County to pursue shoring up oceanfront homes with dredged sand

Commissioners extend local state of emergency, ask for patience with debris removal

The Board of County Commissioners extended the local state of emergency during its Oct. 18 meeting, at which time commissioners approved pursuing efforts to relocate sand dredged from the St. Augustine inlet to protect endangered homes along State Road A1A.

In a report to county commissioners, County Administrator Michael Wanchick reviewed emergency management and storm recovery efforts before recommending that the local state of emergency be extended, which the board unanimously approved. Discussion then turned to the massive erosion experienced along the coastline that left numerous oceanfront homes in peril.

Wanchick presented a proposal to explore coordinating with the Army Corps of Engineers, Department of Environmental Protection and Florida Inland Navigation District (FIND) to redirect sand dredged from the St. Augustine inlet to the north beaches. That project, Wanchick said, was already approved and ready to begin construction in November, with the dredged material slated to be disposed of on Anastasia Island.

"Rather than send that stuff to an uninhabited island, we would send it to the north where we have this critical need." Wanchick said. "That's not a permanent long-term solution, but it's the most viable solution we have available right now that could be quickly delivered in the next month to protect those homes until a more permanent solution is identified."

Unlike other county renourishment projects, Wanchick noted, this project would differ in that the sand would be placed on private property, requiring the county to secure easements and permits from each individual homeowner. In addition, County Commissioner Bill McClure cautioned that doing so might negatively impact property owners' home insurance

"When you accept this (sand) because it's been deemed a hazard area, that materially affects your insurance policy," McClure said. "Be very aware, it effectively nullifies it. That's an unintended consequence. Your personal property can be affected in that case."

Wanchick acknowledged that there were a number of questions and issues

Save Guana Now fundraiser nets \$2,000

Organization raising money to fight development of property near GTM Reserve

An Oct. 15 fundraiser for "Save Guana Now" raised approximately \$2,000 for the grassroots group's campaign to preserve the 99-acre Outpost for which a housing development is proposed.

Held at a log cabin located next to the Outpost on Neck Road, the fundraiser was originally scheduled for earlier in the month but had to be rescheduled due to Hurricane Matthew. Event organizers were pleased with the turnout.

"It was a perfect evening and many neighborhoods were represented at the party, with everyone sharing a passion for saving the Outpost from development," organizer Nicole Crosby said. "Guests took turns walking out onto the dock where they could face south and view the entire shoreline of the Outpost property that they're fighting to save."

Save Guana Now Co-Founder Gary Coulliette provided the entertainment – singing and playing his guitar. Guests were each asked to bring a dish so the maximum amount of funds could be raised for the cause. Supporters dined on a variety of homemade dishes from smoked ribs to Key lime pie made with homegrown limes.

The event also marked the kick-off of the Save Guana Now bumper stickers and yard signs campaign which feature photographs of animals of Guana preserve taken by local photographer Craig O'Neal.

Located near the Guana Tolomato Matanzas National Estuarine Research Reserve, the Outpost is situated at the end of Neck Road in Ponte Vedra, adjacent to the GTM Research Reserve. The land is currently owned by Gate Petroleum.

Save Guana now was founded by Neck Road residents Crosby and Coulliette in

response to a zoning application filed by the Ponte Vedra Corp., a subsidiary of Gate Petrolum, in July.

The property's current designation is conservation land, but land owners would like to change the property to residential in order to develop it. The proposed project, "Vista Tranquila," is a 77-home development that the Save Guana Now group opposes due to concerns over its environmental impact and the amount of traffic such a development would generate.

The group's primary objective right now, according to Crosby, is to get as many bumper stickers on cars as possible to help raise awareness.

The bumper stickers have a suggested donation of \$5 apiece and can be ordered online at www.saveguananow.org/bumper-stickers.

This was the first fundraiser for the group; plans for a second fundraiser are already in progress as well as plans for "mini-fundraising events" such as nature hikes or food truck events.

to be addressed before the plan could be implemented, but said the plan was the only viable option currently available to address the threat to oceanfront properties.

"I guess falling into the ocean would also affect your insurance rates, too," he observed

During the public comment period, several residents raised the issue of building a seawall, which currently is deemed the responsibility of the individual homeowners. That presents a logistical problem if each homeowner attempts to construct his own wall, contended Robert Franskousky of the South Ponte Vedra-Vilano Beach Preservation Association.

