation: Now is the time to check your sprinkler system for problems such as broken or misaligned spray heads.

April

Annuals/Bedding Plants: New varieties of coleus do well in sun or shade and provide vivid colors and patterns for months. Plant them in early April.

Bulbs: April is an ideal time to plant many bulbs. Consider blood lily, caladium or canna. Louisiana iris and others make beautiful cut flowers.

Herbs: Plant heat-loving herbs, including basil, oregano, sage, Mexican tarragon and rosemary, in April.

Vegetables: Continue planting warmseason crops. Mulch well to prevent weeds and provide irrigation if rainfall is lacking.

Pests: April is the time to start monitoring landscape plants for aphids that feed on tender new growth.

Beneficials: Identify and conserve beneficial insects. These insects should be encouraged in your yard!

Perennials and bulbs: Divide clumps of bulbs, ornamental grasses or herbaceous perennials to expand or rejuvenate garden beds or to pass along to friends.

Lawn insects: If you're experiencing lawn woes, be sure to rule out cultural problems, such as lack of water, that resemble insect damage before applying a pesticide.

Lawns: Apply fertilizer after new growth has started—usually mid-April for north Florida.

Shrubs: Choose from a wide variety of shrubs to add to the landscape in April.

Trees: Consider planting a springblooming tree, such as fringetree (Chionanthus virginicus), Carolina Silverbell (Halesia carolina) or redbud (Cercis canadensis).

Mulch: Add mulch to minimize weeds and conserve moisture during dry weather, starting in April. Organic mulches break down and add nutrients to the soil.

5 insects that keep your garden healthy


If creepy crawlers in your garden give you the creeps, it may be time to re-assess the insects around you. Many of the insects that call your lawn and garden home are beneficial, and can help to control pests and problems in your yard.

We all know that lady bugs, bees and butterflies are great garden companions – not to mention the fact that they're generally nice to look at. But what about their less appreciated counterparts: the ugly bugs doing the dirty work in your lawn?

Assassin Bugs: Assassin bugs (Reduviidae) are common across Florida and are just as stealthy and deadly as

their name would imply – to pests. Assassin bugs are ambush predators that eat a wide variety the baddies in your garden, including other insects like flies and caterpillars. Assassin bugs attack with strong beaks, and can actually deliver painful bites to humans – so give these insects space and let them do their job without interfering.

Green Lacewing: Don't let the delicate name and appearance of this insect fool you: green lacewings are predators that feed on a wide variety of small insects like mealybugs, psyllids, thrips, mites, whiteflies, aphids, caterpillars, leafhoppers and insect eggs. Many gardeners and farmers actually buy and release green lace-



wings to help with pest control, so be kind if you happen to see these insects in your garden for free.

Big-eyed Bug: Big-eyed bugs (Geocoris spp.) are great assets for your crops, ornamental plants and your lawn. These predators stalk their prey and eat insect eggs, other bugs, small caterpillars, flea beetles and mites.

Earwig: Earwigs may look like tiny nightmares, but they're a dream come true for your lawn, where they live and prey on pests like chinch bugs, mole crickets and sod webworms.

Earwigs get big – up to one inch –

with mean-looking pinchers on their abdomens. Ugly as they are, according to the University of Florida, in lab studies they consume a whopping 50 chinch bugs a day!

Syrphid Fly: Syrphid or "hover" flies include about 900 different species and have the ability to hover in extended flight, and can even hover backwards. Syrphid flies resemble wasps and bees but do not sting. Their larvae are beneficial predators that eat harmful aphids. Adults also help with the cross pollination of some plants.

Improve your outdoor space with retaining walls

When you picture a retaining wall, do you imagine it holding back dirt? That's the most common use for retaining walls - to address elevation changes and prevent erosion. But concrete segmental retaining wall (SRW) units are multi-purpose landscaping tools with many more uses.

Site planners, engineers, landscape architects, designers, developers and builders have long relied on SRWs to manage sloping properties, provide more usable space, or create stadium seating. Homeowners, too, have discovered retaining walls can be used to create functional outdoor features, says Scott Arnold, manager of Villa Landscapes in St. Paul, Minnesota.

"Because segmental retaining walls are both durable and beautiful, land-scapers and homeowners can use them to create outdoor seating, raised patios and other features," says Arnold. "They are the perfect building block to create grill islands, outdoor kitchens and so much more."

Most SRWs are easy to install, which is an important consideration for both landscape professionals and do-it-yourselfers, Arnold said. With retaining wall systems, homeowners and landscapers can create freestanding walls, seat walls, columns, stairs, planters and other features without the need for special units.



Stunning seating

While commercial installers often use SRW units for amphitheater and stadium seating, retaining walls can also be used to create beautiful and durable outdoor seating on a smaller scale, from freestanding walls that double as seating, to two-tiered seat walls. VERSA-LOK SRWs can be used to easily create a curved "couch" seating area that works well as a solution around a patio and fire pit for fall evenings.

Ditch the deck

Raised patios built with retaining wall units are a low maintenance option to replace aging wooden decks that require continual maintenance. Villa Landscapes designed a raised deck replacement in Minnesota with SRWs from ground level to 42-inches tall to support a paving stone patio. Stairs also built with SRWs connect the patio to the home and yard.

The result was a beautiful, spacious and low-maintenance patio with the

added advantage of a clear view of the backyard. Willow Creek Paving Stones pavers were used for the patio, surrounded with a contrasting course of river rock that serves as a visual and physical boundary as well as a space for potted plants.

Create curb appeal

Where the yard meets the driveway, retaining walls can be installed as a barrier to protect the lawn from damage caused by tire tracks, plowing or deicing. A tiered arrangement that addresses a slope in the yard adds space for plants and shrubs. Freestanding walls are often built along property lines on corner lots to prevent unwanted traffic from cutting across the yard.

Columns created using retaining wall units can be paired with any style home, from classic to contemporary, to add curb appeal. When the front entryway is freshened up with seat walls and other features, the space functions like an old-fashioned porch for visiting and other outdoor activities.

A place for plants

Tree rings and planters built with retaining wall units create a tidy solution around hard-to-maintain areas, such as shallow-rooted trees and other problem spots. Planters and tree rings can function as usable space for perennials, annuals, vegetables and herbs.

SRWs such as VERSA-LOK can be used to create planter walls up to 4-feet tall without the need for geogrid reinforcement. VERSA-Green, a plantable wall system that mimics a hanging garden, provides a stunning living wall solution

Build a backyard

A homeowner in Apple Valley, Minnesota, nicknamed her unmowable back yard "Billy Goat Hill" because there was no yard space and no safe way to access her garden and fire pit at the top. Plus, erosion was a continual problem.

Devine Design Landscapes of Rosemount, Minnesota, solved the problem by excavating for a small back yard and creating tiers of retaining walls with offset stairs, patio landings and seat walls. The result was a small, usable backyard space with safe access to the hilltop and ample planting space for perennials.

"With VERSA-LOK, I could use the same block to build the retaining walls, steps and seat walls," says Paul Devine, owner of Devine Design Landscapes. "The pinned system provides a high ratio of weight per square foot of wall face plus extreme flexibility in design. Back-locking lip walls are not as structurally sound as a pinned system, and hollow blocks do not provide the stability required for large tiered walls."