"Can you imagine 19, 20 or 40 differ-

ent contractors out on the beach trying to put in place all these different chains of walls that are all designed by different engineers?" he asked commissioners. "We absolutely have got to have government involvement or government design of a wall "

Other residents, however, expressed concern about encouraging homeowners to rebuild their homes in an environmentally sensitive area.

"I'm worried about the taxpayers having to pick up the tab and subsidize these buildings in these areas," Ellen Whitmer said. "This is really not wise because these storms...they come and when they come property is destroyed. I'm in sympathy to these people, but you don't need to build on the beach."

After public comment, commissioners unanimously approved pursuing the dredge relocation project.

Debris clean-up

Several county commissioners noted that the vast majority of calls they're now

receiving are from residents asking when storm debris will be collected. Wanchick said that the county is "focusing very intently" on debris collection, noting that more than 30,000 cubic yards of debris had already been collected. Given that Hurricane Matthew impacted Florida statewide, however, St. Johns County is in competition with other communities for FEMA-approved contractors, he said.

"It's important to remember we have a county of 610 square miles," said Wanchick, saying that he anticipated the county would have more than 20 crews in the field by this week.

"We understand that the only debris that really matters to most people is the debris in front of their own home," he said. "(The crews) are working as hard as they possibly can. We just ask people if they'll be patient in that regard."

Trump makes case to First Coast voters

With a pledge to "drain the swamp" of Washington corruption, Republican presidential candidate Donald J. Trump took his case to First Coast voters Tuesday, traversing the northern half of the state in an effort to shore up local support and offset anticipated Democratic strength in South Florida.

A 3 p.m. rally at the St. Augustine Amphitheatre attracted an overflow crowd of approximately 5,000 Trump supporters, who were first greeted by U.S. Rep. Ron DeSantis and former New York City Mayor Rudy Giuliani – both of whom stressed the importance of keeping Hillary Clinton out of the White House. DeSantis, for example, said Clinton's Supreme Court picks would forever alter the face of the nation.

"If we end up allowing Hillary Clinton to replace Justice Antonin Scalia with a liberal Supreme Court justice, we will have a majority of five lockstep liberal justices and they will run roughshod over our Second Amendment rights, they will undermine religious freedom and they will empower the bureaucracy....so private citizens are not going to have a chance to win in the courts," DeSantis said. "She wants judicial activists who aren't going to follow the Constitution but will legislate from the

In contrast, DeSantis said, Trump would appoint justices who would adhere to the Constitution, not reinterpret it to suit a political agenda.

"Ultimately," he said, "this is about the type of constitutional system we're going

Giuliani, meanwhile, said that the first half of 2016 saw a 78 percent increase in the number of police officers who had been shot – a statistic he laid squarely at the White House doorstep.

"Do you know where the disrespect starts - at the top!" Giuliani said. "You can't allow that disrespect without having a breakdown of the social order."

Moreover, the people who are hurt most by this breakdown, he continued, are the

"The people who claim to be for the poor, they're a bunch of phonies," Giuliani said. "They've been claiming to help the poor for 40, 50 years and what have they done? More welfare, more food stamps, more welfare and finally Obamacare.

"It comes out of this liberal, left-wing thinking, which is it's good to make people dependent. No, it's not," Giuliani said. "Do you know what's a good thing to do? Give people a good education and give them an opportunity for a good job. That's what Donald Trump will do."

Shortly after 3 p.m., Trump himself took the stage to a standing ovation and chants of "Trump! Trump!"

"In case you haven't heard, we're winning," said Trump, referencing a new national poll he said showed him with a two-point lead over Clinton. "What we have is a movement like they've never seen before "

Trump said that numerous polls showing him trailing Clinton reflected efforts by the mainstream media and the Clinton campaign to suppress voter turnout by oversampling Democrats, thereby creating a false perception that Clinton holds a commanding lead. He referenced the recent revelation that an organization led by former DNC Chairman and Clinton ally Terry McAuliffe gave nearly \$500,000 to the political campaign of Dr. Jill McCabe,

whose husband - FBI Deputy Director Andrew McCabe – oversaw the investigation into Clinton's private email server.

Trump noted that while Gen. James Cartwright faces prison for disclosing classified information to a reporter, Clinton faced no charges for sending top secret, classified information over a private insecure email

"How dare they take a highly respected four-star general and destroy him, but Hillary Clinton is allowed to lie over and over and over again?" Trump asked. "The fact that she's even allowed to run (for president) means our system is rigged. She has to be held accountable?

Trump then proceeded to detail his recently announced "Contract with the American Voter" - a list of specific actions and policy changes he pledged to take during his first 100 days in office. In addition to promising to end Obamacare and cut funding to sanctuary cities, he pledged to initiate a constitutional amendment to impose term limits on congress. Other proposals include renegotiating NAFTA, withdrawing from the TransPacific Partnership, and canceling climate change payments to the United Nations in order to reallocate the funding to fix America's water and environmental infrastructure. Several proposals addressed what Trump calls Washington's "rigged" system, with proposals aimed at curbing insider influence, such as implementing a lifetime ban on former White House staffers lobbying on behalf of foreign govern-

Such changes are necessary, Trump said, to "drain the swamp" of Washington politi-

"I'm not a politician and I never wanted to be a politician," he said. "But I could not stand by and watch what was happening to our great country.

'On Nov. 8, we can wipe away the lawless legacy and create such an unbelievable American future."

Bill Clinton campaigns for Hillary at Jacksonville early voting rally

Former President Bill Clinton headlined an early voting rally Oct. 21 in Jacksonville, calling on local residents to support his wife's platform that includes addressing everything from climate change to universal access to broadband cable service.

An estimated 1,000 people attended the rally at the Jacksonville Public Library. where Florida Democrats attempted to fire up the party base before the Oct. 24 start of early voting.

Congresswoman Debbie Wasserman Schultz urged attendees to rally their neighbors to support Clinton's candidacy against Republican nominee Donald Trump.

'We can't let that bigoted, misogynistic, intemperate, unqualified, narcissistic nasty man ...anywhere near the White House," she said. "Make sure we put Florida in the blue column for Hillary Clinton."

Bill Clinton, meanwhile, said that the "good old days" some Republicans long for weren't all that great.

"I'm a white southerner." Clinton said. "I was born at the end of World War II into a state with an income that was barely half the national average. I remember when America was sort of great – sort of like they're talking about. But it wasn't so hot. It wasn't so great to be African American or Mexican American. Gay people were off in the closet somewhere. I think America's better today and I think it's gonna be better tomorrow."

Hillary Clinton's agenda, her husband said, includes making coastal communities in Florida less vulnerable to climate change and making sure that "every family in every community has access to affordable broadband."

Her infrastructure plan, he added, is projected to create 10 million jobs.

'We're gonna have a record number of people vote," Clinton said, "and I want you to promise yourselves that you're not going to pass a living soul between now and election day to be part of a truly historic triumph for American freedom."

What brought you to Ponte Vedra Beach?

In late 2005, I was assigned to the United States by a large international company. After working in the headquarters in New York for a few years, I was sent to Jacksonville to start a new office. Are there significant differences between American rail systems and those around the world?

In America, we do have a clear segregation between freight and passenger transportation. I would say these are two completely different markets with their own tracks in most cases, their own standard organizations and their own trade shows. This is different than in most parts of the world, where government-owned railroad companies operate both freight and passenger service in a mixed-traffic environment. In other parts of the world, high-speed trains are very advanced and use a highly sophisticated technology.

Are there any promising new developments with regard to U.S. mass transit on the horizon?

I see a lot of development in the rail sector, especially in the mass transit segment. Existing systems will be extended, new systems will be built, and old equipment



will be refurbished and/or replaced with new technology. American rail transportation is going through a Renaissance, providing tremendous opportunities for companies like ours. In particular, light rail systems in and around cities, new street car applications and heavy rail systems (subway) are becoming very popular. In large cities, this is the only answer to the increasingly problematic street

How do you enjoy spending your free time?

I love to spend time with my wife Andrea and my kids, Fabienne and Noel. I'm a very active person and like kite surfing, powered paragliding, running, and road and mountain biking. Plantation celebrates opening of newly renovated golf course

Ribbon cutting marks completion of yearlong, multimillion dollar makeover

New greens, state of the art traps, two new chipping areas and an enhanced practice area are just a few of improvements golfers will find at the newly renovated Plantation golf course, which formally reopened for play last weekend.

Plantation residents celebrated the completion of the \$7 million makeover Oct. 22 with a breakfast and ribboncutting ceremony attended by PGA Tour golfer and Plantation member Billy Horschel.

"I think people are going to enjoy it," said Horschel, praising the redesigned course for its clean lines and the Plantation staff for their tradition of keeping the course in top condition. "There's no doubt it will be the best conditioned course in the entire state."

While at first hesitant to become too involved in the course's redesign, Horschel said course architect Greg Letsche welcomed his input.

"Greg wanted me to be involved to give my perspective as a PGA Tour golfer and from having seen thousands of courses," Horschel said, adding that he was particularly excited that Plantation members will have access to the enhanced practice area.

"Now we can work on all facets of the game," he said.

Plantation General Manager Rob Schlingmann and President Steve Booma praised Letsche for his work in revamping the course, which features a number of significantly redesigned holes. The ninth hole, for example, now plays left to right and positions the green along the water's edge, with bunkers supporting the left side of the fairway. The 12th hole, meanwhile, has been recreated with less slope on the green, which now has a dramatic new look achieved by removing the former bunker peninsula.

Letsche stressed, however, that the multimillion-dollar upgrades extend beyond the aesthetic.

"The drainage was key," he said. "(Before) there were times that because of the rainfall you had to keep the carts on the path."

So successful were the drainage improvements, Booma noted, that the new course withstood the onslaught of Hurricane Matthew.

"Rob (Schlingmann) hunkered down in the clubhouse during the entire storm and reported he couldn't see any standing water," Booma said. "Fifteen inches of rain and no standing water that's just amazing."

The golf course improvements build upon The Plantation's other recent upgrades, including the newly renovated Beach Club and the spring opening of Plantation Commons, which features a

Bites of passage Tailgate recipes for success

For me, the allure of the fall season coming near is teeming with anticipation. It's football season, and although my excitement recently has not come from the hope that my particular rooting interests will do better than seasons past, it is fun to contemplate the real question: "What will

we make for the tailgate?"

The American Southeast is the undisputed world champion of the art of the tailgate. It's a religion. There is no shortage of opinions on what is the best approach from strategy, aesthetic set up, and most importantly menu. I was not born into this magnificent culture, but I have for the better part of 24 years fortified myself into this culture of food and drink that surrounds the football season in the South. Being a food professional has given me the opportunity to pick the brains of the most seasoned tailgate master. The Zenlike approach that is taken can sometimes be overwhelming to the average weekend tailgater. I too, have done it all in my time: Low Country boils, competitiongrade barbecue, burgers and everything in between. This year, I am trying some different approaches to the season: more preparation ahead of time and more time enjoying the tailgate, with little fuss.

Here are some recipes that will let you enjoy more of the family, friends and camaraderie that go along with the next game you attend.



Sweet Tea Brined Chicken Wings

This is a recipe that you can make ahead of time and bring in an insulated dish covered in foil, or simply grill off at the tailgate. Serve with celery sticks and buttermilk dressing for

Brine

2 family-size tea bags 1/2 cup firmly packed light brown sugar 1/4 cup kosher salt 1 small sweet onion, thinly sliced

1 lemon, thinly sliced

1 orange thinly sliced 3 garlic cloves, crushed 2 rosemary sprigs (thyme can be substituted) 1 tablespoon black peppercorns

4 cups ice cubes

1 (3 1/2-to 4-lb.) cut-up whole chicken

Preparation

Bring 4 cups water to just before boiling add tea bags. Remove from heat cover and steep 10 minutes. Discard tea bags. Add all ingredients, except chicken, cool and add ice stirring to dissolve salt and sugar stir in ice. (Mixture should be cold before adding chicken.) Brine 12 hours or up to 24 hours. Remove chicken from brine, pat dry, grill and serve.



Apple Candy Bombs

8 apples peeled Your favorite chocolate and caramel candies Aluminum foil

Preparation

Core all apples with an apple core tool without going all the way through the apple. You want to leave a half inch on the bottom so that you can stuff candy inside without it falling out of

the bottom. Stuff with candy, (I like Snickers and Rolos for their melty goodness) and wrap with foil. Toss the apples on the bottom of the grill, next to the coals after you're done cooking the wings. Let them roast in the coals for 20 to 25 minutes, turning every 5 minutes or so. Let cool slightly and open to find a roasted apple with chocolate and caramel flowing through it. It is a neat thing to do for kids, big and small

Toto, we are not in Kansas anymore!

Investing is a dangerous business that requires us to prepare diligently for incredible uncertainty and volatility. Relatively steep stock market declines are generally disorderly and create a contagion of fear, and regrettably, too many investors even-

tually lose confidence in the stock market in general and their portfolio in particular. It is in our DNA to believe that when stocks go down 5 to 10 percent in value, there is something the "market knows" but us little folks do not. This mindset creates fear, which often generates hitting the panic button. Preventing my clients from bailing out of a well-designed investment plan is arguably my single most important job as a financial advisor.

I put forth that this chart illustrates the generalized behavior of market participants (contrary to the title) a few days before the Brexit vote and the days following. Wait, you already forgot about that Brexit thing! All the gnashing of teeth about Great Britain leaving the European Union was a huge waste of time. Contrary to what the pouting pundits of pessimism wanted us to believe, the world economy was not going to shut down because the U.K. left the European Union after 43 years. Unfortunately, far too many of us have a tendency to believe that we live in the most uncertain of times. Thus, it is not sur-



prising that we might believe our challenges are both unique and overwhelming, but when viewed through the sobering lens of history, we find they are neither.

After the big decline of that somber "Brexit" Friday, many investors caved on their long-term game plan by listening to the doomsayers and sold out with the idea that they would wait for calmer waters before entering the shark-infested sea again. When these market-timing folks go to cash, they have to be correct not once, but twice! First, they have to get it right on the sell side and then they have to be right again on the buy side. I cannot begin to tell you how many investors fall prey to the painful and embarrassing whiplash effect. Perhaps the selling part is easy, but knowing when to buy back is incredibly difficult, as nobody rings the bell to say the coast is clear. Therefore, investors notoriously procrastinate repeatedly before finally pulling the "buy back" lever.

For example, if the market makes an immediate and significant move to the upside, as with the days following the Brexit vote,

often the cash holders say, "I am not getting in now since the Dow just rallied 200 points. I should have got back in yesterday. I will wait for another pullback before I buy back." If the market goes higher from there, their stubbornness may not allow them ever to enter the market again. On the other hand, if a further decline happens, so does the procrastination, as they suggest that stocks may go even lower. I have witnessed this mentality repeatedly. Please understand that I am speaking from experience. I have been there, done that, got the t-shirt, and I have the scars to prove it!

We all know the story of Chicken Little, who ran around warning the barnyard of impending doom. I put forth that there is a Chicken Little in each of us. We get a little chicken when fear and doubt cloud our thoughts. We must accept that we are in the big leagues and scary times, and volatility is part of investing. While I have always been able to handle the market volatility and uncertainty as well as being a consummate optimist when it pertains to stocks going higher over time, I am not a wild-eyed optimist looking for unicorns and rainbows. Instead, I rely heavily on history to guide my decisions. I rely on faith, not fear! I may tweak my asset allocation from time to time or change investment strategies, but I always stay the course.

One can never accurately predict when the best days will occur, so we have to stay fully invested in experiencing the gains that we want and expect. Yes indeed, Toto, we are not in Kansas anymore. So relax and stop overthinking this investing thing. Everything should be just fine. At least that is what history has taught us.

Sharks' field goal at the buzzer is a winner

One didn't have to be a football guru to predict a high scoring affair in Ponte Vedra's game against Bartram Trail. A quick look at the season's scoring statistics said all that needed to be said. Coming into the game, the Sharks had scored 242 points and allowed 97. The Bears: 207 scored and 119 allowed. It wasn't difficult to predict a barnburner in the matchup and that is exactly what happened Friday evening at the Bears' field. The Sharks had the game's final possession and used it to claim a thrilling 48-45 victory on Chris Howard's 42-yard field goal as time expired.

It's hard to believe that a game featuring so much high-powered offense by both teams could have included any significant defensive plays but, in fact, the Sharks' defense played a key role in the win. The Sharks scored in their first two possessions – the first on a 30-yard pass from Nick Tronti to JD Pirris and the second an 11-yard run by Hal Swan. The Bears answered with a drive of their own then a

93-yard kickoff return by Joey Gatewood for a touchdown that tied matters at 14-14.

Bartram took the lead 20-14 on the final play of the first quarter but the Shark defense in the person of JB Shepherd blocked the point after attempt. It was just the first of the Bears' extra point problems.

The Sharks answered with a 79-yard, 14-play drive that ended with Tronti's 4-yard pass to defensive back Andrew O'Dare, who was uncovered in the end zone to pull ahead 21-20. Ponte Vedra scored again on a Tronti keeper to take a 28-20 lead at halftime.

While both teams maintained their high scoring pace in the second half, point-after problems continued to plague the Bears. After their fourth touchdown, a two-point conversion attempt failed on Shepherd's interception so Ponte Vedra led 28-26. When the Bears took the lead on their next possession, O'Dare stepped in front of that two-point pass attempt and the Sharks trailed 32-28, but only briefly.

The Sharks' 80-yard touchdown drive

featured both runs and passes to Swan, who ultimately scored on a 3-yard plunge. Ponte Vedra thus regained the lead 35-32 but that didn't last long either. In fact, Bartram, using 12 plays to cover 80 yards, climbed back on top 38-35. Discouraged by problems with the point-after they went back to kicking the extra point but that didn't work either – this time a bad snap led to another blocked kick.

Moments later, Swan busted a 46-yard touchdown run on Ponte Vedra's ensuing possession to put the Sharks on top 42-38. Shark coach Matt Toblin then pulled off an October surprise by calling for an on-sides kickoff. Kicker Chris Howard executed the play perfectly and the Sharks offense went back on the field only to settle for a 27-yard field goal and a 45-38 advantage.

Bartram failed to take advantage of a second, but unsuccessful, on-sides kickoff. They drove to a first down at the Shark 12 but could not punch in the tying touch-

Panthers fall prey to Yellow Jackets 34-14

Nease didn't have an answer for St. Augustine's halftime adjustments – surrendering 24 consecutive points in the third and fourth quarters – and lost its fourth straight game, 34-14, on Friday, Oct. 21.

"I felt our kids fought it out," said Tim Krause, Nease head coach, at the newly dedicated Joey Wiles-Walt Slater Field at Foots Brumley Stadium in St. Augustine. "They played really well in the first half, and St. Augustine did a great job in the second half. They did a really nice job with some adjustments, gave us some trouble and did a good job putting the game away."

Nease quarterback Leighton Alley proved effective early, throwing for 129 of his total 214 yards in the first half. After defensive lineman Adam Timmins blocked a St. Augustine punt, Alley threw a 25-yard touchdown to tight end Zach Sheffer midway through the second quarter. Then at the end of the second quarter, Panthers cornerback Trey Ragin intercepted Yellow Jackets quarterback Cole Northrup and stopped St. Augustine cold in its tracks. Nease seemed to have some momentum going into half-time, trailing St. Augustine 10-7.

"I was really proud of the mentality of our kids all week and how they practiced and how they came out and started the game," said Krause. "I think our kids were excited, and they like to compete. That was fun to see."

Yet come the start of the third quarter, St. Augustine shifted into a higher gear and didn't look back. After rushing for less than 30 yards in the first half, the Yellow Jackets committed to their ground game early, with quarterback Cole Northrup running four straight keepers for 60 yards. His last run was a 22-yard touchdown down the right side of the field, increasing St. Augustine's lead to 17-7 less than a minute into the quarter.

"The way we threw it in the first half really made Nease adjust, and it opened up the run game," said Northrup, who passed for more than 100 yards in the first half and finished with 263 passing yards, one passing touchdown, 75 rushing yards and two rushing touchdowns.

Filling in for suspended starter Jahq Russell, St. Augustine running back Brandon Johnson also capitalized on the halftime adjustments and had a big night on the ground. He finished with 170 yards, including a 20-yard touchdown run at the end of the third quarter that made the score 27-7

"I told the offensive line before the game, 'you block, and I'm going to do my thing,'" said Johnson. "And that's what happened."

Nease had trouble responding and moving the ball in the second half.

"We've had our struggles on the offensive line," said Krause. "That continued again tonight and showed up in a couple situations. In a game like that, if you don't finish one or two drives, it catches up with you, especially considering as well as they execute on offense."

The Yellow Jackets also executed in the kicking game with Elijah Ryan converting two field goals on the night, both from 27 yards. Panthers kicker Michael Leisle

missed both of his field goal attempts wide left from 43 and 32 yards respectively.

St. Augustine's last score of the game came early in the fourth quarter when Northrop threw a short pass in the flats to wide receiver Emerson Kabus, who streaked up the left side of the field for a 60-yard touchdown. The Yellow Jackets lad 34.7

Nease responded on the ensuing drive. Panthers wide receiver Ashton Wood returned the kickoff to the Yellow Jackets' 11-yard line, then caught a 10-yard touchdown pass from Alley just two plays later to make the score 34-14. Yet it was too little, too late as the Yellow Jackets used their remaining drives to run out the clock and seal the win.

St. Augustine (7-1, 3-0) will play for the District 4-6A title Friday, Oct. 28, at Middleburg, while Nease (1-5, 0-3) will play at Englewood Thursday, Oct. 27, at 7 p.m. in their penultimate game of the season.

"Hopefully we finish out strong here, keep improving and recognize that at some points there are peaks and valleys in years," said Krause. "Hopefully, we have some peaks ahead."

The undefeated Sharks host Parker on Friday Oct. 28 at 7 p.m. in their final conference game. View game photos online at www.pontevedrarecorder.com.



Raiders 33, Jaguars 16

Oakland Raiders make Del Rio's return to Jacksonville a happy one

Former Jacksonville head coach Jack Del Rio's return to Jacksonville was a happy one – at least for Del Rio – as the Oakland Raiders won for the first time in three tries at EverBank Field, 33-16 over the Jaguars.

"Obviously we are very disappointed," Jaguars Coach Gus Bradley said. "We were excited about this opportunity, but lost our poise....Offensively we are not playing as we should."

Sebastian Janikowski kicked four field goals, QB David Carr threw for a score and Latavius Murray ran for two touchdowns as the Raiders improved to 5-2.

Carr was 22 of 37 for 200 yards and a TD pass to Michael Crabtree, who caught eight passes for 96 yards. Murray put Oakland ahead 13-3 on a 2-yard run and added a 9-yard score late on the contest.

It was a homecoming of sorts for Del Rio, who was named Oakland's 55th head coach in 2015. He served in that role with the Jaguars for nine seasons from 2003-2011

"It was a great place to spend nine years raising the family and being blessed with the opportunity to lead the Jaguar franchise," Del Rio said. "I was very appreciative of that time. I met a lot of good folks here; a lot of good memories, a lot of good friends. It is good to come back here and get a good effort in this stadium."

The visitors led 20-6 at the end of the

Janikowski kicked field goals of 52, 44, 26 and 32 yards, while Jacksonville's Jason Myers connected from 23 and 37 yards

Jacksonville QB Blake Bortles was 23 of 43 for 246 yards, but threw his first of two interceptions in the end zone to erase an early scoring chance. He hooked up with tight end Julius Thomas for a 9-yard TD with 4:12 to play.

Marqise Lee caught seven passes for 107 yards to lead the Jaguars. The Jacksonville running game was split between Bortles and backs T.J. Yeldon and Chris Ivory but only generated a total of 105 yards.

"We're just not in those situations where we can keep pounding the run and have those opportunities come up. With that being said, we need to get more movement up front," Bradley said of the running game. "I think we need to see the hole and use our instincts a little bit better and hit the seams when they are created. There are things like that we need to school up as well."

Defensively, safety Johnathan Cyprien led the Jaguars in tackles totaling 11 solo tackles. It is the second time this season Cyprien has registered double-digit tackles. With eight tackles, seven solo, linebacker Paul Posluszny moved into third on the Jaguars all-time tackle list

with 840 tackles, passing Mike Peterson. Linebacker Telvin Smith recorded five tackles, four solo, including three tackles for a loss.

Despite the loss, the Jaguars are still on track for a playoff position. They play in the AFC South, one of the weakest divisions in the NFL, and have five games against division opponents, all winnable.

The Jaguars (2-4) had won two straight coming into Sunday's game and were coming off a come from behind 17-16 win over the Chicago Bears at Soldier Field.

"Well, I feel for our fans," Bradley said. "They show up and they cheer and they're supportive and we just didn't play very well in front of them today

"For us, we're trying to do everything we can to play as well as we can and we feel like when we do that, then we'll give them a good product," Bradley continued. "Today, we didn't play up to our capabilities."






